I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to: A) Receive and File the 2014 Crime Statistics Report for the Palm Beach County Urban High-Crime Job Tax Credit (UJTC) Program and the UJTC Re-ranking Status Letter/Program; B) Ratify the Mayor's signature on the 2014 Crime Statistics Report; and C) Authorize the County Administrator, or his designee, to execute future UJTC Program reports and all related amendments and documents.

Summary: Palm Beach County has participated in the UJTC Program since 1999. Historically, the State assembled the data and reviewed the statistics. The County is now required by the Florida Legislature to submit the report for the State's review. The 2014 Crime Statistics Report was executed on August 25, 2014 by the Mayor and was provided to the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO). The report includes the crime volume and number of arrests that took place for various crimes within the UJTC area during the 2013 calendar year. Upon review of the 2014 Crime Statistics Report, the State re-ranked the County UJTC area as Tier 1 allowing eligible businesses to receive State tax credits from \$1,500 to \$2,000 per qualified job. The re-designation of the UJTC areas became effective on January 1, 2015, and will remain in effect until December 31, 2017. (Strategic Planning Section) Districts 2 & 7 (JB)

Background and Justification: On April 21, 1998, the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners adopted a Resolution (R98-553) authorizing the nomination and submittal of a UJTC Program application to DEO (f/k/a Office of Tourism Trade and Economic Development). The County's UJTC area consists of portions of Delray Beach, Lake Park, Mangonia Park, Riviera Beach, West Palm Beach and the unincorporated area of Westgate/Belvedere Homes. The County is required to update its crime statistics every third year. The County Criminal Justice Commission assisted the Department of Economic Sustainability in coordinating with the Sheriff's Office, Delray Police Department, Riviera Beach Police Department and West Palm Beach Police Department to finalize the statistics based on the 2013 calendar year. The UJTC Program is an incentive for eligible businesses located within one of the 13 State designated urban high-crime areas to create new jobs. Businesses may take the tax credits against either Florida Corporate Income Tax or the Florida Sales and Use Tax. From 2009 to 2014, the County's UJTC Program provided tax credits in the amount of \$3,073,500 for the creation of 2,049 jobs.

Based on the 2014 Crime Statistics Request Package that was submitted by Palm Beach County and other information provided to us, we have determined that the Palm Beach County's Urban High-Crime Area UA-5001 shall be re-ranked as a Tier One (I) Urban High-Crime Area.

This designation will provide qualified businesses that create a required number of new jobs within your Urban High-Crime Area the opportunity to apply for credits against their corporate income tax or sales tax obligations. The effective date of this designation will be January 1, 2015, and will be in effect until December 31, 2017. We are scheduled to conduct another reranking process of the thirteen designated Urban High-Crime Areas in calendar year 2017.





The Florida Legislature created the Urban High-Crime Area Job Tax Credit Program in 1997 to encourage the creation of new jobs in designated urban areas of Florida (section 212.097, Florida Statutes). The Program provides up to \$5.0 million of tax credits annually to eligible businesses who are located within one of the 13 Urban High-Crime Areas designated by the Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) and hire a specific number of employees.

WHAT IS AN URBAN HIGH-CRIME AREA JOB TAX CREDIT?

An Urban High-Crime Area Job Tax Credit is an incentive for eligible businesses located within one of the 13 designated urban high-crime areas to create new jobs. The credit ranges from \$500 to \$2,000 per qualified job and can be taken against either the Florida Corporate Income Tax or the Florida Sales and Use Tax. The credit can only be taken against only one of these two taxes.

These tax credits are provided to encourage meaningful employment opportunities that will improve the quality of life of those employed and to encourage economic expansion of new and existing businesses in designated urban areas of Florida.

HOW MANY TAX CREDITS WILL BE AWARDED?

Five million dollars of tax credits may be approved in a calendar year. One million dollars of tax credits will be exclusively reserved for businesses located within Tier One designated areas.

HOW WERE THE AREAS DESIGNATED?

DEO designated the 13 high-crime areas for participation based on applications submitted by units of local governments.

WHEN WILL THE DESIGNATIONS BE EFFECTIVE?

The re-designation of the Urban High-Crime Areas became effective on **January 1, 2015**, and will remain in effect until December 31, 2017. The areas will be re-ranked with an effective date of January 1, 2018.

WHICH AREAS HAVE BEEN DESIGNATED?

The nominated areas located within the following jurisdictions have been designated as eligible areas to participate in the Urban High-Crime Job Tax Credit Program. A listing of the contact persons (with telephone numbers and e-mail addresses) is found on page 5 of this overview.

Each contact person will be able to provide information (maps and/or boundary descriptions) on the designated area within their jurisdiction. Designated areas range from 3 to 20 square miles.

WHICH EMPLOYEES ARE ELIGIBLE FOR A TAX CREDIT?

Those new employees of an eligible business (in a designated Urban High-Crime Area) who work in a regular, full-time position (averaging at least 36 hours per week) if the business has created the required minimum number of new jobs.

An employee must be employed for at least 3 months and must be employed on the date of the tax credit application.

An owner or partner of the eligible business is not a qualified employee.

An employee leased from an employee leasing company licensed under chapter 468, F. S., is eligible if such employee has continuously been leased to the employer for more than 6 months.

WHAT'S CONSIDERED A "NEW BUSINESS"?

A "New Business" is any eligible business that begins operation on a site in a designated Urban High-Crime Area after October 1, 1998, which is separate from any other business operation within the designated area.

During its first year of operation, a business may submit only one tax credit application.

WHAT'S CONSIDERED AN "EXISTING BUSINESS"?

An "Existing Business" is any eligible business that does not qualify as a "New Business".

