I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to: A) ratify the signature of the Mayor on a Florida Recreation Development Assistance Program (FRDAP) grant application submitted to the State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) on August 3, 2015, requesting \$200,000 to fund 50% of the project elements associated with the Okeeheelee Park South Lakefront Development grant project; B) authorize the County Administrator or designee to execute the grant Project Agreement, as well as time extensions, task assignments, certifications, standard forms, or amendments to the Agreement that do not change the terms and conditions of the Agreement if the grant is approved; and C) authorize the Director of the Parks and Recreation Department to serve as Liaison Agent with FDEP for this project.

Summary: This grant application requests \$200,000 from FRDAP for the Okeeheelee Park South Lakefront Development project. Project elements include a new boat ramp, hiking trail, picnic facilities, equestrian trail, bike path, playground, restroom, parking and associated infrastructure. Total project costs identified in this grant application are \$400,000. The grant request is for \$200,000, and requires a \$200,000 (50%) match, which will be funded from Zone 2 Park Impact Fees and the 2004 \$50 Million Waterfront Access and Preservation General Obligation Bond. If the grant is awarded, and once the project is complete, the Project Agreement requires a Notice of Limitation of Use to be recorded in public records limiting the project site to outdoor recreation for the use and benefit of the public in perpetuity as part of the close-out documentation. Background and Justification: Okeeheelee Park South is a 758 acre regional park centrally located in Palm Beach County. Several years ago the County began creating a series of interconnected lakes to create fish and wildlife habitat as well as passive recreational opportunities. The County is still in the process of creating wetlands, removing exotic vegetation, and replanting with native vegetation. In 2006, the County completed Phase II of the park which included the Jim Brandon Equestrian Center located on approximately 100 acres in the northwest corner of the park property. The FRDAP grant improvements are planned for an undeveloped portion near the center of the park property. This lakefront improvement project will provide the primary public access to the park's 100 plus acre lake system and surrounding trails.

FRDAP grants are provided by FDEP, and the State's deadline for submitting this application did not allow for prior approval by the Board. In order to meet the grant application deadline, Mayor Vana signed the application on behalf of the Board, as authorized by the Palm Beach County Administrative Code, Section 309.00. This code requires that the grant be presented to the Board for ratification at the next available Board meeting after signature by the Mayor.



The project is consistent with the following issues and goals outlined in the Outdoor Recreation in Florida 2008 manual:

<u>Outdoor Recreation in Florida</u>, 2008, 6-5 recognizes the importance of tourism on the State's economy and a portion of 6-5 states "... Nature-based tourism in Florida is another rapidly growing activity. Fishing, hunting, paddling, boating and nature viewing are but a few of the common examples of the activities that are promoted through this type of tourism..."

Okeeheelee Park South is a 758 acre park centrally located in Palm Beach County. This park has an extensive native tree canopy, and vegetation that includes cypress trees, slash pines and scrub oaks, making it a green oasis in the heart of Palm Beach County within a heavily urbanized area, creating an ideal environment for nature based tourism. According to the Tourist Development Council, in 2014 Palm Beach County had a record 6.3 million tourists generating \$7.1 billion in economic Impact. The project provides recreational facilities for boating, fishing, hiking and vistas for photography and nature viewing.

Outdoor Recreation in Florida, 2008, 6-4

Among the issues discussed in Chapter 6 is importance of recreational access to Florida's Waters and the declining availability. 6-4 states "Despite the popularity and economic importance of recreational boating, public access to the state's coastline and waterways has been steadily declining"





Exhibit "G" Trail connection to Greenacres Greenway



















Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve: a Unity of Title for County owned property located on the south side of Forest Hill Boulevard, east of the Florida Turnpike and west of Pinchurst Drive in unincorporated Greenacres.

Summary: The County owns 768 acres which supports several County uses including Okeeheelee Park South, the Water Utilities Department (WUD) North Region Operation Center, the Sheriff's K-9 Facility and WUD's Production Wells for Water Treatment Plant #2. The 768 acres is comprised of several different parcels and property control numbers. Upon the recording of the Unity of Title, the County parcels will be considered as a single unified property which will simplify future development of the property for County purposes. Background and Justification: The County anticipates future development of the 768 acres currently being used as Okeeheelee Park South, the WUD Administration and North Region Operation Center, the Sheriff's K-9 Facility and WUD's Production Wells for Water Treatment Plant #2. This Unity of Title will combine the various parcels supporting the County uses, which thereafter shall be considered as one plot of land. As a result, any proposed improvements through the Building Permit Review process will be evaluated on the basis of the entire 768 acres rather than as individual parcels that were historically assembled and now lie within the boundary of the overall property. Staff intends to file the Okecheelee South Boundary Survey and Compilation Map (768 acres) into the Miscellaneous Plat Book and then, in turn, record the Unity of Title into the public records of Palm Beach County. The Miscellaneous Plat Book and page number of the Okecheelee South Boundary Survey and Compilation Map will be added to the legal description of the Unity of Title prior to recording for cross reference


