I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Title: Climate Resilience

Summary: This workshop will provide an overview of the County's involvement in issues surrounding climate change impacts. The staff presentation will include a brief summary of the County's resilience and sustainability efforts within the larger context of Southeast Florida Regional Climate Change Compact (Compact), implementation of the Regional Climate Action Plan (RCAP), and a description of recommended next steps. Countywide (RPB)

Background and Justification: In April 2014, Board of County Commissioners directed staff to provide a scorecard on the implementation of the Compact's RCAP. Additionally, in March 2015, the Climate Change & Sustainability Coordinator position was filled to serve as a resource, catalyst and advocate for the County's climate resilience planning and implementation activities and sustainability efforts. The objective of the County's focus on climate change and sustainability issues is to integrate climate adaptation and mitigation considerations into existing decision-making systems and coordinate and communicate those efforts both internally and externally.










Regional Climate Action Plan

- Completed October 2012
- Product of 3-year planning and public process
- Details 110 mitigation & adaptation strategies across 8 planning areas
- Regional effort reflecting contributions of 135+ work group members
- Companion Implementation Guide and subsequent workshops
- Adopted by Palm Beach County in April 2014 – Commission direction to prepare implementation scorecard

- A regional approach intended to inform local efforts
- Not prescriptive, does not capture everything
- Majority of recommendations collaboration through Compact and with other agencies/groups
- Recommended product County specific Resilience Plan
- Our process should inform the recommendations in the next RCAP

- Informs weather related risk mitigation