An existing business may apply at anytime, but must wait one year before re-applying.

CLAIMING TAX CREDIT:

Upon approval, you will receive a letter from the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) and a notification from the Department of Revenue if claiming a credit against sales and use tax (see below).

CORPORATE INCOME TAX CREDIT INFORMATION:

If an election is made to claim the approved credit against corporate income tax, a copy of the credit approval letter from DEO must be attached to the corporate income tax return (Form F-1120) on which the credit is claimed. Corporate income tax credits which cannot be fully used in the year they first become available may be carried over to succeeding tax years for up to 5 years.

SALES AND USE TAX CREDIT INFORMATION:

If an election is made to claim the approved credit amount against sales and use tax, the Department of Revenue will issue a Department of Revenue Credit Memorandum. The credit memorandum will authorize a credit to be claimed against sales and use tax on Line 8 of Form DR-15 (see instructions for Line 8, in the Department of Revenue Sales and Use Tax Coupon Book). Sales and Use Tax Credits are valid for 12 months from the date of application approval.

NOTE:

If, prior to claiming any credit, the credit election is changed (corporate income tax versus sales and use tax) please notify the Department of Revenue immediately by calling Taxpayer Services Process at 1-800-352-3671, Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Eastern Time. Once the credit has been claimed against either the corporate income tax or sales and use tax, it must continue to be claimed against that tax and cannot be claimed against the other tax.

CALCULATION OF TAX CREDIT:

New Eligible Business: A new eligible business that, on the date of application, has at least the minimum number of qualified employees on the date of application shall receive a tax credit per qualified employee in the amount per employee identified on the above chart for that tier.

Existing Eligible Business: An existing eligible business that, on the date of application, has at least the minimum number of additional qualified employees required for that tier than it had one year before the date of application shall receive a tax credit for each such additional qualified employee in the amount per employee identified on the above chart for that tier. To determine the number of additional qualified employees, the business must determine (a) the number of qualified employees currently employed as of the date of application and (b) the number of qualified employees employed as of one year prior to the date of application. If (a) is greater than (b) and the difference is equal to or exceeds the minimum number of additional qualified employees, then the difference between the two numbers shall be multiplied by the tax credit per additional employee identified on the above chart for that tier.

For an existing eligible business to be eligible for a tax credit, the number of qualified employees employed 1 (one) year before the application date must be no lower than the number of qualified employees on January 1, 2009, or on the application date on which an application was based for any previous application.

DEFINITION OF "SMALL BUSINESS:"

A "Small Business" is defined in section 288.703, F.S., means an independently owned and operated business concern that employs 200 or fewer permanent full-time employees and that, together with its affiliates, has a net worth of not more than \$5 million or any firm based in this state which has a Small Business Administration 8(a) certification. As applicable to sole proprietorships, the \$5 million net worth requirement shall include both personal and business investments.

An owner or partner of the eligible business is not a qualified employee. The term "Qualified Employee" also includes an employee leased from an employee leasing company licensed under chapter 468, Florida Statutes, if such employee has been continuously leased to the employer for an average of at least 36 hours per week for more than 6 months. Once an employee becomes a qualified employee of the eligible business, the person keeps that status until he or she is no longer actively working for that eligible business.

DEFINITION OF NEW BUSINESS:

A "New Business" is any eligible business first beginning operation on a site in a qualified high-crime area and clearly separate from any other business operation within that qualified high-crime area.

DEFINITION OF EXISTING BUSINESS:

An "Existing Business" is any eligible business that is located in a qualified high-crime area and does not quality for as a "New Business".

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING SUBMITTAL OF AN APPLICATION TO THE STATE OF FLORIDA OFFICE OF TOURISM, TRADE AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FOR THE DESIGNATION OF CERTAIN HIGH CRIME AREAS AS ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE URBAN JOB TAX CREDIT PROGRAM PURSUANT TO SECTION 212.097, FLORIDA STATUTES.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners recognizes that the State of Florida has developed a program to designate high-crime areas as eligible to participate in the Urban Job Tax Credit Program; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners finds that the said Urban Job Tax Credit Program offers an incentive for eligible businesses located in higher-crime areas to create new jobs, which incentives range from \$500 to \$2,000 credit per qualified job and can be applied against either the Florida Corporate Income Tax or the Florida Sales and Use Tax; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners recognize that specific areas in the communities of Delray Beach, Lake Park, Mangonia Park, Riviera Beach, West Palm Beach, and the unincorporated area of Westgate/Belvedere Homes have unacceptable levels of high-crime and that these areas exhibit extreme and unacceptable levels of poverty, unemployment, physical deterioration, and economic disinvestment; and

WHEREAS, specific areas in the municipalities of Delray Beach, Lake Park, Mangonia Park, Riviera Beach, West Palm Beach and the unincorporated area of Westgate/Belvedere Homes meet the basic qualification guidelines; and

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County determines that the rehabilitation, conservation or redevelopment, or a combination thereof, of such high-crime areas is necessary in the interest of public health, safety, and welfare of the residents in the county and municipalities; and

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County determines that the revitalization of such high-crime areas can occur if the private sector can be induced to invest its own resources in productive enterprises that build or rebuild the economic vitality of the area; and

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County desires to nominate specific high-crime areas and to jointly apply with the municipalities of Delray Beach, Lake Park,

Mangonia Park, Riviera Beach and West Palm Beach to the State of Florida requesting the designation of such areas as eligible to participate in the Urban Job Tax Credit Program pursuant to Section 212.097, Florida Statutes.

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County will support the necessary incentives to encourage and establish economic development in the Urban Job Tax Credit Program communities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and are expressly incorporated herein by references and made a part hereof.
