I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends a motion to approve: A) The allocation of \$87,380 by the Office of Community Revitalization for the implementation of the following projects: 1) Limestone Creek - Funding toward the construction of a community identity sign (\$12,380); and 2) All Districts – Funding toward Putting Kids First (\$75,000); and B) Budget transfer of \$87,380 from the CCRT Reserve Funding Account to establish project budgets for these projects.

Summary: The above projects were reviewed and recommended for funding by the Countywide Community Revitalization Team (CCRT), on March 11, 2014. The CCRT is comprised of neighborhood representatives as well as representatives from various County departments and agencies, including: the School District, the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO), Community Services, Water Utilities Department, Engineering Department, Department of Economic Sustainability, Code Enforcement, Planning, Zoning and Building Divisions, Parks and Recreation, Fire Rescue, Animal Care and Control, Drowning Prevention, Health Department, and the Solid Waste Authority Putting Kids First is a program established by the Board in 2006 to provide school supplies to approximately 12,000 underserved kids throughout Palm Beach County. Along with school supplies, children also receive free school physicals, immunizations, haircuts, and clothing to ensure that they are admitted to school. Additionally, the Putting Kids First event provides the families exposure to other community resources to help them on their road to self-sufficiency and improve their children's success in school. Funding for this and the community identity sign for Limestone Creek is available from CCRT Recouped Funding Reserves, which resulted from previously scheduled or completed CCRT projects. Background and Justification: The Board of County Commissioners (BCC) created the Office of Community Revitalization (OCR) in 2003 to administer and coordinate community revitalization initiatives within designated unincorporated areas of Palm Beach County and the Lake Region municipalities of South Bay, Pahokee, and Belle The OCR has historically received an annual allocation of general funds which have been utilized in partnership with funding from other agencies and various County departments to initiate and complete community and neighborhood revitalization projects, such as: paving; drainage; water and sanitary sewer systems; neighborhood parks; community centers; land acquisition; and feasibility studies. The OCR also provides financial and technical assistance to neighborhood organizations within CCRT areas to develop community enhancement The remaining funding is re-allocated to the CCRT Recouped Funding reserves, and OCR later recommends to the BCC which community improvement projects should receive funding.

The OCR is recommending funding for the construction of a community identity sign in Limestone Creek. Residents from the Limestone Creek CCRT area have requested assistance with this project to help beautify the street, strengthen the community identity and pride amongst residents, as well as increase countywide recognition of the oldest African-American community in Palm Beach County. The estimated total project cost is \$28,950. Additional funding in the amount of \$16,570 is in place from contributions provided by the residents, the Town of Jupiter, the Ernie Els Foundation, Cotleur Hearing & Design, and WCL World Class, a local business. The design has been completed and the OCR is recommending the allocation of \$12,380 to assist with the construction of the project.

The OCR is also recommending funding for the implementation of the Putting Kids First Program. Funding for Putting Kids First was first approved by the BCC in 2006. Since then, the OCR has been implementing the program in coordination with the PBSO to provide school supplies and other services to children countywide. The program has grown from originally serving approximately 3,000, to a coordinated program at 6 sites throughout Palm Beach County, serving over 12,000 children countywide in 2013. 

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

Background and Justification: This has been possible through OCR's creative partnership, and leveraging of funding with the Community Back to School Bash (BASH), a 501.c.3 organization, comprised of more than 70 non-profit and other agencies throughout Palm Beach County that serve disadvantaged students pre-K through 12 from low or no-income families to better address the needs in the CCRT communities we serve. The estimated total cost of the program in 2013 was \$194,430. The Board allocated \$75,000, and remaining funds came from the Spirit of Giving Network, the PBSO, the Lost Tree Village Foundation, the Children Services Council, the He Hill and PNC Foundations, State Farm, the UPS Foundation, and the donations provided by all the agencies which are part of the Community Back to School Bash collaborative.


Through the partnership, and without increasing the annual allocation of county funding, the County was able to increase the number of distribution sites from four to six, triple the number of students served, and provide them with supplies, backpacks, information and resources to empower them to begin the school year with confidence. Some of these resources include— Palm Beach County Library System, Subsidized Tutoring Programs, DCF/Access, United Way of Palm Beach County, Children's Services Council, Literacy Coalition of Palm Beach County, and Florida KidCare.

As a result of the tremendous success of the Putting Kids First program, the OCR is recommending the allocation of \$75,000 to partner again with BASH to reach about 15,000 disadvantaged students at 6 proposed distribution locations in Palm Beach County, including: Central County (at the Convention Center); South County (at Village Academy in Delray Beach); and North County (Roger Dean Stadium); Pahokee (at Pahokee Parks and Recreation); South Bay (at South Bay Park); and Belle Glade (West Tech Academy). Services to be provided will be upon resource availability. All family members will get a free meal as well.












Use of these funds is restricted to activities that support design and construction of signage that identifies the neighborhood in which the Els Center of Excellence (Center) will be built - the Limestone Creek Community.
