**I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF**

**Motion and Title:** Staff recommends motion to approve:

A) A wireless node fee; and

B) A new rate structure for network services provided to institutional customers who qualify for the Schools and Libraries "E-rate" Program.

**Summary:** The above-referenced fee and rate are applicable to network services provided by Palm Beach County Information Systems Services (ISS) to external agencies. The monthly node fee will apply to wireless devices added to our network, such as WiFi radios for providing public wireless services at an external customer's site. The E-rate equivalent structure will establish a special discounted rate for E-rate eligible organizations, i.e., schools and libraries, when the County is not the primary provider for their network services. The discount will be equivalent to the E-rate paid by the School District to their primary service provider. These standard rate structures will be applicable to all future agreements for supplemental services provided to external agencies. This program builds upon Palm Beach County's history of collaboration with public sector agencies which has resulted in service improvements for the connected agencies, cost savings to the taxpayers, revenues to the County, and other intangible benefits.

**Background and Justification:** ISS began providing network services to external agencies in April 2008 when we entered into an agreement with the School District of Palm Beach County to connect selected schools to the County's fiber-optic network. Since then, we have entered into more than 40 service agreements with over 30 agencies. All of these agencies are listed in Attachment 2. The majority of these agreements involve network services; however, agreements also exist for application hosting services, GIS support and document scanning.

External agencies with network services are now requesting public WiFi at their sites. The additional wireless node fee will allow us to provide these public WiFi services to external agencies. External education agencies are requesting a comparable monthly network rate to their current E-rate. The School District is a qualifying institution which will benefit from County-provided network services at a monthly rate equivalent to their current E-rate.

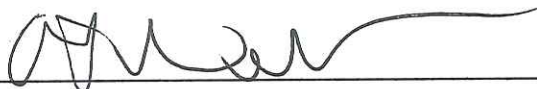

The Federal Communications Commission oversees the universal service *Schools and Libraries Program*, commonly known as "E-rate" which is intended to ensure that schools and libraries have access to affordable telecommunications and information services. The program is funded from universal service contributions collected from tele-communications carriers. E-rates provide a discount ranging from 20 percent to 90 percent off prevailing market rates, depending upon the level of poverty and the urban/rural status of the population served. The Palm Beach County School District currently receives services discounted by 70%.

These rates will be applicable to all future agreements for supplemental services. Existing agreements may be amended in the future by ISS to adjust existing or add new services.
