B) budget transfer of \$3,000 in the general fund from the Outreach and Community Programming Division to the Belle Glade Youth Empowerment Center program to fund the cost associated with this First Amendment.

Summary: On December 16, 2014, Palm Beach County entered into a contract with the City of Belle Glade (R2014-1976) to provide funding for the Belle Glade Youth Empowerment Center (YEC). The Center offers services that promote academic proficiency, college readiness, career readiness and other life-skills for low-income youth that reside within the Belle Glade area. An additional \$3,000 is needed to send eight (8) youth from the Belle Glade area and two (2) adult chaperones on a college tour that is coordinated by staff from the Riviera Beach Youth Empowerment Center. The additional funds will be used to pay for travel, lodging, food and other materials. The City of Belle Glade approved the contract amendment on March 16, 2015. District 6 (HH)

Background and Justification: On February 15, 2005, the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) directed the Criminal Justice Commission (CJC) to develop a Youth Violence Prevention Project to address the increase in violent firearms crimes. CJC implemented a national Comprehensive Gang Model, created by the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs. CJC formed a Steering Committee to bring local agencies together to create a comprehensive youth violence reduction program later named the Youth Violence Prevention Project. As a result, the Board of County Commissioners created Youth Empowerment Centers in five high crime areas which include Riviera Beach, West Palm Beach, Lake Worth, Boynton Beach, and Belle Glade. Youth Empowerment Centers were designed to offer programs and activities that promote pro-social behavior and enhance education and employment opportunities for at-risk On October 1, 2014, the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners established the Youth Services Department. Youth programs that were previously administered by the Criminal Justice Commission, Public Safety, and Community Services Departments were transferred to Youth Services Department. Funding for the Youth Empowerment Centers is now administered by the Youth Services Department, Outreach and Community Programming Division.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR YOUTH EMPOWERMENT CENTER SERVICES

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE INTERLOCA	L AGREEMENT (hereinafter "First
Amendment"), is made as of this day of	2015 by and between Palm Beach
County, a Political Subdivision of the State of Florida, here	inafter referred to as the "COUNTY"
and the City of Belle Glade, a municipality located in	Palm Beach County, Florida (herein
referred to as the "CITY"), each one constituting a public a	agency as defined in Part I of Chapter
163, Florida Statutes.	2 ,

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Parties, entered the Original Interlocal Agreement on (R-2014-1976) December 16, 2014, with an expiration date of September 30, 2015, for a total Interlocal Agreement price not to exceed \$140,000; and

WHEREAS, the CITYS's responsibilities under the Original Interlocal Agreement are to provide Youth Empowerment Services consistent with the Youth Violence Prevention Project and the goal of preventing youth violence, as referenced in Article 1 (Services – Scope of Work) of the Original Interlocal Agreement and more fully outlined in the "Scope of Work" marked as Exhibit "A" to the Original Interlocal Agreement; and

NOW THEREFORE, the above named parties hereby mutually agree to amend the Original Interlocal Agreement and enter into this First Amendment as follows:

- I. Article 4 A. (Payments to the CITY) is amended to increase the original Interlocal Agreement price from \$140,000 with an additional \$3,000, for a new total Interlocal Agreement price not to exceed the amount of \$143,000.
- II. Article 26 (Notice) is amended to change name and address of COUNTY to:

- III. Exhibit B2 (attached) is amended to include a budget for the additional \$3,000.
- IV. All other provisions of the Original Interlocal Agreement not in conflict with this First Amendment remain in effect and are to be performed at the same level as specified in the Original Interlocal Agreement dated December 16, 2014.
