#### I. **EXECUTIVE BRIEF**

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve: a Budget Transfer of \$247,384 from the Law Enforcement Trust Fund (LETF) to the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO).

Summary: Florida Statute 932.7055(5) provides that the seizing agency shall use Forfeiture proceeds for school resource officer, crime prevention, safe neighborhood, drug abuse education and prevention programs, or for other law enforcement purposes, which include defraying the cost of protracted or complex investigations, providing additional equipment or expertise, purchasing automated external defibrillators, and providing matching grant funds. F.S. 932.7055(5) also requires that no less than 15% of the LETF's previous year's revenues be used for the support or operation of drug treatment, drug abuse education, drug prevention, crime prevention, safe neighborhood and school resource officer programs of various non-profit organizations. The PBSO's FY 2014 estimated donation requirement is \$65,729. The PBSO's support of these programs exemplifies its strong commitment to the prevention and reduction of crime throughout the communities it serves and its desire to put money back into these communities to support organizations that provide such services. The year-to-date transfer for all donations to outside organizations after approval of this item is \$912,427. The funds are requested here are to aid PBSO and qualified organizations that meet the requirements set forth in F.S. 932.7055. Use of LETF requires approval by the Board, upon request of the Sheriff. The current State LETF balance is \$1,208,339. Approval of this request will reduce the State Law Enforcement Trust Fund balance to 960,955. The PBSO certifies that the use of these funds is in accordance with F.S. 932.7055. Below is a table indicating the organizations the PBSO seeks to fund and the corresponding amount of funding proposed per respective organization or agency. No new positions are needed and no additional County funds are required. <u>Countywide</u> (PGE)

Background and Justification: The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office is dedicated to providing the most efficient and effective law enforcement services and also has a long-standing commitment to the reduction of crime and implementation of crime and drug prevention programs within Palm Beach County. Use of LETF requires approval by the Board in accordance with F.S. 932.7055, upon request of the Sheriff. This Statute also requires that no less than 15 % of the last fiscal year's revenues be donated or expended for the support or operation of drug treatment, drug abuse education, drug prevention, crime prevention, safe neighborhood or school resource officer programs. The PBSO certifies that the use of these funds by the organizations listed above is in accordance with F.S. 932.7055.

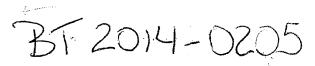

#### Organization Purpose:

The mission of the National Campaign to Stop Violence is to reduce violence and its impact on the lives of young people by asking them to analyze the problem and propose a solution in writing. Locally the initiative is administered as the "Do the Write Thing Challenge".

#### Provide a brief summary of program's activities/services to be funded:

"Do the Write Thing Challenge" gives middle school students an opportunity to examine the causes of violence through classroom discussions and in written form by answering 3 questions. The program is a writing "challenge" directed to every middle school student in Palm Beach County. All of the writings are judged. The "Top" writers from every fully participating school are invited to a recognition luncheon. Those writings are also published. In the 2013 campaign 30 of 36 Middle Schools fully participated with 24,111 submissions. It is expected that all 36 traditional Middle Schools and 6 of the 14 alternative schools will fully participate in the 2014 program which will significantly increase the size of the publication and the recognition luncheon.

#### What results are you committed to achieving?

The program and specifically the publication financed by the LETF gives students an opportunity to express their feelings and thoughts in writing about violence. It gives the students a "voice" and lets them know that teachers, parents and law enforcement are listening to them and want to hear from them. The program identifies kids who need to be connected in their community with services like mentor and after school programs which can help them avoid violence. The "top" writings which get published in the book are read by multiple panels of volunteer judges who are involved in the juvenile justice system and educational system. The end result is the selection of a boy and girl Ambassador who represent Palm Beach County in the National Recognition Ceremony in Washington, D.C.

#### Organization Purpose:

The mission of Junior Achievement (JA) of the Palm Beaches & Treasure Coast is to inspire and prepare young people to succeed in a global economy. JA is dedicated to giving young people the knowledge and skills they need to plan for their future, and make sound academic and economic choices.

#### Provide a brief summary of program's activities/services to be funded:

A \$10,000 grant from the Law Enforcement Trust Fund will underwrite 40% of one week of the four week summer JA BizCamp program. This will be added to \$15,000 in funding from another donor to cover the \$25,000 cost for the entire week. The funding includes planning and scheduling for camp that takes place throughout the year. Approximately 80-100 at risk students will participate in the week of JA BizCamp, they will be taught the skills needed to succeed in the business world. Students will learn about citizenship, basics of personal money management, how to go on a job interview, business planning, the role of a business professional and entrepreneurship. Additionally, we will offer an anti-substance abuse curriculum with materials and input from the Caron Foundation.

#### What results are you committed to achieving?

Based on past performance, over 50% of camp participants will show an increased understanding of basic financial literacy skills, work readiness skills and entrepreneurship. Additionally they will gain an understanding of the necessity of remaining in school to secure a better future. Because of the experiential component of the the JA BizCamp program, participants retain what they are taught over an extended period of time. We also believe that all the participants will have a greater awareness of how substance abuse can negatively impact their future success.
