Summary: On July 22, 2014, the Board of County Commissioners approved the transfer of funding allocations for the Youth Violence/Diversion and Summer Camp Scholarship Programs from the Department of Community Services to the newly created Youth Services Department. The five (5) referenced agreements were previously a part of the Financial Assisted Agency (FAA) program and are now referred to as Community Based Agencies (CBAs) under the new Youth Services Department. The contract amendments recommended for approval reflect the last remaining renewal in a three (3) year cycle for a total contract amount of \$533,889, which was approved as part of the FY 2016 budget process. Funding is the same as FY 2015 and no additional funds are being allocated in this item. Countywide (HH)

Background and Policy Issues: In providing for youth programming, Palm Beach County augments its own service mix through the provision of funding for external programming and services delivered by Community Based Agencies. The FAA program was established in the early 1980s to overcome the adverse impact of reduced federal funding. It is now an important component of the federal, state and local funding sources that support our County's system of care. The Board of County Commissioners has directed staff to pursue data-driven, evidenced-based programming and outcome measures that ensure effective changes in people's lives in our community. The transferred contracts are monitored by the Youth Services Department to maintain programmatic and fiscal accountability. Contracts include the following safeguards to protect the County: insurance coverage is mandatory, funds are paid out on a unit cost basis and funds cannot be used to initiate or to pursue litigation against the County.

SECOND AMENDMENT TO FINANCIALLY ASSISTED AGENCIES CONTRACT FOR PROVISION OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Overview:

ASPIRA, through its proposed Violence Prevention and Leadership Program, targets 120 primarily Hispanic and other youth attending five middle schools, addressing the risk factors and aiming to decrease youth violence in Palm Beach County via after school Youth Leadership Development Meetings.

Observed Need/Risk Factor(s) that will be addressed: Child has early signs of aggressive or anti-social behavior or depression.

Outcomes: ASPIRA will report on achievement of the following Youth Symposium Outcomes with the overarching outcome of reducing youth violence:

#5- Increase educational performance;

#6- Increase adolescent pro social behavior.

Services:

ASPIRA will provide youth year-round comprehensive group, individual and family advisement sessions and weekly research-based violence prevention curriculum workshops via an ASPIRA Youth Leadership Advisor exclusively designated at each school site, As a result of services provided, increased individual attention and consistent group interaction, youth in the program will view the school as a safe and positive place in which they belong and recognize that people care about them, thus reducing antisocial behavior, improving negative attitudes and preventing violent behavior while encouraging participants to make healthy, positive choices and bonding with their peers, school and community. Program Staff will provide outreach to recruit the highest risk youth by contacting law enforcement, juvenile probation officers, school personnel, and other institutions that have contact with high risk youth. ASPIRA will coordinate with law enforcement to offer G.R.E.A.T., a violence reduction program for middle school youth at a minimum of one time per contract year. ASPIRA will offer additional youth violence reduction programming, e.g. Y-Girls, Choice to Change, or like programs to all youth at a minimum of one time per contract year. Curriculums will require prior approval from the Director of Outreach & Community Programming.

Agency Name: Communities in Schools

Program Name: Charting for Success

Overview:

The Communities in Schools Charting for Success (CFS) program supports at-risk students in schools throughout Palm Beach County. By providing a positive environment for these students, insuring their access to educational opportunities, social services and support services, students overcome barriers and make positive life choices. Consequently, Communities in Schools of Palm Beach County (CIS) help young people graduate from high school, and go on to reach their highest potential as successful citizens, positive contributors to the community and fill participants in society.

Observed Need/Risk Factor(s) that will be addressed: Child is not performing to his/her ability academically; Child is skipping classes 3 or more times in the last 60 days.

Outcomes: Communities in Schools will report on achievement of the following Youth Symposium Outcomes with the overarching outcome of reducing youth violence:

#5- Increase educational performance;

#6- Increase adolescent pro social behavior.

Services:

The mission of CIS is to surround students with a community of support, empowering them to stay in school and achieve in life. CIS will partner with the School District, identify and mobilize existing community resources and fosters cooperative partnerships for the benefit of students and families. Because CIS staff is school-based, they are trusted members of the school's team. CIS will work with students who have been identified as possessing risk factors which often result in delinquent behavior. CIS will implement its national evidence based program model, known locally as the Charting for Success (CFS) program. This unique approach of providing community-based, integrated student services will provide six different components:

- 1. Placing a school-based CIS Site Coordinator to interface with school staff, community partners, students and their family/guardian at approved targeted schools- schools must be Title I middle or high schools;
- 2. Completing an annual comprehensive school and student level needs assessment;
- 3. Conducting a community assets assessment which includes identifying community partners;

- 4. Developing annual school and student-level plans for delivery of prevention and intervention services;
- 5. Delivering appropriate prevention and intervention services; and
- 6. Evaluation through data collection and reporting to ensure service strategies are appropriate.

