#### ١. **EXECUTIVE BRIEF**

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to receive and file: Amendment to extend the agreement period, for the Ft. Lauderdale Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) Collabria System and the TI Training Corp Lab, from April 30, 2013, through June 30, 2013.

Summary: The Board of County Commissioners accepted this grant for \$66,000, on October 16, 2012; the original period for this grant was effective through April 30, 2013 (R-2012-1586). This agenda item will extend the grant period from April 30, 2013, through June 30, 2013. This agreement provides a means of funding various domestic security activities within the County and region using federal Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) funds through the City of Miramar as the Ft. Lauderdale UASI's fiscal agent. These funds will be used to fund two regional projects, the Collabria System and the TI Training Corp Lab for the Regional Domestic Security Task Force. There is no match requirement associated with this award. No additional positions are needed and no additional County funds are required. Countywide (PGE)

Background and Justification: The Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) is intended is to create a sustainable national model program to enhance security and overall preparedness to prevent, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism. In general, the UASI provides financial assistance to States to address the unique equipment, training, planning, and exercise needs of large urban areas, and to assist them in building an enhanced and sustainable capacity to prevent, respond to, and recover from threats or acts of terrorism. It also includes awards to (1) selected State and local governmental entities and commercial companies to develop plans and approaches to ensuring the safety and protection of the Nation's ports, and (2) selected State and local governmental entities to develop plans and approaches to ensuring the safety and protection of the Nation's transit systems. # FIRST AMENDMENT TO MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT FOR PARTICIPATING FORT LAUDERDALE UASI AGENCIES

#### **RECITALS**

WHEREAS, the Sponsoring Agency and the Participating Agency entered into a Memorandum of Agreement for Participating Fort Lauderdale UASI Agencies dated September 13, 2011 (the "Primary MOA") related to expenditures of funds allocated in the amount of \$433,038 subgranted to the Participating Agency under the FY 2010 Urban Area Security Initiative ("UASI") Grant Program, the initial term of which was to end on April 30, 2013; and which term is intended to be extended through June 30, 2013 by way of this first amendment once approved by the parties; and

WHEREAS, the Sponsoring Agency and the Participating Agency entered into another Memorandum of Agreement for Participating Fort Lauderdale UASI Agencies dated September 13, 2011 (the "Regional MOA") related to expenditures of funds allocated in the amount of \$140,000.00, subgranted to the Participating Agency under the FY 2010 Urban Area Security Initiative ("UASI") Grant Program for a regional project to fund: the regional intelligence analyst, to be expended and reimbursed pursuant to the terms of the MOA, the initial term of which was to end on April 30, 2013; and which term is intended to be extended through June 30, 2013 by way of this first amendment once approved by the parties; and

WHEREAS, the Sponsoring Agency and the Participating Agency entered into a third Memorandum of Agreement for Participating Fort Lauderdale UASI Agencies dated September 17, 2012 (the "2<sup>nd</sup> Regional MOA") related to expenditures of funds

allocated in the amount of \$66,000.00, subgranted to the Participating Agency under the FY 2010 Urban Area Security Initiative ("UASI") Grant Program for a regional project to fund: Collabria System and the TI Training Corp Lab, to be expended and reimbursed pursuant to the terms of the MOA, the initial term of which was to end on April 30, 2013; and which term is intended to be extended through June 30, 2013 by way of this first amendment once approved by the parties; and

WHEREAS, the MOA(s) is/are subject to all terms, provisions and conditions of the Federally Funded Subgrant Agreement between the Sponsoring Agency and the State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management for FY 2010 (the "State Agreement"), the current term of which will end or has ended on April 30, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the Sponsoring Agency has applied to the State of Florida for an extension of the term of the State Agreement in order to provide additional time for the completion of procurement and the expenditure of the grant funding available under the FY 2010 UASI Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, the State of Florida has agreed, subject to execution of a written contract modification, to reinstate and extend the State Agreement through <u>June 30</u>, <u>2013</u>; and

WHEREAS, the parties mutually desire to reinstate and extend the term of all referenced MOA(s) through the same extension date as approved by the State of Florida for the State Agreement, to wit: <u>June 30, 2013</u>, in order to provide additional time for the completion of the procurement process and the expenditure of the grant funding available under the FY 2010 UASI Grant Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. In conjunction with the extension of the State Agreement through <u>June 30, 2013</u>, the term of referenced MOA(s) between the parties shall be reinstated and extended to <u>June 30, 2013</u>.
- 2. All terms, provisions and conditions of the MOA not inconsistent with this First Amendment shall remain in full force and effect.
