I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve:

(A) Approve the filing of the FY 2015 Section 5307 Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Grant Application FL-90-X881 for \$10,439,303 in capital funds allocated to Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners (BCC)

(B) Authorize the Palm Tran Director or Assistant Director through the County Administrator to execute, on behalf of the BCC, and to transmit electronically the BCC's approval of the grant application, award, and the resulting grant agreement.

Summary: FTA Section 5307 Grant provides funds for capital projects and planning associated with the delivery of public transportation. The FY 2015 Grant will fund items necessary for the continued operations of the Palm Tran system including: Replacement of vehicles that have reached their useful life, security projects, facility rehabilitation and maintenance, preventive maintenance, transportation development plan consultant, transit enhancements. The grant requires a 20% local match and submittal of a Standard Form LLL - Disclosure of Lobbying Activities. The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has approved the use of toll revenue credits as the required local 20% match; therefore, the projects budget lists the capital projects at 100% cost for the federal share, no county funds are required. This grant award is included in Palm Tran's FY 2016 proposed budget. The FTA has only apportioned 8/12 (\$10,439,303) of the 5307 Grant funds, pending full appropriation by the U.S. Congress. Palm Tran will present to the BCC an amendment to this application for the remaining funds (approximately \$5,219,653) when the FTA apportions them. <u>Countywide</u> (DR)

Background and Policy Issues: The BCC's approval of the 5307 Grant Award will bind the BCC to the terms and conditions of FTA's Master Agreement - FTA MA (21) dated October 1, 2014 (MA 21 was approved by the BCC on $1/13/2015 \operatorname{Rapis-pog}$). This Master Agreement encompasses all FTA awards issued until a subsequent Master Agreement is enacted or issued. The Standard form LLL is an FTA requirement when lobbying services are procured with non-federal funds.

Project Details

This application is for \$10,439,303 in Fiscal Year 2015 Section 5307 Capital Funds, of the 8/12 or \$71,901,272 currently apportioned to the Miami UZA. Uploaded on TEAM is the letter detailing the distribution of funds among the parties that conform the Miami UZA.

The funds awarded under this grant will be spent as follows:

- Bus Replacement. The funds will be used to purchase 10 buses due to reach their useful life in fiscal year 2016 and help with the purchase of 10 buses to reach their useful life in fiscal year 2017. In the next 5 years 76 buses will be due for replacement.

- Security projects, intended to increase the security and safety of the existing transportation system

- Vehicle Replacement- (used as equipment). Support Vehicles due to be replaced in FY2016.

- Acquire General Purpose Equipment (office equipment, furnishings, etc.) for three garages and three administration facilities.

- Preventive Maintenance for Palm Tran fleet; includes labor, tire lease and maintenance contracts for FY2016.

- Administrative facility rehabilitation and renovation, of the Palm Tran main administrative and maintenance buildings (North County, South County, and Belle Glade).

- 3rd party contract Consultant. Activities specifically emphasizing on the development and preparation of the

Transportation Development Plan (TDP), a short range transportation system or project planning and analysis proposed in the next three to five years; examples include management analyses of internal operations such as

management/administration, maintenance, personnel, labor relations; and service planning.

- Transit enhancement funds for shelters, solar lighting, and pedestrian walkways.

The Grantee certifies that for every procurement action to be funded with this grant, independent cost estimates will be prepared and available on file along with the corresponding cost/price analysis for the scope of work of the projects.

Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) toll revenue credits in the amount of \$2,609,826; will be used in lieu of local match for the projects covered under the 5307 application for Palm Beach County, as listed on the STIP page 1210 under project number 235749-1.
