Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve: Appointment of one (1) new member to the Building Code Advisory Board for a term of three (3) years.

Summary: The Building Code Advisory Board was established by a Special Act of the Florida Legislature in 1974, and amended in 2001. The term of office for Board members is 3 years with no limit to the number of terms a member may serve. The Palm Beach Chapter of Florida Engineering Society has nominated A. Thomas Hogarth to fill a vacated seat. The Board is comprised of 16 members: composed of 7 Building Officials, 1 from each commission election district; 7 members appointed from nominees submitted by the Construction Industry Management Council of Palm Beach County; 1 registered architect appointed from nominees submitted by the Palm Beach Chapter of the American Institute of Architects; and 1 professional engineer appointed from nominees submitted by the Palm Beach Chapter of the Florida Engineering Society. <u>Countywide</u> (SF)

Background and Justification: The Building Code Advisory Board is authorized to advise local governments regarding adoption of administrative or technical amendments to the Florida Building Code based on local conditions. Advise local governments how construction code enforcement can be improved and standardized. Advise local governments on evaluation of new and innovative materials, products, systems, or methods of construction for compliance with the Florida Building Code, and any amendments or revisions thereto. Act as the countywide compliance review board pursuant to Section 553.73(4)(b)7, Florida Statutes, notwithstanding the requirements contained therein to establish such review board by interlocal agreement. The Board shall have the authority to evaluate new or existing products or systems in accordance with Section 553.842, Florida Statutes, and the Florida Building Commission's rules adopted thereunder. Recommendations and compliance reports of the Board concerning new and existing products or systems shall be advisory in nature for the municipalities within Palm Beach County, and shall not form the basis of a local or statewide approval pursuant to Section 553.842, Florida Statutes.

This advisory committee membership has 16 seats, 14 currently filled and 2 vacancies and a diversity count of White: 14 (100.00%) The gender ratio (male:female) is 14:0.

Repeal of laws in conflict. -- Any laws, 8 ordinances, or resolutions now in existence in the unincorporated areas of Palm Beach County or in any 9 10 municipality in Palm Beach County in conflict with this act 11 are hereby repealed. 12 Section 7. Enactment of lower standards .- No unit of 13 local government shall enact any law lowering the standards of 14 the model codes adopted pursuant to section 1. However, each 15 unit of local government may adopt ordinances providing 16 amendments to modify or improve the model codes, provided such 17 amendments are in compliance with s. 553.73, Florida Statutes. 18 Section 8. Code available .-- Each unit of local government shall have available for public inspection in its 19 20 principal office three copies of the model codes, together with any amendments or revisions thereto. Amendments must be 21 22. printed or otherwise suitably duplicated, and copies shall be 23 available for sale at reasonable cost to the public. 24 Section 5.9. Interpretations.--In the event of a 25 dispute in the interpretation of the provisions of the Florida Building Code model codes, or any amendments or revisions 26 thereto, a building official, plans examiner, inspector, 27 builder, contractor, owner, architect, or engineer may ask for 28 an opinion from the board's Code Interpretation Committee. The 29 Code Interpretation Committee shall be comprised of each of 30 31 the building official members of the board. The request for

interpretation must come by agreement of Both parties to the 1 2 dispute must agree to seeking the advisory interpretation from the board. Said procedure opinion may be conducted by 3 telephone or other electronic means. A simple majority of the 4 committee shall sustain an interpretation. Each building 5 official member of the committee shall maintain a written 6 7 record of the date and parties to the dispute. The interpretation shall not be binding upon the parties to the 8 dispute. 9

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Section <u>6.10. Appointments.--</u>

The Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach 11 (1)12 County shall appoint the Building Code Advisory Board of Palm Beach County and supply it with a meeting place, office 13 14 supplies including stationery, legal counsel, technical staff, 15 mechanical recording of its meetings, written transcripts of 16 the minutes of its meetings, secretarial service, and storage 17 space for its records. The board shall have 16 members, composed of 7 building officials, 1 from each commission 18 19 election district, appointed from nominees submitted by the Building Official's Association of Palm Beach County; 7 20 21 members appointed from nominees submitted by the Construction Industry Management Council of Palm Beach County; 1 member who 22 shall be a registered architect appointed from nominees 23 submitted by the Palm Beach Chapter of the American Institute 24 of Architects; and 1 member who shall be a professional 25 engineer appointed from nominees submitted by the Palm Beach 26 27 Chapter of the Florida Engineering Society. By January 1, 28 1991, the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County 29 shall appoint the four new members, two for 1-year terms and 30 two for 3-year terms. Thereafter, All appointments shall be 31 for a term of 3 years, and each member shall serve until his

