I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to: A) ratify the signature of the Mayor on a Florida Recreation Development Assistance Program (FRDAP) grant application submitted to the State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) on October 29, 2014, requesting \$200,000 to fund 50% of the project elements associated with the Okeeheelee Park South Lakefront Development grant project; B) authorize the County Administrator or his designee to execute the grant Project Agreement, as well as time extensions, task assignments, certifications, standard forms, or amendments to the Agreement that do not change the scope of work or terms and conditions of the Agreement if the grant is approved; and C) authorize the Director of the Parks and Recreation Department to serve as Liaison Agent with FDEP for this project.

Summary: This grant application requests \$200,000 from FRDAP for the Okeeheelee Park South Lakefront Development project. This grant project is part of the development of Okeeheelee Park South. Project elements include a new boat ramp, playground, picnic facilities, canoe/kayak launch, restroom, hiking trail, bike trail, equestrian trail, and car/trailer parking lot. The total project cost identified in this grant application is \$400,000. The grant request is for \$200,000, and requires a \$200,000 (50%) match, which will be funded from the 2004 \$50 Million Waterfront Access and Preservation General Obligation Bond Issue and Zone 2 Park Impact Fees. If the grant is awarded, and once the project is complete, the Project Agreement requires a Notice of Limitation of Use to be recorded in public records limiting the project site to outdoor recreation for the use and benefit of the public in perpetuity as part of the close-out documentation. <u>District 2</u> (AH)

Background and Justification: Okeeheelee Park South is a 758 acre regional park centrally located in Palm Beach County. Several years ago the County began creating a series of interconnected manmade lakes to create fish and wildlife habitat as well as passive recreational opportunities. The County is still in the process of creating wetlands, removing exotic vegetation, and replanting with native vegetation. In 2006, the County completed Phase II of the park which included the Jim Brandon Equestrian Center located on approximately 100 acres in the northwest corner of the park property. The FRDAP grant improvements are planned for an undeveloped portion near the center of the park property. This lakefront improvement project will provide the primary public access to the park's 100 plus acre lake system and surrounding trails.

FRDAP grants are provided by FDEP, and the State's deadline for submitting this application did not allow for prior approval by the Board. In order to meet the grant application deadline, Mayor Taylor signed the application on behalf of the Board, as authorized by the Palm Beach County Administrative Code, Section 309.00. This code requires that the grant be presented to the Board for ratification at the next available Board meeting after signature by the Mayor.





Large covered lighted riding arena, two show rings, three training rings, two barns for up to 128 horses, concession building, announcers' booth, shade pavilion, picnic pavilion, general purpose buildings, restrooms, parking, horse trailer parking, equestrian trails, bike trails and hiking trails.

The project is consistent with the following issues and goals outlined in the Outdoor Recreation in Florida 2008 manual:

<u>Outdoor Recreation in Florida</u>, <u>2008</u>, <u>6-5</u> recognizes the importance of tourism on the State's economy and a portion of 6-5 states "...Nature-based tourism in Florida is another rapidly growing activity. Fishing, hunting, paddling, boating and nature viewing are but a few of the common examples of the activities that are promoted through this type of tourism..."

Okeeheelee Park South is an 758 acre park centrally located in Palm Beach County. This park has an extensive native tree canopy, and vegetation that includes cypress trees, slash pines and scrub oaks, making it a green oasis in the heart of Palm Beach County within a heavily urbanized area, creating an ideal environment for nature based tourism. Palm Beach County has over 1.3 million residents, and the majority of the eastern portion of the county is heavily developed. The project provides recreational facilities for boating, fishing, hiking and vistas for photography and nature viewing.





Conceptual Site Plan