CIS will provide widely accessible prevention services and resources that will also be paired with the coordinated, targeted, and sustained intervention services and resources for the subset of students who are most at risk of dropping out of school and/or involved in youth court. Unfortunately, troubled youth and their families often have difficulty negotiating their way through public and private services, all located in different places and following different rules. CIS will eliminate this problem by bringing community resources inside a public school building or a student's home, where they will be accessible, coordinated, and accountable. The parents, through their relationship with CIS, will be supported, encouraged, and taught to create solutions to improve their lives, and become involved in their child's education. CIS will provide comprehensive services to targeted schools which includes not only individualized and sustained services, but also includes services benefiting the entire school, such as a health and career fair and violence prevention workshops.

Program Staff will provide outreach to recruit the highest risk youth by contacting law enforcement, juvenile probation officers, school personnel, and other institutions that have contact with high risk youth. CIS will coordinate with law enforcement to offer G.R.E.A.T., a violence reduction program for middle school youth at a minimum of one time per contract year. CIS will offer additional youth violence reduction programming, e.g. Y-Girls, Choice to Change, or like programs to all youth at a minimum of one time per contract year. Curriculums will require prior approval from the Director of Outreach & Community Programming.

Overview:

The goal for this innovative program is to reduce the number of juveniles in detention, deter future criminal activity through personal and family strengthening activities and reducing the cost to the County for detention services. To achieve these goals, Gulfstream Goodwill Industries (GGI) provides home detention monitoring services to eligible juveniles ages 8-18, with a court order in secured juvenile detention. This program is designed to achieve positive outcomes for the enrolled youth and reduce recidivism and costs to Palm Beach County by monitoring up to 30 youth at a time. GGI offers a variety of services to each youth, combining academic remediation, psychological evaluations, vocational evaluations, support services and comprehensive case management. Youth and their Juvenile Case Worker (JJCW) work on areas such as: time and money management, resume creation and initiating personal development plans with goals and steps to achievement. This program provides opportunities to acquire new skills and experience success that will enhance the self-esteem and motivation of each participant.

Services:

Currently, the Florida Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) employs "trackers" who strictly monitor youth who are released from secure detention to ensure adherence to rules such as curfews, school attendance, and community service compliance. There are no positive interventions for youth or their families to assist in deterring a return to court on new charges. According to the results of the Annie E. Casey Juvenile Detention Alternatives Initiative alternative programs are most effective in deterring future criminal activity and reducing cost for state and local entities.

GGI's program offers a continuum of services designed to raise self-esteem through life-skills curriculum, uncover skills and abilities leading to high school/GED completion, post-secondary education and employment opportunities, discover hidden mental health and cognitive issues affecting behavior through the use of neuropsychological exams with a program psychologist, linkages to a community filled with valuable youth and family resources with an emphasis on family strengthening, and academic remediation in one-to-one and small group settings with a certified teacher in order to maximize the transfer of knowledge in the least stressful manner possible. Drawing on evidence-based research, GGI and DJJ designed this project in the fall of 2010 to represent a fresh approach to a long-term problem facing the County.

Overview:

The City of Pahokee program provides assistance and support to approximately thirty-five (35) children ranging from 12-16 years of age and their working parents who otherwise do not have community access to an afterschool program in which they can improve their educational abilities during after school hours. The program offers an academic environment that is critical during the 3pm to 6pm time period, on regular school days (Monday through Friday), before most working parents arrive home. Students in the afterschool program are encouraged and tutored in Math, Reading, and other academic subject areas. Children also receive instruction and guidance in model behavior, etiquette, and attendance. In addition, the program offers the children a safe place to learn during the peak hours when juveniles are typically victims of crime or engage in criminal activity; which is inherent in impoverished communities with high unemployment rates, like Pahokee.

In addition, to the after school program which runs concurrently with the school year (August-July), the Fresh Start program continues during winter and spring breaks and the summer months. During these school breaks the program is open Monday through Friday 8am to 5pm. During the summer months, students have access to reading, math, science, and technology tutorials in the morning and recreational activities in the afternoon.

Observed Need/Risk Factor(s) that will be addressed: Child is not performing to his/her ability academically; Child is skipping classes 3 or more times in the last 60 days.

