Summary: Section 9-5 of Chapter 9, Article I of the Palm Beach County Code establishes a Consumer Affairs Hearing Board ("Hearing Board"). The nine (9) members of the Hearing Board are selected for countywide representation and serve two (2) year terms for a maximum of six (6) years. The Hearing Board serves in both an advisory capacity to the County Commissioners and as an Appeals Hearing Board to hear and act on consumer concerns about unfair/deceptive business practices and appeals relating to the towing, vehicle for hire, moving and price gouging ordinances. Members are selected from various businesses, professions and the general public. With the approval of this motion, the Hearing Board will have 5 of 9 appointed/active members, and one member (special technical) whose term has expired, but is permitted to remain until his successor is duly appointed and qualified. **Countywide (PGE)**

Background and Policy Issues: The Board of County Commissioners created the Consumer Affairs Hearing Board in 1972. The Board carries out the requirements of the six ordinances administered by the Consumer Affairs Division. The representation on the Consumer Affairs Board must include: 1) an attorney; 2) a business person (active or retired) recommended by a Chamber of Commerce; 3) a certified general contractor; 4) a resident (active or retired) with at least five years experience in the management of a business; 5) three at-large residents interested in consumer transactions. <u>NOTE</u>: With the appointments of these two seats, the Hearing Board will have five seats filled and the following four vacancies: one certified contractor, one representative from the Chamber of Commerce, one person with technical expertise, and one attorney. Nominations are being sought from the Board of County Commissioners for the four vacant positions. The Advisory Board has three seats currently filled and a diversity count as follows: Asian: 1 (33.3%) Black: 1 (33.3%) and White: 1 (33.3%). The gender ratio (male: female) is 3:0.

RE: Consumer Affairs Hearing Board (CAHB) Request for Nominations of Six (6) At Large Members

The purpose of this memo is to request nominations to fill six (6) <u>At-Large</u> CAHB seats. Vacancies and seat requirements are as follows:

- a) We currently have two (2) vacant Seats: #3 (Certified Contractor), and #5 (Management of Business with five (5) years of experience).
- b) Mr. Alexander Domb, Seat #1 (Attorney), and Mr. Pedro Guilarte, Seat #2 (Chamber of Commerce Representative), whose terms expired January 13, 2013, do not wish to be reappointed.
- c) Mr. Philip Shapkin, Seat #7 (Resident of Palm Beach County), and Mr. Herbert Milstein, Seat # 9 (Special Technical), whose terms also expired on January 13, 2013, have completed three 2-year terms, and are not eligible for reappointment.

The CAHB was created and established in 1972. Nine (9) members of the Hearing Board are selected for countywide representation and serve two (2) year terms for a maximum of six (6) years. The CAHB serves in both an advisory capacity to the BCC and as an Appeals Hearing Board to carry out the functions pertaining to alleged unfair or deceptive trade acts or practices as provided for in Ordinance 77-10, assist, advise and cooperate with the Board of County Commissioners and local, state, and federal agencies, protect the interest of Palm Beach County consumers, and to hear appeals from administrative action taken against companies believed to be in violation of one of the regulatory ordinances assigned to Consumer Affairs: Towing, Vehicle for Hire, Moving and Price Gouging.

Pursuant to the ordinance, all of the Board members must be citizens of the United States and qualified electors of Palm Beach County. Members of the Hearing Board cannot hold public employment and cannot be interested financially in the profits or emoluments of any contract, work or service for the county.

We are providing applications for two (2) interested and qualified individuals (attached). If you wish to endorse the nominations for the two qualified individuals, please sign and return the attached applications by Friday, April 5, 2013. Your recommendation(s) for appointment will be placed on the April 16, 2013 Board of County Commissioners meeting. If you would like to nominate others candidates for the expired or vacant positions, please forward names and contact information to me at your earliest convenience, and I will contact the candidates and work with them to complete the application form. 
