This application is for \$15,441,552 in Fiscal Year 2014 Section 5307 Capital Funds, of the \$106,366,577 apportioned to the Miami UZA. Uploaded on TEAM is the letter detailing the distribution of funds among the parties that conform the Miami UZA.