Outcomes: City of Pahokee will report on achievement of the following Youth Symposium Outcomes with the overarching outcome of reducing youth violence:

#5- Increase educational performance;

#6- Increase adolescent pro social behavior.

Service:

The City of Pahokee's after school program will provide youth with homework and tutorial assistance after school. During the after school program, youth will engage in an integrated curriculum to develop their capabilities by exploring advanced technology as they utilize the computer lab. The program will allow the participants to complete research papers, homework assignments, and projects. They will create digital books, venture on Brain Pop, experience virtual

field trips, create web designs, surf the net, network with other youth, and explore new software. The program's key goal is to increase parent and community involvement through these activities. Involving our youth in education, social activities, and recreational sports will strengthen our community because they will develop a sense of ownership and accomplishment. This interaction will assist in meeting the goals of our community by solving violence and gang activity issues. Recreational sports, which is also offered during after school hours and during school breaks and the summer session have proven that they can make a difference in the lives of our youth and community. Program Staff will provide outreach to recruit the highest risk youth by contacting law enforcement, juvenile probation officers, school personnel, and other institutions that have contact with high risk youth. The City of Pahokee will coordinate with law enforcement to offer G.R.E.A.T., a violence reduction program for middle school youth at a minimum of one time per contract year. Agency Name: Urban Youth Impact, Inc.

Program Name: The Leadership Academy After School Program

Overview:

Urban Youth Impact has over 14 years of experience in loving, equipping, and empowering at risk youth ages 5-18 residing in low income areas of Palm Beach County, including West Palm Beach and Riviera Beach through the development of programs and activities that build trusting and loving relationships with both the youth and their parents. Our largest program is The Leadership Academy (TLA) After School Program which operates 3 hours a day, 5 days a week. The 120 children, grades K-12 who are enrolled receive one-on-one tutoring, academic enrichment, computer-based reading instruction, life skills lessons, recreation time, snack, field trips, arts (including such things as choir, dance, drama, drawing, crafts, golf, violin and drum lessons) and techniques to work on behavior management.

Observed Need/Risk Factor(s) that will be addressed: Child not performing to his/her ability academically.

Outcomes: Urban Youth Impact, Inc. will report on achievement of the following Youth Symposium Outcomes with the overarching outcome of reducing youth violence:

#5- Increase educational performance;

#6- Increase adolescent pro social behavior.

Services:

The Leadership Academy (TLA) is a multi-approach after school program that features a structured educational component with tutoring, academic enrichment and computer based reading software, a behavioral/emotional social component with life skills lessons in character development, guest speakers and field trips, a physical component with team sports, team building games, and healthy snacks. Urban Youth Impact, Inc. will offer mentoring, counseling, and performing arts. These programs and services will be provided to 30 inner city at-risk youth, ages 5-18, in grades K-12. A major objective of TLA is to provide additional academic enrichment throughout the school year to improve a student's chances of high achievement and success, especially in the area of literacy. This is done through one-on-one reading times, enrichment activities that tie in with school based learning and reading and English improvement through Scholastic's Read About online education software. The Read About system, which was purchased in collaboration with The Kings Academy college preparatory school, allows Urban Youth Impact, Inc. to track the progress of each child and identify the specific areas which need improvement.

TLA will also track improvement in a child's behavior using tools developed to be utilized in the discipline system. These tools will allow TLA to track the frequency and type of poor behavior choice, create a plan to improve these areas in each child, and track changes. They will use a zone discipline system. Their life skills component is designed to help students improve their decisionmaking ability. Whether that decision is not to join a gang, or engage in risky behaviors, or which college to attend, TLA will encourage them to think about the reasons behind the choices they make. The life skills revolve around weekly themes and many times staff will find games, arts and crafts, etc., that tie in directly with the theme. Recently, due to an increase in the rise of childhood obesity and early onset of chronic disease, Urban Youth Impact, Inc. has begun to implement more physical activity into TLA through a partnership with Palm Beach Atlantic University Pharmacy School. Program Staff will provide outreach to recruit the highest risk youth by contacting law enforcement, juvenile probation officers, school personnel, and other institutions that have contact with high risk youth. Urban Youth Impact, Inc. will coordinate with law enforcement to offer G.R.E.A.T., a violence reduction program for middle school youth at a minimum of one time per contract year. Urban Youth Impact, Inc. will offer additional youth violence reduction programming, e.g. Y-Girls, Choice to Change, or like programs to all youth at a minimum of one time per contract year. Curriculums will require prior approval from the Director of Outreach & Community Programming.
