I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

MOTION AND TITLE: Staff recommends motion to: (A) Approve an Agreement to reinstate and amend the Original Interlocal Agreement with the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO), (R2012-0263); (B) Receive and File Grant Adjustment Notices revising the budget and extending the expiration date to March 31, 2013.

SUMMARY: Grant funds previously covered the cost of security at the Juvenile Assessment Center (JAC). The Department of Juvenile Justice assumed that responsibility beginning September 1, 2012. Remaining JAG grant funds from FY 2012 are being redirected to equipment and capital outlay to support the JAC once it moves to its permanent location on the Detention Center campus which is projected to be early 2013. <u>Countywide</u> (PGE)

BACKGROUND: In 1997 the Florida Legislature enacted legislation providing a local option to create JAC's across the state. After research determined that such a Center would immensely benefit the County, the CJC brought together local agencies to identify a site. With the assistance of the County's Facilities Management Division and the BCC, a building was chosen adjacent to the Palm Beach International Airport. This building was owned by the County and was vacant at the time. The JAC remains in that location 3400 Belvedere Road. The PBC JAC opened in November 1998 as a collaborative partnership between the Florida Department of Juvenile Justice, the CJC, Palm Beach County School District Youth Court, the State Attorney's Office, and PBSO among others. The PBC JAC is managed and governed by the participating agencies, consistent with respective statutory requirements of each agency.

The JAC is a local option program that provides a "one-stop-shop" for the delivery of juveniles taken into custody and the processing of all juvenile delinquency cases in the County. Its' benefits are numerous and inlcude: (1) law enforcement officers spend less time processing juveniles, freeing their time for patrol and other duties; (2) on-site assessments identify the reasons causing the problem behavior and occur immediately; (3) a determination is made immediately on how best to involve the criminal justice system in motivating against and/or punishing problem behavior; and (4) timely referrals for intervention and diversion programs are made for those juveniles - not referred for court action.

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA AND THE PALM BEACH COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE REINSTATING AND AMENDING THE TERMS OF INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT (R2012-0263)

This Interlocal Agreement dated _______ reinstates and amends the Interlocal Agreement dated February 7, 2012 (R2012-0263) (hereinafter "Original Agreement") by and between the Board of County Commissioners, Palm Beach County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida (herein referred to as the COUNTY), and the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office, West Palm Beach, Florida (herein referred to as the PBSO), each one constituting a public agency as defined in Part I of Chapter 163, Florida Statutes.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, The Criminal Justice Commission (CJC), continues its commitment to the Juvenile Assessment Center (JAC); and

WHEREAS, grant funds will provide for a portion of the required security at the JAC for FY 2012, with the remaining funding coming from the Juvenile Assessment Center Donation Fund reserves and the Department of Juvenile Justice. PBSO has agreed to serve as the fiscal agent to administer security services. PBSO currently contracts for security in the secure side of the JAC and previously funded the cost of security; and

WHEREAS, through no fault of either party there are unexpended dollars in the amount of \$47,677; and

WHEREAS, the parties mutually desire to reinstate the terms of the Original Agreement dated February 7, 2012 (R2012-0263), and amend same by extending the expiration date from September 30, 2012 to March 31, 2013, or until all remaining JAG funds are expended, whichever date first occurs.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual representations, terms, and covenants hereinafter set forth, the COUNTY and PBSO hereby agree as follows:

- 1. The terms of the Original Agreement (R2012-0263), are reinstated in their entirety.
- 2. The Original Agreement is amended to extend the expiration date until March 31, 2013, or until all funds remaining have been expended, whichever first occurs.
- 3. The unexpended JAG dollars in the amount of \$47,677 are to be used on COUNTY approved JAC services, equipment or program supplies.

All other provisions of said Original Agreement are hereby confirmed, and except as provided herein, are not otherwise altered or amended and shall remain in full force and effect.

Problem Identification

An average of 6,000 juvenile offender cases per year has been processed cooperatively through the JAC. Some of these are initiated by law enforcement bringing the juveniles to the site upon arrest; the remainder is given a notice to report with their parents for intake at the JAC. The State Attorney intakes all juvenile cases at the Juvenile Assessment Center and determines appropriate disposition, such as diversion out of the court system into programs including Teen Court (peer sanctions), direct file to adult court, or processing through regular Juvenile Court. The value of the JAC is its coalition of the State Attorney, DJJ, and diversion programs. It is a one-stop intake center. This increases the cooperation between city and county law enforcement and state agencies all required to handle juveniles, thereby significantly increasing the compliance by the juvenile and family. The JAC is open 24/7, 365 days a year to recieve and serve youth. Security is required at all times, 2 officers, 3 shifts per day.

CJC is a partner in the JAC and is requesting to allocate \$318,000.00 from the BYRNE/JAG towards security at the JAC for FY 2012. It is projected that the total annual cost of security will be \$455,556.00. The balance will come from other funding sources. Both CJC and PBSO and JAG grants have

paid for secuirty at the JAC in the past but neither have this item in their 2012 budgets it total. In the

past, CJC used federal grant funds to subsidize the cost of security, similar to 2011. PBSO is faced with a \$25 million dollar cut for 2011 and as a result is no longer funding projects that are not a core mission or a mandate, inlcuding JAC security.

An EEOP for PBSO was approved by the Office of Civil Rights, DOJ for two years on 9/27/10.

Project Summary (Scope of Work)

Juvenile assessment centers (JAC) are structured and governed according to Florida Statutes,985.135 as outlined below.

Each center shall be managed and governed by the participating agencies, consistent with respective statutory requirements of each agency, through an advisory committee

and interagency agreements established with participating entities. The advisory committee shall guide the center's operation and ensure that appropriate and relevant agencies are collaboratively participating in and providing services at the center. Each participating state agency shall have operational oversight of only those individual service components located and provided at the center for which the state agency has statutory authority and responsibility.

Each center shall provide collocated central intake and screening services for youth referred to the Dept. of Juvenile Justice (DJJ). The center shall provide sufficient services needed to facilitate the initial screening of and case processing for youth, including, at a Project Summary (Scope of Work)minimum, delinquency intake; positive identification of the youth; detention admission screening; needs assessment; substance abuse screening and assessments; physical and mental health

screening; and diagnostic testing as appropriate. The DJJ shall provide sufficient staff and resources at a center to provide detention screening and intake services.

On February 24, 1998, the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners (BCC)established a partnership with the Florida Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ), 15th Judicial

Circuit State Attorney, School District Police Department and the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office, and the Florida Department of Children and Families creating a Juvenile Assessment Center (JAC). Since opening in November 1998, the JAC has successfully diverted approximately 65% of youth from the traditional court system. An average of 6,000 juvenile offender cases per year has been processed cooperatively through the JAC which is open to receive and process juveniles 24/7. Security is an integral part of the JAC services and is required 24/7 to process the youth who are entering the JAC by the front door or by law enforcement escorts. Security is handled in 3 rotating shifts with 2 officers on at all times.

G4S, formerly Wackenhut, has provided secuirty at the Palm Beach County JAC for 8 years and is registered with GSA. Their GSA contract # is GS-07F-0382K

The JAC is being relocated mid-November 2012 to the Palm Beach Regional Detention Center campus. JAG funds are needed to help with equipment, capital equipment outlay, and moving of the SMART Board.

In 2011, security costs were shared between JAG Funding (FDLE) \$202,254 and the JAC Donation Account \$252,747. The fund was depleted in 2011. It is anticipated that the JAC Donation Account fund balance will be \$30,000 by the end of FY 2011 and these funds will be allocated toward FY 2012 JAC Security.
