I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to adopt: A resolution of the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County, Florida, supporting Amendment 4: *Solar Devices or Renewable Energy Source Devices; Exemption from Certain Taxation and Assessment*, and providing for the transmission of the resolution and an effective date.

Summary: Approval of this item supports the County's state legislative priorities in moving Florida forward in embracing renewable energy, decreasing reliance on fossil fuels, and reducing our collective carbon footprint through an increase solar-energy use with the provided real benefit of providing tax cuts to more properties. <u>Countywide</u> (RPB)

Background and Justification: In September 2016, the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approved the 2016 State Legislative Program which includes priority appropriations and legislative priorities, general appropriations and general issues to support and monitor. This Program is reflective of the County coordinating with other members of the Compact to align legislative priorities supporting the goals of creating resilience for the South Florida region. The following County and Compact state legislative priorities are particularly supportive of the proposed joint resolution:

- SUPPORT rebate programs, tax credits, and other financial incentives that encourage property owners to invest in energy efficiency and renewable energy systems.
- SUPPORT legislation and/or constitutional amendments that will exempt solar photovoltaic systems from commercial property assessments and the tangible personal property tax.

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RESOLUTION NO. 2016-

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY COUNT SUPPORTING AMENDMENT FLORIDA. SOL OR RENEWABLE DEVICES ENERGY SOURCE **EXEMPTION FROM CERTAIN TAXATION** VICES: AND ASSESSMENT, AND PROVIDING FOR TRANSMISSION OF THE RESOLUTION AND THE AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, solar photovoltaic energy offers many potential benefits,
 including lower electricity costs for homeowners, businesses, and governments;
 creation of local jobs and strengthening economic development; reduced
 dependence on imported fuels and pollution-free electricity generation; and

WHEREAS, in 2008 Florida voters approved a constitutional amendment that
 authorized the Florida Legislature to exclude solar or renewable energy
 improvements from residential property appraisals; and

19 WHEREAS, a bipartisan joint resolution, passed unanimously by both the Florida House of Representative and Florida Senate on March 9, 2016, authored by 20 Senator Jeffrey Brandes (R-22), Rep. Lori Berman (D-90), and Rep. Ray Rodrigues 21 (R-76) and supported by the Florida Chamber of Commerce, the Florida Restaurant 22 & Lodging Association, The Nature Conservancy and others, seeks to extend this 23 exemption to nonresidential properties as Amendment 4, entitled "Solar Devices or 24 Renewable Energy Source Devices; Exemption from Certain Taxation and 25 Assessment"; and 26

WHEREAS, Amendment 4 would authorize the Florida Legislature to exempt
 solar and other renewable energy systems from both residential and nonresidential
 property appraisals and from the tangible personal property tax, effective January 1,
 2018, and for the subsequent 20 years; and

WHEREAS, in September 2015, the Palm Beach County Board of County 31 Commissioners approved the 2016 State Legislative Program, which reflects the 32 Compact Counties 2016 State Energy and Climate Legislative Program, 33 and specifically supports "rebate programs, tax credits, and other financial incentives that 34 encourage property owners to invest in energy efficiency and renewable energy 35 systems," and "legislation and/or constitutional amendments that will exempt solar 36 photovoltaic systems from commercial property assessments and the tangible 37 38 personal property tax";

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY
 COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, THAT:

Section 1. The Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners
 supports and endorses Amendment 4 and urges all Palm Beach County and Florida
 voters to vote in favor of the amendment on the August 30, 2016 ballot.
