I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to adopt: an Ordinance of the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County, Florida, amending Chapter 17, Article I (Ordinance No. 1980-12); Relating to Licenses, Taxation and Miscellaneous Business Regulations, to be known as the "Palm Beach County Motor Vehicle Fuel Price Posting Ordinance"; providing for Fuel Price Signs; providing for Repeal of Laws in Conflict; providing for a Savings Clause; providing for Severability; providing for Inclusion in the Code of Laws and Ordinances; providing for Captions; and providing for an Effective Date.

Summary: On February 4, 2014, the Board of County Commissioners (the "Board") held a preliminary reading of this Ordinance and authorized advertising for public hearing on March 11, 2014. On March 11, 2014, the Board continued the public hearing until April 15, 2014. On April 15, 2014, the Board continued the public hearing until April 22, 2014. The current Motor Vehicle Fuel Price Posting Ordinance requires gasoline stations to prominently and continuously display specific signage indicating the type of motor vehicle fuel available for sale, the minimum price per gallon in numerals at least six (6) inches tall, and the type of service offered for the displayed price, but it does not require the seller to display the maximum price per gallon a consumer will be charged for each type of fuel for sale or require the seller to indicate on the sign whether the displayed price is a "discounted" price for cash sales. Amending the current Ordinance to require gasoline retailers to post the highest price a customer would be required to pay and to prominently indicate on the same sign whether the advertised price is discounted for cash sales, will prevent consumers from being misled at the pump. Staff has met with the industry and the industry has requested a one year time period in order to come into compliance. Accordingly, the Ordinance has been amended so that the sellers would be allowed up to one (1) year to retrofit signs to meet the requirements. During the interim, if cash discounts are offered, the sellers shall place a sign at the pump. The League of Cities has no opposition to the proposed Ordinance amendments. Countywide (PGE)

Background and Policy Issues: The proposed amendments address consumer concerns that some gasoline stations in the County advertise the minimum price per gallon of gasoline without indicating that the displayed price is being offered for "cash only" sales; consumers are therefore not informed of the higher price they will be charged for using a credit card until the gasoline is pumped. In addition to posting the maximum price per gallon and indicating "cash only" designations, the proposed amendments also include requirements for nighttime illumination, freedom from vegetation obstruction and a civil penalty of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) for the first violation and five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each repeat violation.

19	WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County finds and
20	declares that the public welfare and safety of the existing and future residents requires the
21	regulation and control of retail sales of motor vehicle fuel to the general public; and
22	WHEREAS, Palm Beach County regulates the display of signs on the premises of motor
23	vehicle fuel service stations that operate in the unincorporated and incorporated areas of the
24	County; and
25	WHEREAS, it is now necessary to amend Article I of Chapter 17 Sec. 2, of the Palm
26	Beach County Code to address consumers' concerns and prevent consumers from being misled,
27	to require retailers of motor vehicle fuel to post the highest price a customer would be required to
28	pay; and
29	WHEREAS, it is also necessary to amend Article I of Chapter 17 Sec. 2, of the Palm
30	Beach County Code to further protect consumers and ensure they are not misled, to require
31	retailers of motor vehicle fuel selling fuel at a discounted price to customers paying cash, to
32	prominently post on the signage displaying the price that it is a "cash only" sales price.
33 34 35	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY
36 37	COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:
38 39	Section 1. Fuel Price Signs.
40	Chapter 17, Article I Section 17 - 2 of the Palm Beach County Code is amended to read as

- 1 Every person that engages in the retail sales of motor vehicle fuel to the general public shall
- 2 prominently and continuously display signs on the premises according to Standard I or Standard

3 II and Standard III:

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- (1) Standard I:
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 6 a. At least one (1) sign shall be displayed which is a minimum of ten (10) square
 7 feet and a maximum of fifteen (15) square feet on its usable face.
- 8 b. The sign shall be prominently placed and readable by motorists traveling on the abutting streets.
- 10 c. The sign shall clearly indicate the types of motor vehicle fuel available for sale (i.e., leaded, unleaded, diesel, gasohol, etc.) in full or abbreviated form.
 - d. The sign shall indicate the maximum retail price per gallon, or other unit, to the nearest tenth of a cent inclusive of all taxes, in numerals at least six (6) inches tall, for each kind of motor vehicle fuel available for sale. If prices are indicated in units other than "price/U.S. gallon," the unit must be indicated in lettering not less than three (3) inches tall.
 - e. If the prices displayed are for self-service or other limited type of service, the sign must clearly indicate the type of service.
 - f. All fuels and services displayed on the signs must be available at the posted prices.

(2) Standard II:

- a. Pump topper signs placed on the top of each pump.
- 25 b. The signs must be placed so they are easily readable by motorists traveling on the abutting streets.
 - c. The sign shall indicate the maximum retail price per gallon, or other unit, to the nearest tenth of a cent inclusive of all taxes, in numerals at least six (6) inches tall for the motor vehicle fuels available at that pump. If prices are indicated in units other than "price/U.S. gallon," the unit must be indicated in lettering not less than three (3) inches tall.
 - d. If the prices posted are for self-service or other limited type of service, the sign must clearly indicate the type of service.
 - e. All fuels and types of service displayed on the signs must be available at the posted prices.
- f. Either the sign, or the pump it is attached to, must indicate the type of fuel available at that pump (i.e., leaded, unleaded, diesel, gasohol, etc.) in full or abbreviated form, easily readable from the abutting streets.

(3) Standard III:

a. Any conditions of sale to obtain motor vehicle fuel for a discounted cash price shall be prominently displayed in lettering at least six (6) inches tall, for each

- kind of motor vehicle fuel available for sale on the sign as a "cash only" price.

 The "cash only" designation shall be positioned adjacent to the discounted price for each type of motor vehicle fuel sold at the discounted price.
 - b. The size of the discounted price sign shall conform to the requirements in Standards I and II (at least six (6) inches tall). Such sign shall be clearly visible and legible to motorists of approaching motor vehicles on the abutting streets.
 - c. The sign(s) shall be kept free from vegetation or other obstructions that may block the view of the advertised price on the sign from the adjacent street or roadway or otherwise camouflage the motor fuel pricing.
 - d. Any person engaging in the retail sales of motor vehicle fuel found to be in violation of this Section of the Palm Beach Code shall be required to pay to Palm Beach County a civil penalty of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) for the first violation and Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each repeat violation.
 - e. Persons that engage in the retail sales of motor vehicle fuel to the general public shall have one year from the effective date of this ordinance to come into compliance with signage requirements pertaining to maximum prices per gallon. During the one year period, if a person engaging in the retail sale of motor vehicle fuel to the general public offers a cash discount, they shall place a sign at the pump indicating the type of fuel available from the discounted price.

Section 2. Repeal of Laws in Conflict.

All local laws and ordinances applying to the unincorporated area of Palm Beach County in conflict with any provision of this article are hereby repealed to the extent of any conflict.

Section 3. Scope of Ordinance.

This Ordinance shall be applicable in both the unincorporated and incorporated areas of Palm
Beach County, except that it shall not apply in any municipality that has adopted and maintains
in effect ordinances or regulations governing the same matters.

Section 4. Savings clause.

Notwithstanding the section of this Ordinance regarding the repeal of laws in conflict, all administrative and court orders, fines, and pending enforcement issued pursuant to this authority and procedures established by Chapter 17, Article I, Section 17-2, of the Palm Beach County Code, shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. Severability.

If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Ordinance is for any reason held by the Court to be unconstitutional, inoperative or void, it is the intent of the Board of
