I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve: a Budget Transfer of \$89,450 from the Law Enforcement Trust Fund (LETF) to the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO).

Summary: Florida Statute 932.7055(5) provides that the seizing agency shall use Forfeiture proceeds for school resource officer, crime prevention, safe neighborhood, drug abuse education and prevention programs, or for other law enforcement purposes, which include defraying the cost of protracted or complex investigations, providing additional equipment or expertise, purchasing automated external defibrillators, and providing matching grant funds. F.S. 932.7055(5) also requires that no less than 15% of the LETF's previous year's revenues be used for the support or operation of drug treatment, drug abuse education, drug prevention, crime prevention, safe neighborhood and school resource officer programs of various non-profit organizations. The PBSO's FY 2014 estimated donation requirement will not be finalized until year-end close-out. The PBSO's support of these programs exemplifies its strong commitment to the prevention and reduction of crime throughout the communities it serves and its desire to put money back into these communities to support organizations that provide such services. The year-to-date transfer for all donations to outside organizations after approval of this item is \$665,043. The funds are requested here are to aid PBSO and qualified organizations that meet the requirements set forth in F.S. 932.7055. Use of LETF requires approval by the Board, upon request of the Sheriff. The current State LETF balance is \$461,441. Approval of this request will reduce the State Law Enforcement Trust Fund balance to \$371,991. The PBSO certifies that the use of these funds is in accordance with F.S. 932.7055. Below is a table indicating the organizations the PBSO seeks to fund and the corresponding amount of funding proposed per respective organization or agency. No new positions are needed and no additional County funds are required. Countywide (PGE)

Background and Justification: The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office is dedicated to providing the most efficient and effective law enforcement services and also has a long-standing commitment to the reduction of crime and implementation of crime and drug prevention programs within Palm Beach County. Use of LETF requires approval by the Board in accordance with F.S. 932.7055, upon request of the Sheriff. This Statute also requires that no less than 15 % of the last fiscal year's revenues be donated or expended for the support or operation of drug treatment, drug abuse education, drug prevention, crime prevention, safe neighborhood or school resource officer programs. The PBSO certifies that the use of these funds by the organizations listed above is in accordance with F.S. 932.7055.

Horses Healing Hearts is a program for children of parents suffering from substance abuse. Using the horse as an learning vehicle, the participants learn responsibility, confidence and coping mechanisms so the can choose a healthier lifestyle for themselves.

Provide a brief summary of program's activities/services to be funded:

Currently, HHH serves approximately 35 children in Palm Beach County. These participants meet weekly or bi-weekly in one of 3 sponsor barns (Wellington, Delray Beach, Boca Raton). Volunteers and Mentors teach them about horse care and a Child Educator, Rhonda Fritzshall, leads them through their curriculum for the day to learn self-care and coping mechanisms. The 2-hour sessions begin and end with circle time allowing the children to share their feelings, followed by 15 minutes of private ride time (when not riding doing art therapy) and ending in circle time with reading an Al-ateen meditation and "check in" on how their ride went with the Child Educator leading group.

What results are you committed to achieving?

We are committed to ensuring every child understands their parent loves them despite their disease of addiction. We teach the 7 "C"s so they can use these tools in their daily lives at home and at school. (I didn't cause it, can't control it, can't change it, can't cure it. I can care for myself by communicating my feelings and making healthy choices for myself.) Once they memorize these, they use them in many areas of their life and learn to "let go" of feeling responsibility for their parents! disease. 1/4 of our kids have lost a parent to suicide, overdose or jail. They need mentors they can emulate. Our program provides this and horses calm their anxiety/mood and keep them returning. We are the only program in the country at this time providing this service for COA's.

Salaries (list employees and individual compensation):

The Pediatric Oncology Patient Care Navigator and the Child Life Specialist will coordinate and over see the educational sessions with Guard-A-Kid and will continue to reinforce and incorporate that curriculum in the on going education they provide patients and families throughout the year. They will spend about 5% of their time providing these services which translates out in salary to \$4,800 a year for the Pediatric Oncology Patient Care Navigator & \$2,400 a year for the Child Life Specialist.

Professional Fees (list vendor and type of service provided):

Guard-A-Kid will charge \$300 a session to provide age appropriate curriculum to our young patients and their families and they will do 3 sessions a month which comes to \$10,800 annually. (See attached Curriculum).
