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Background and Justification: On May 1, 2007, the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) established the Homeless Advisory Board to develop a Ten-Year Plan to End Homelessness in Palm Beach County (Ten-Year Plan). The BCC formally adopted the Ten-Year Plan in September 2008. Development of a Homeless Resource Center is one of the Action Steps of the Ten-Year Plan. On March 20, 2012, the BCC approved the Senator Philip D. Lewis Center concept and funding allocation for its operation. Homeless individuals and families receive a diverse offering of high quality services from three (3) community agencies, assisting clients in ending their homelessness. Services are available to Palm Beach County's homeless adults and families on a 24-hour basis, 365 days per year.
