RESOLUTION NO. 2016-1 2 RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF 3 COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO 4 5 **WEATHER ENACT IMPACTS** LEGISLATION; 6 PROVIDING FOR DISTRIBUTION TO LEGISLATORS 7 AND OTHERS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE 8 9 10 WHEREAS, the State of Florida is one of the areas of the United States most 11 vulnerable to weather-related impacts, including flooding, drought, storm surge, high 12 tides, tropical-storm winds, extreme heat, and saltwater intrusion of drinking-water 13 aquifers; and 14 WHEREAS, Broward, Miami-Dade, Monroe, and Palm Beach Counties, many 15 of their municipalities, and a significant number of local, regional, state, and federal 16 stakeholders have been working collaboratively for over six years under the 17 Southeast Florida Regional Climate Change Compact to prepare the region for the 18 impacts of climate change and extreme weather; and 19 WHEREAS, effective responses to climate and weather impacts require not 20 only regional activities, but also state and federal efforts; and 21 WHEREAS, smart investments and public policies undertaken by all levels of 22 23 government in response to potential weather-related impacts will protect Florida's economy by reducing risk and demonstrating to insurance companies, financial 24 institutions, and businesses that Florida is ready, resilient, and a safe place for 25 investment and economic activity; and 26 27 WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature is now considering House Bill 1223. sponsored by Representative Kristin Jacobs, and the identical Senate Bill 1544, 28 sponsored by Senator Jeff Clemens, which would create an interagency workgroup 29 of state agencies to share information and coordinate state efforts to address 30 31 weather impacts; and 32 WHEREAS, HB 1223 and SB 1544 charge the interagency workgroup with preparing an annual report to the Governor, President of the Senate, and Speaker of 33 the House which will assess existing efforts underway in state agencies to address 34 the impacts of weather events, create a uniform vulnerability assessment based on 35 current scientific literature to identify and evaluate impacts currently unaddressed by 36 state agencies, and develop, coordinate, and prioritize efforts to address the current 37 and potential future impacts of weather events; and 38 39 WHEREAS, this annual report will be posted on the website of each agency represented on the interagency workgroup, for consideration and use by local 40 governments, other stakeholders, and the general public; and 41
