Regional Transport Improvements in the require annual cou	B) Adopt a Resolution approving Palm Tran to submit a grant application to the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority (SFRTA) for operating funding for Palm Tran fixed route service Improvements in the annual amount of \$319,974. This grant has a 50% local match and would require annual county funding of approximately \$160,000. The Job Access Reverse Commute (JARC) funds would be for a two-year period (October 1, 2013 to September 30, 2015).						
Summary: Palm Tran staff is s	eeking Board approval re	egarding	two issues as	we loo	ok to the future:		
A. Order an additional ten (10) buses for improving service starting in FY14. These buses would be put into service on routes with the greatest need based on ridership demand and on-time performance with final determination of the service plan being approved by the Palm Tran Service Board (PTSB). We ask for this now as it can take upwards of 12 months to get these buses from when a bus is ordered to delivery. Grant funds are in place to purchase these buses without any County match required. Staff expects that the required additional annual operating cost of this and doing some additional minor modifications to improve reliability would add approximately \$1.6 million annually to Palm Tran's operating budget. If approved, Palm Tran will include this additional amount in our proposed FY14 budget.							
B. JARC - The SFRTA requested projects for the JARC grant program to be awarded in 2013. These Federal Transit Administration (FTA) program funds are available for projects that provide improved transportation services to access employment, and employment related activities. The funds can be used to support up to 50% of the project costs for operating assistance. If awarded, the County match contribution for the project will be \$319,974 for two (2) years, or \$159,987 in FY2014 and \$159,987 in FY2015. The selected service is based PTSB rankings on trips serving large employment areas and education destinations that qualify for JARC. (See attachment 3) Countywide (DR)

#### **Background and Policy Issues: (Continued from Page 1)**

Palm Tran's fixed route ridership has grown significantly over the last four years by 18% and over the last ten years by over 5,000,000 riders a year, with average weekday ridership now at 42,000 passengers per day. Today many of Palm Tran's routes are operating at or close to capacity, especially during the peak periods, which has resulted in running time issues. Night and weekend service was reduced in 2008 as a budget cutting measure. Given the County's budget situation, staff for the last several years has been working to address service issues through various no or low cost service mitigation strategies or using grants that would fund additional service. While to date we have been generally successful in accommodating customer capacity issues by placing larger buses on routes, the additional ridership has resulted in many routes being unable to operate service on time. However the demand keeps increasing. Ridership increases show no sign of abating, and has increased by 8% this October as compared to 2011.

We are currently engaged in a scheduling study of five routes using Center for Urban Transit Research (CUTR). This study is examining scheduling alternatives on five Palm Tran routes, as a sample, to see how much we might be able to accomplish through improved scheduling. The Amalgamated Transit Union (ATU) was asked for their input for the routes to be studied and three of the five routes were routes specifically suggested by the ATU. While we expect that this might resolve issues on some routes, we believe that on a number of routes the only bona fide and long term solution to meet our demand and the reliability issues, (to operate on time), is to expand service levels which would improve running times.

The Palm Tran 2011-2021 Transit Development Plan (TDP), our long-range fixed route improvement plan was developed in 2010 with input from the ATU, public and County Staff and BCC members. Palm Tran staff working with the ATU and the PTSB have recently developed a fixed route improvement planning worksheet, which consolidates and quantifies the improvements that were identified in the 2011-2021 Transit Development Plan (TDP). This worksheet goes beyond what the TDP initially identified, and includes over 100 individual improvements to the fixed route system. Overall, the cumulative requirements of improvements listed on the worksheet will require the addition of 60 buses, 105 bus operators, and 30 mechanics over a ten-year period if funding is available. These improvements would also require the expansion of our existing facilities at our North and South County locations. Specifically, expansion is required to accommodate additional parking for buses and employees, and expanded maintenance facilities to work on the increased number of buses. The need for additional service and improved reliability started with public input during the TDP process and has now been fully vetted in discussions at the PTSB meetings, including both meetings held in November where the PTSB ranked all the proposed improvements. If the proposal to order the additional buses is approved, staff will work with the PTSB on specific schedule enhancements to routes primarily for weekday service based on the recent ranking of service improvements. If the ten (10) bus order is not approved the alternatives for Palm Tran to improve reliability are to either to provide additional running time by reducing service frequency or by cutting other services, both alternatives would have negative impacts to existing riders.

The JARC funding proposal while specific to improving service to employment centers would help restore some evening service and by offering earlier and later trips take some pressure off the demand on some current trips that are part of our running time issues.

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#### **RESOLUTION NO. R -**

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, APPROVING THE SUBMISSION OF A JOB ACCESS REVERSE COMMUTE (JARC) GRANT APPLICATION TO THE SOUTH FLORIDA REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY (SFRTA); ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Whereas, the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority (SFRTA), is authorized to make such grants as the designated recipient of Job Access Reverse Commute and New Freedom programs for Broward, Miami- Dade, and Palm Beach counties; and

Whereas, the SFRTA has the power to expend funds for use in connection with Job Access Reverse Commute or New Freedom projects, and

Whereas, the SFRTA has the power to make and execute all contracts and other instruments necessary or convenient to the exercise of its powers, and

Whereas, approval for said funds will impose certain financial obligations upon the recipient, and

WHEREAS, the Palm Beach County Board of Commissioners (Board) has the authority to apply for and accept grants, and to make purchases and/or expend funds pursuant to grant awards made by SFRTA, as authorized by state and federal law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

- 1. The Palm Tran Director or Assistant Director through the County Administrator is authorized to execute and file applications on behalf of the Board with the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority for a Job Access Reverse Commute grant for Palm Tran Fixed Route Service Improvements.
- 2. The Palm Tran Director or Assistant Director through the County Administrator is authorized to furnish such additional information, assurances, certifications and amendments as the SFRTA may require in connection with this Job Access Reverse Commute grant application.
- 3. The Chair of the Board certifies that the Palm Beach County Board of Commissioners will provide the required local match from ad valorem funds.
- 4. That the Chair of the Board is authorized and directed on behalf of the Board to execute and deliver grant agreements and all subsequent amendments thereto between the Palm Beach County Board of Commissioners and the SFRTA for Job Access Reverse Commute grant as approved by the Board, and the Clerk and Comptroller of the Palm Beach County Board of Commissioners is authorized and directed on behalf of the Board to attest said agreements and all subsequent amendments thereto.

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5. The Palm Tran Director or Assistant Director through the County Administrator is authorized and directed to take such action as is necessary or appropriate to implement, administer and enforce said agreements and all subsequent amendments thereto on behalf of the Palm Beach County Board of Commissioners.
