I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF			
Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve on preliminary reading and advertise for public hearing on November 19, 2013, at 9:30 a.m.: an Ordinance of the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County, Florida, amending Palm Beach County Code, Sections 2-260.14 and 2-260.15, codifying Palm Beach County Ordinance No. 2010-006, as amended, pertaining to the County Internal Audit Committee; providing for an alternate member of the County Internal Audit Committee; incorporating uniform policies and procedures for County advisory boards and providing for an effective date.			
Summary: Ordinance No. 2010-006, as amended, created the County Internal Audit Committee. The Board adopted Resolution No. 2013-0193, imposing specific requirements on County advisory boards, such as the County Internal Audit Committee. This Ordinance amends County Code Sections 2-260.14 and 2-260.15 to provide that the uniform policies and procedures in Resolution No. 2013-0193 will apply to the County Internal Audit Committee. Per Board direction, an alternate member has been added to the County Internal Audit Committee. (Countywide) (PFK)			
<b>Background and Policy Issues</b> : The revising Ordinance implements the requirements of Resolution No. 2013-0193 and its uniform policies and procedures for the County Internal Audit Committee, and adds an alternate member to the Committee.

5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16	AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING PALM BEACH COUNTY CODE, SECTIONS 2-260.14 AND 2-260.15, CODIFYING PALM BEACH COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 2010-006, AS AMENDED, PERTAINING TO THE PALM BEACH COUNTY INTERNAL AUDIT COMMITTEE; PROVIDING FOR AN ALTERNATE MEMBER OF THE COUNTY INTERNAL AUDIT COMMITTEE; INCORPORATING UNIFORM POLICIES AND PROCEDURES FOR COUNTY ADVISORY BOARDS AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

18	WHEREAS, it is vital that government exercise its power and perform its duties in
19	compliance with law, policy, and established procedures, apply sound management practices,
20	and be held accountable for the use of public funds; and
21	WHEREAS, internal auditing is an independent, objective assurance and consulting
22	activity designed to add value and improve the government's operations by bringing a
23	systematic, disciplined approach to evaluating and improving the effectiveness of risk
24	management, control, and government processes; and
25	WHEREAS, the Office of Internal Auditor has been established by the Charter of Palm
26	Beach County, Florida; and
27	WHEREAS, an Internal Audit Committee has been established by Palm Beach County
28	Ordinance No. 2010-006, as amended, to carry out certain duties and responsibilities on behalf
29	of the Board; and
30	WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has adopted Resolution 2013-0193,
31	imposing specific requirements on members of County advisory boards; and
32	WHEREAS, as a County advisory board, the Internal Audit Committee is subject to the
33	provisions of Resolution No. 2013-0193; and
34	WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has determined that the County
35	Internal Audit Committee should have an alternate member, to participate when another
36	member is absent; and
37	WHEREAS, Palm Beach County Code Sections 2-260.14 and 2-260.15, codifying
38	Ordinance No. 2010-006, as amended, must be amended to comply with the requirements of
39	Resolution No. 2013-0193 and Board direction.

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#### COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

## Section 1. AMENDMENT TO PALM BEACH COUNTY CODE SECTION 260.14 – INTERNAL AUDIT COMMITTEE COMPOSITION:

- 6 (a) The internal audit committee shall be composed of five (5) members, and one (1)
  7 alternate member, appointed by the BCC and shall not include any county
  8 commissioners as members. The alternate member may only participate and vote
  9 when another member is absent from a committee meeting.
  - (b) All five (5) members shall be citizens of Palm Beach County, independent of elected and appointed county officials and employees, and not employed in any capacity by the BCC or by an entity subject to audit by the county internal auditor.
  - (c) Membership of the internal audit committee will be to the greatest extent possible representative of the community-at-large and reflect the racial, gender and ethnic make-up of the community.
  - (d) The member's term shall be three (3) years and staggered so that the internal audit committee annually includes a new member and members with one (1) and two (2) years of service. The members' terms shall begin on October 1<sup>st</sup> and end on September 30<sup>th</sup>.
  - (e) Each member shall serve no more than two (2) three (3) consecutive full three (3) year terms. Any vacancy occurring during a term shall be filled for the unexpired portion of the term and shall not count towards the member's term limits. Members must reside in the County at the time of appointment and while serving on the committee.
  - (f) At least ninety (90) days prior to the end of a member's term of service on the internal audit committee, the internal audit committee shall either (a) recommend that the BCC reappoint that member (if that member is eligible for reappointment) or (b) recommend that the BCC appoint a new member.
  - (g) Committee members shall have experience in business or finance; government accounting, auditing, operations or financial management; or other relevant experience.
  - (h) The chair of the internal audit committee will be elected by the members of the internal audit committee to serve a single two-year term.
  - (i) The committee shall be subject to the uniform policies and procedures established by the BCC as currently set forth in Resolution No. 2013-0193, as may be further amended by action of the Board of County Commissioners.
  - (j) A quorum must be present for all committee meetings. A majority of the members appointed shall constitute a quorum. The alternate member may be counted for purpose of a quorum only if another member is absent. All committee meetings shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order.
  - (k) Committee members shall be governed by the applicable provisions of the state

    Ethics Code and the applicable provisions of the Palm Beach County Code of

    Ethics.

### Section 2. AMENDMENT TO PALM BEACH COUNTY CODE SECTION 260.15 – INTERNAL AUDIT COMMITTEE COMPOSITION:

- (a) The internal audit committee will meet at least quarterly, with authority to convene additional meetings, as circumstances require.
- (b) All internal audit committee members must attend at least seventy five (75) percent one-half (1/2) of the scheduled meetings in any membership year (a membership year runs from August 16 October 1<sup>st</sup> of one (1) year to August 15 September 30<sup>th</sup> of the following year) to remain a member. This meeting attendance policy applies to the alternate member as well as to the regular members.
- (c) Absences due to extenuating circumstances may be excused by the internal audit committee at its discretion.
- (d) The internal audit committee may invite members of management, internal auditors, external auditors or others to attend meetings and provide pertinent information, as necessary.

Meeting agendas will be approved by the internal audit committee at the start of each meeting.</li> <li>(f) Minutes will be prepared by the clerk and comptroller's board services/minutes department.</li> <li>(g) Three (3) out of five (5) members must be present to have a quorum.</li> </ul> Section 3. REPEAL OF LAWS IN CONFLICT:
9	All local laws and ordinances in conflict with any provisions of this Ordinance are
10	hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
11	
12	Section 4. SEVERABILITY:
13	If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Ordinance is for any
14	reason held by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional, inoperative, or void,
15	such holding shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance.
16	
17	Section 5. INCLUSION IN THE CODE OF LAWS AND ORDINANCES:
18	The provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Palm Beach
19	County Code. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish
20	such, and the word ordinance may be changed to section, article, or other appropriate word.
21	
22	Section 6. CAPTIONS:
23	The captions, section headings, and section designations used in this Ordinance are for
24	convenience only and shall have no effect on the interpretation of the provisions of this
25	Ordinance.
26	
27	Section 7. EFFECTIVE DATE:
28	The provisions of this Ordinance shall become effective upon filing with the
29	Department of State.
