I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to receive and file: the Fifth Amendment, amending the agreement with the City of Miramar, a municipal corporation of the State of Florida, as the fiscal agent for the Ft. Lauderdale Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) to extend the agreement period for various direct law enforcement oriented domestic security activities from August 31, 2012, through November 30, 2012.

Summary: On August 14, 2012, the Board of County Commissioners accepted this agreement to provide \$148,175 in reimbursable funding; the original period for this agreement was through August 31, 2012 (R-2012-1149). This agenda item will extend the agreement period from August 31, 2012, through November 30, 2012. This agreement provides a means of funding various domestic security activities within the County and region using federal Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) funds through the City of Miramar as the Ft. Lauderdale UASI's fiscal agent. These funds will be used for the purchase of personal radiation detectors and equipment for Region 7 hospitals. There is no match requirement associated with this award. No additional positions are needed and no additional County funds are required. Countywide (PGE)

Background and Justification: The Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) is intended is to create a sustainable national model program to enhance security and overall preparedness to prevent, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism. In general, the UASI provides financial assistance to States to address the unique equipment, training, planning, and exercise needs of large urban areas, and to assist them in building an enhanced and sustainable capacity to prevent, respond to, and recover from threats or acts of terrorism. It also includes awards to (1) selected State and local governmental entities and commercial companies to develop plans and approaches to ensuring the safety and protection of the Nation's ports, and (2) selected State and local governmental entities to develop plans and approaches to ensuring the safety and protection of the Nation's transit systems. FIFTH AMENDMENT TO MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT FOR PARTICIPATING FORT LAUDERDALE UASI AGENCIES

This Fifth Amendment to Memorandum (s) of Agreement for Participating Fort Lauderdale UASI Agencies (the "Fifth Amendment") is entered into this day of white 20/2, by and between the City of Miramar, a municipal corporation of the State of Florida (the "Sponsoring Agency") and Palm Beach Sheriff's Office, a political subdivision of the of the State of Florida (the "Participating Agency").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Sponsoring Agency and the Participating Agency entered into a Memorandum of Agreement for Participating Fort Lauderdale UASI Agencies dated February 18, 2009 (the "Primary MOA") related to expenditures of funds allocated in the amount of \$451,337.00 subgranted to the Participating Agency under the FY 2008 Urban Area Security Initiative ("UASI") Grant Program, the initial term of which was to end on May 31, 2011; and which term has been extended through August 31, 2012 by way of four previous amendments approved by the parties; and

WHEREAS, the Sponsoring Agency and the Participating Agency entered into another Memorandum of Agreement for Participating Fort Lauderdale UASI Agencies dated August 27, 2011 (the "Regional MOA") related to expenditures of funds allocated in the amount of \$336,900.00, subgranted to the Participating Agency under the FY 2008 Urban Area Security Initiative ("UASI") Grant Program for a regional project to fund: equipment and personnel for the South Florida Virtual Fusion Center, to be expended and reimbursed pursuant to the terms of the MOA, the initial term of which was to end on May, 31, 2011; and which term was extended through August 31, 2012 by way of four previous amendments approved by the parties; and

WHEREAS, the Sponsoring Agency and the Participating Agency entered into another Memorandum of Agreement for Participating Fort Lauderdale UASI Agencies dated <u>July 3, 2012</u> (the "Second Regional MOA") related to expenditures of funds allocated in the amount of <u>\$148,175.00</u>, subgranted to the Participating Agency under the FY 2008 Urban Area Security Initiative ("UASI") Grant Program for a regional project

to fund: <u>personal radiation detectors equipment for the safety and protection of Region 7 hospital's personnel</u>, to be expended and reimbursed pursuant to the terms of the MOA, the initial term of which was to end on <u>August 31, 2012</u>; and

WHEREAS, the MOA(s) is/are subject to all terms, provisions and conditions of the Federally Funded Subgrant Agreement between the Sponsoring Agency and the State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management for FY 2008 (the "State Agreement"), the current term of which will end or has ended on August 31, 2012; and

WHEREAS, the Sponsoring Agency has applied to the State of Florida for an extension of the term of the State Agreement in order to provide additional time for the completion of procurement and the expenditure of the grant funding available under the FY 2008 UASI Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, the State of Florida has agreed, subject to execution of a written contract modification, to reinstate and extend the State Agreement through <u>November 30, 2012</u>; and

WHEREAS, the parties mutually desire to reinstate and extend the term of all referenced MOAs between the parties related to FY 2008 UASI Grant funding through the same extension date as approved by the State of Florida for the State Agreement, to wit: November 30, 2012, in order to provide additional time for the completion of the procurement process and the expenditure of the grant funding available under the FY 2008 UASI Grant Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. In conjunction with the extension of the State Agreement through November 30, 2012, the term of the referenced MOA(s) between the parties is reinstated and extended to November 30, 2012.
- 2. All terms, provisions and conditions of the MOA(s) not inconsistent with this Fifth Amendment shall remain in full force and effect.
