I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to receive and file: the First and Second Modifications, amending the agreement with the city of Miramar, a municipal corporation of the State of Florida, as the fiscal agent for the Ft. Lauderdale Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) to extend the agreement period for various direct law enforcement oriented domestic security activities from April 30, 2012, through January 31, 2013.

Summary: On December 7, 2010, the Board of County Commissioners accepted this agreement to provided \$432,773 in reimbursable funding; the original period for this agreement was through April 30, 2012(R-2010-2041). This agenda item will extend the agreement period from April 30, 2012, through January 31, 2013. This agreement provides a means of funding various domestic security activities within the County and region using federal Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) funds through the City of Miramar as the Ft. Lauderdale UASI's fiscal agent. These funds and related equipment will be used for direct law enforcement activities. There is no match requirement associated with this award. No additional positions are needed and no additional County funds are required. Countywide (PGE)
