#### I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

**Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve:** a Budget Transfer of \$667,415 from the Law Enforcement Trust Fund (LETF) to the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO).

Summary: Florida Statute 932.7055(5) provides that the seizing agency shall use Forfeiture proceeds for school resource officer, crime prevention, safe neighborhood, drug abuse education and prevention programs, or for other law enforcement purposes, which include defraying the cost of protracted or complex investigations, providing additional equipment or expertise, purchasing AED's, and providing matching grant funds. F.S. 932.7055(5) also requires that no less than 15% of the LETF's previous year's revenues be used for the support or operation of drug treatment, drug abuse education, drug prevention, crime prevention, safe neighborhood and school resource officer programs of various non-profit organizations. The PBSO's FY 2013 estimated donation requirement will not be finalized until year-end close-out. The PBSO's support of these programs exemplifies its strong commitment to the prevention and reduction of crime throughout the communities it serves and its desire to put money back into these communities to support organizations that provide such services. The year-to-date transfer for all donations to outside organizations after approval of this item is \$44,900. The funds are requested here are to aid PBSO and qualified organizations that meet the requirements set forth in F.S. 932.7055. Use of LETF requires approval by the Board, upon request of the Sheriff. The current State LETF balance is \$3,196,242. Approval of this request will reduce the State Law Enforcement Trust Fund balance to \$2,528,827. The PBSO certifies that the use of these funds is in accordance with F.S. 932.7055. Below is a table indicating the organizations the PBSO seeks to fund and the corresponding amount of funding proposed per respective organization or agency. **Background and Justification:** The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office is dedicated to providing the most efficient and effective law enforcement services and also has a long-standing commitment to the reduction of crime and implementation of crime and drug prevention programs within Palm Beach County. In accordance with F.S. 932.7055, the first-time purchase of the specialized equipment for the Crime Lab and a specialized vehicle for Traffic Homicide Investigations in the attached internal PBSO LETF applications is beyond what is normal, regular or established and serves a significant law enforcement purpose. This Statute also requires that no less than 15 % of the last fiscal year's revenues be donated or expended for the support or operation of drug treatment, drug abuse education, drug prevention, crime prevention, safe neighborhood or school resource officer programs. The PBSO certifies that the use of these funds by the organizations listed above and by PBSO is in accordance with F.S. 932.7055.

The Toxicology Unit currently performs testing using an older technology known as gas chromatography/mass spectrometry (GC-MS) that has slowly been replaced in toxicology laboratories by liquid chromatography-tandem mass spectrometry (LC-MS/MS). The Toxicology Unit needs to purchase one of these instruments that is now standard equipment in current Forensic Toxicology laboratories.

2. Provide a brief summary of program's activities/services to be funded:

The funding would be used to purchase a liquid chromatograph-tandem mass spectrometer to bring the technology available to the Toxicology Unit current with technology used in other Forensic Toxicology Laboratories

3. What results are you committed to achieving?

The goal of this project is to utilize the new instrumentation to improve the Toxicology Unit's ability to detect lower drug concentrations in DUI related cases, improve the analytical efficiency of the unit by reducing the number of analyses required to complete a case, and reduce long-term operating costs by reducing the need for high purity gases. An additional goal is to utilize the new instrumentation to improve our analytical services by testing for the new synthetic drugs on market such as the synthetic cannabinoids and "bath salts"

SUBJECT: Purchase of critical instrument

Over eight years ago a novel forensic toxicology methodology, liquid chromatography/tandem mass spectrometry (LC-MS/MS) was introduced at the Society of Forensic Toxicologists (SOFT) annual meeting. SOFT is the premier Forensic Toxicology forum whereby national and international scientists present state-of-the-art research, validation and new methodologies. The LC-MS/MS instrument has essentially transformed forensic toxicology laboratory testing protocol evolving from new and novel to one of the primary techniques used in forensic toxicology laboratories throughout the world.

The PBSO Forensic Toxicology Laboratory uses an older technology, gas chromatography/mass spectrometry (GC/MS) which although the workhorse of the laboratory does not provide the flexibility of testing certain drugs and essentially is not as efficient as the LC-MS/MS.

The advantages of using LC-MS/MS over GC-MS technology include the following:

- It is a powerful technique used for many and varied applications such synthetic cannabinoids, "bath salts", and other synthetic drugs.
- It has very high sensitivity and selectivity which is critical for toxicology testing.
- improved analytical efficiency by reducing the number of analyses performed to complete a case
- reduced long-term operating costs by reducing the costs for high purity gases required for GC/MS.

