I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to:

- A) Receive and File Notice of Award from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, for the period October 1, 2011, through September 30, 2012, in an amount not to exceed \$17,332,712; and
- B) Ratify the signature of the Chair on the FY 2012 Head Start/Early Head Start Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) Application with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, for the period October 1, 2011, through September 30, 2012, in an amount not to exceed \$122,773, for a permanent Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) increase; and
- C) Approve Budget Amendment of \$84,604 in the Head Start Fund to reconcile the grant budget with the actual grant award.

Summary: This COLA increase will be used to pay for higher operating costs for the grantee and to increase staff salaries and fringe benefits for the delegates. This increase will be funded with \$122,773 in Federal funds and \$30,694 in County funds. Sufficient funding is included in the current budget to meet County obligations. The Budget Amendment is aligning the County budget with the Notice of Award. The emergency signature process was utilized because there was insufficient time to submit this application through the regular agenda process. (Head Start) <u>Countywide</u> (TKF)

Background and Justification: The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services informed Head Start and Early Head Start grantees of the opportunity to apply for additional funding for a permanent COLA increase to the base budget.