1 or her successor is appointed. If a vacancy should occur before a term has expired, the Board of County Commissioners 2 shall appoint a new member within 60 days to complete the 3 4 unexpired term. (2) Members shall be required to attend all regular 5 and special meetings of the board. The chair chairman of the 6 7 board shall notify the Board of County Commissioners when a member accumulates three consecutive absences from the regular 8 meetings or when a member fails to attend 50 percent of all 9 10 meetings of the board during any 12-month period. On such notification, the member shall be removed by the Board of 11 County Commissioners, and the Board of County Commissioners 12 13 shall appoint a new member within 60 days to complete the 14 unexpired term. The board shall hold meetings open to the public at least once in every calendar quarter, adopt rules 15 and procedures procedure, and elect a chair chairman and vice 16 chair chairman. A quorum of the board shall be 10 members, 17 with a concurring vote of 9 members required to approve any 18 19 action. 20 Section 7. Authority. -- The purpose of the advisory 21 board is authorized to: 22 (1) Advise units of local governments regarding: 23 (a) Future editions of the model codes and subsequent 24 recommendation to the board of county commissioners concerning 25 countywide adoption. 26 (b) Recommendations on the adoption of administrative 27 or technical amendments to the Florida Building Code model 28 codes based on local conditions. (3) (d) Advise local governments how to prevent the 1 recurrence of disputes. 2 (4) (e) Advise local governments on evaluation of new 3 and innovative materials, products, systems, or methods of 4 5 construction for compliance with the Florida Building Code model codes adopted pursuant to section 1, and any amendments 6 or revisions thereto. 7 (5) Act as the countywide compliance review board, 8 pursuant to section 553.73(4)(b)7., Florida Statutes, 9 notwithstanding the requirements contained therein to 10 establish such review board by interlocal agreement. 11 Section 8.11. Product and system evaluation .--12 (1) The board shall have the authority to evaluate 13 ADMINISTRATION .--- Palm Beach County and each unit of local 14 government within Palm Beach County shall have the option to 15 direct inquiries concerning new or existing products or 16 systems to the board. (2) STANDARDS. -- The evaluation of new and innovative 26 materials, products, systems, or methods of construction shall 27 be based on the Florida Building Code model codes adopted 28 pursuant to section 1, and any amendments or revisions 29 thereto. The types of construction, materials, systems, or 30 31 methods of design referred to in the Florida Building Code

1 model codes, and any amendments or revisions thereto, shall be 2 considered standards of performance, quality, and strength. New or different types of construction, materials, or methods 3 of design shall be at least equal to these standards for the 4 corresponding use intended. For the purposes of determining 5 compliance, the product's quality, strength, effectiveness, 6 fire resistance, durability, safety, and control of 7 installation shall be guides for consideration. 8 The board is authorized to establish policies and 9 (3) procedures necessary to conduct evaluation efforts, such as, 10 11 but not limited to, applications, fees, renewals, and revocations.APPLICATION PROCEDURE.--12 13 (a) Applications for evaluation and compliance determination shall be made in accordance with the policy and 14 15 procedures established by the board. If the application is for a type of structure or system, the application shall be 16 17 accompanied by plans prepared by a design professional, together with supporting engineering calculations supporting 18 19 the design. Applications for components, materials, or devices shall be accompanied by drawings, tests, and 20 calculations, prepared by an engineer registered in the State 21 22 of Florida, or other proof supporting the design. 23 (b) The board may employ the use of consultants to examine applications. A The consultant shall be a design 24 25 professional with specific qualifications in the particular 26 that area of product or system analysis for which he or she is 27 employed. 28 (c) The board may establish policies and procedures for the processing and review of requests for evaluation and 29 30 compliance, including programs designed to monitor 31 manufacturing, fabrication, or performance. The board or its

designee may require calculations, tests, or opinions from 1 design professionals, nationally recognized testing 2 3 laboratories, or approved quality and assurance programs. (d) The data shall be analyzed and evaluated for 4 meeting the applicable performance standards. After receiving 5 an evaluation report, the board shall issue a written 6 7 recommendation on the appropriateness of the product or system 8 for use in Palm Beach County. All decisions or reports shall be forwarded to: 9 1. The product control file. 10 2. The applicant. 11 12 3. The local building departments. 13 The written recommendations of the board shall be advisory 14only. It is the responsibility of each applicant, contractor, 15 16 or owner to submit individual permit applications for 17 construction or installation to the appropriate unit of local government for specific approval or rejection. 18 19 (4) FEES.--A \$500 minimum initial application fee shall be paid by the applicant at the time of filing. In 20 addition, the applicant shall be responsible for any cost the 21 22 board may incur. Resubmissions after unfavorable recommendations shall not require an additional initial filing 23 fee unless final action had been taken by the board. However, 24 the applicant shall be required to pay any additional cost 25 26 incurred by the board prior to final action. (5) DISPOSITION OF FEES AND EXPENSES. -- All moneys 27 collected by the board shall be received, deposited, expended, 28 29 and accounted for pursuant to law. Nonconformance with the model codes adopted 12 pursuant to section 1, and any amendments or revisions thereto, or any subsequent updates to such standards which 13 14 occur after the date of acceptance. 15 2. Deviation from the design on which the 16 recommendation of acceptance was based, due to change, 17 omission, or substitution. 18 3. 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3	Submittals for revisions shall bear the revised date and shall

. 8	(8) RENEWAL One year from the date of acceptance and
9	every year thereafter, or upon the adoption of new codes,