The primary reason PBSO has not transferred the old GC/MS technology to the advanced LC-MS/MS technology is cost. The instrument is \$325,000 and every effort to obtain grant funding has been rejected. The NIJ Coverdell grants will allow for the purchase of instruments but these are formula grants that usually do not exceed \$90,000. FDLE was able to purchase the instruments through the Department of Transportation but that is because their laboratory justified the purchase as a means of reducing a significant case backlog.

The LC-MS/MS is currently a standard instrument in a Forensic Toxicology Laboratory and is a critical need for the PBSO Forensic Toxicology Laboratory.

I am respectfully requesting funds to purchase a liquid chromatograph/tandem mass spectrometer at a cost of \$325,000.



SUBJECT: Justification for a new VHI investigation vehicle

The Vehicle Homicide Unit within the Traffic Division is responsible for the investigation of Traffic related deaths which occur in Palm Beach County. They are also responsible for the investigation of traffic related deaths which occur within the contracted cities of Belle Glade, Pahokee, South Bay, Wellington, Royal Palm Beach, Lake Park, Mangonia Park and Lake Worth. The Vehicle Homicide Investigations Unit is tasked with the investigation of serious body injury crashes involving departmental vehicles as well as providing individual assistance to various cities within the county. In 2010 Palm Beach County experienced 123 traffic fatalities (not all investigated by PBSO). As of mid-June 2012 the Vehicle Homicide Unit has investigated close to 60 traffic fatalities.

Palm Beach County covers 1,971 square miles with a population of 1.3 million people. It has 3,397 miles of county maintained roads. This does not include the countless miles of the unpaved county and local roads, state roads or local roads within the county. The Vehicle Homicide Unit investigates crashes on any and all of these roadways. These roadways stretch throughout Palm Beach County in Urban as well as Rural areas.

The initial on-scene investigation of a traffic related fatality can span from 3 to 4 hours to as long as 10 to 12 hours. These investigations can take the investigator from a cane field in Belle Glade, to the dirt roads in Loxahatchee or the Corbit, to the endless miles of paved roads throughout the county.

The Traffic Homicide Investigators respond to these incidents anytime day or night, anywhere in the county, under any type of adverse condition. The Traffic Homicide Investigators collect and mark evidence, photograph the scene, interview drivers and witnesses, inspect vehicles and complete a scale map of the scene as well as countless other tasks during their initial on-scene investigation. The Vehicle Homicide Unit is completely self-sufficient and does rely on any other support unit within the Sheriff's Office for assistance.

Currently the Vehicle Homicide Unit is using a retro-fitted 2000 Freightliner Ambulance with 86,667 miles on it. This vehicle was designed to function as an ambulance and does not meet the needs of the Traffic Homicide Investigators. The vehicle has several electrical and mechanical as well as age related problems which have been repaired on several occasions and the problems still persist.

- 1. There are no external power outlets to run equipment. The power converter is mounted on the outside of the vehicle and fails to due exposure to the elements.
- 2. Insufficient room and equipment within the interior to conduct proper interviews. Interior noise is at such a level it is impossible to conduct interviews inside the vehicle.

- 3. No exterior lighting for working scenes at night. Emergency lighting equipment works intermittently.
- 4. The exterior storage cabinets have lost their waterproof capabilities and this makes them of no value to store needed equipment. Door locks are continually breaking making it very difficult to secure well over \$250,000.00 worth of investigative equipment.
- 5. Door latches on interior cabinets are continually breaking allowing the cabinets to open and the contents to fall out.
- 6. The vehicle has been in for repair of the braking system several times, including the ABS system.
- 7. There are no radio or computer hook ups in the cab or rear of vehicle.
- 8. The center dash area which houses the controls for the emergency lights and siren is falling apart simply due to its age.

The Traffic Homicide Investigators require a completely self-contained mobile unit to accomplish these tasks with efficiency and professionalism. The vehicle should be outfitted with portable lighting, portable power (generators/power inverters) for the interior and exterior. The interior work area needs to sufficiently soundproof to allow the investigators to conduct interviews with witnesses, drivers and victims. The interior should be outfitted with desks, computer hook ups, printer and video equipment to conduct interviews in privacy. The vehicle needs to have ample secured storage for the necessary equipment such as mapping equipment, cones, flares, cameras, reports, evidence collection tools and the many other items the investigators carry with them. The vehicle should be equipped with a restroom for the investigators as well as the drivers and witnesses. Most of these investigations take several hours in areas where facilities are not readily available.
