Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to: approve a Resolution of the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County, Florida, supporting the legislative priorities of the 16 County Ecosystem Summit.										
Summary: In late 2014, Palm Beach County participated in the 16 County Ecosystem Summit. Participating in the meeting were the 16 counties that comprise the South Florida Water Management District and the County Coalition for Responsible Management of Lake Okeechobee, St. Lucie and Caloosahatchee Estuaries and Lake Worth Lagoon. The multicounty advisory group adopted and ranked six legislative priorities for the 2015 session. Those priorities are:										
 Restoration of the Herbert Hoover Dike Restoration of the Kissimmee River Providing funding necessary to complete St. Lucie C-44 reservoirs/STA complex and the entire Indian River Lagoon-South project including the C023, C-4, and C-25 projects and the C-43 project An updated Water resources Development Act every two years to authorize crucial ecosystem restoration projects Protect local fertilizer ordinances and local wetland protection ordinances, and oppose any preemption to regulations, particularly in water districts created and operating pursuant to chapter 298, FS Support the recommendations of the Senate Select committee on Indian River Lagoon and Lake Okeechobee Basin

RESOLUTION NO. 2015-

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, SUPPORTING THE LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES OF THE 16 COUNTY ECOSYSTEM SUMMIT

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County recently participated in the 16 County Ecosystem Summit (hereafter known as the 16 County Summit), an annual meeting for all 16 counties that comprise the South Florida Water Management District and the County Coalition for Responsible Management of Lake Okeechobee, St. Lucie and Caloosahatchee Estuaries and Lake Worth Lagoon.

WHEREAS, the 16 County Summit represents over 8 million residents of Palm Beach, Martin, St. Lucie, Okeechobee, Osceola, Glades, Polk, Highlands, Lee, Hendry, Broward, Charlotte, Collier, Miami-Dade, Monroe and Orange Counties who are affected by how the restoration of America's Everglades, its estuaries and Lake Okeechobee is accomplished; and

WHEREAS, the County Coalition is a multiple County advisory group organized for the purpose of providing the general public, the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD), the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACOE), the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP), and the Florida Legislature with a forum to present a variety of issues dealing with the health and welfare of the lakes, estuaries, and riverine systems of Lake Okeechobee, the St. Lucie and Caloosahatchee Estuaries, and the Lake Worth Lagoon, and all of the water bodies connected thereto; and

WHEREAS, the representatives of the 16 counties determined the following legislative priorities in order of importance: 1) Restoration of the Herbert Hoover Dike (increasing the annual appropriation for rehabilitation of the Herbert Hoover Dike to accelerate project completion); 2) Restoration of the Kissimmee River (continued appropriations to complete restoration); 3) Providing the funding necessary to complete St. Lucie C-44 reservoirs/STA complex and the entire Indian River Lagoon-South project including the C-23, C-4 and C-25 projects and the C-43 project; 4) An updated Water Resources Development Act every two years to authorize crucial ecosystem restoration projects; 5) Protect local fertilizer ordinances, protect local wetland protection ordinances, oppose any preemption to regulations, particularly in water control districts created and operating pursuant to chapter 298, Florida State Statutes; and 6) Support the recommendations of the Senate Select Committee on Indian River Lagoon and Lake Okeechobee Basin.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

1. Palm Beach County supports the 16 County Summit's legislative priorities set forth above and supports accomplishing these priorities through 2015.
