Summary: Palm Beach County was allocated \$295,183 in Federal FY2015 (County FY2016) as part of the FDLE JAG Formula Grant Program. The JAG Program allows local governments to support a broad range of activities to prevent and control crime based on local needs and conditions. Grant 2016-JAGC-PALM-2-H3-048 was awarded in the amount of \$100,000 to support the Law Enforcement Exchange (LEX) project. GAN 1 and the contract amendment with LEX both extended the grant period one month to October 31, 2016, and revised the narrative, reporting frequency, and budget to move funds from printing to purchase equipment necessary to facilitate training of law enforcement agencies throughout Palm Beach County. The GAN and contract amendment were executed by the County Administrator in accordance with approval granted on March 1, 2016 (R2016-0273) to execute any amendments to this grant and this contract. No County matching funds are required. Countywide (JB)						
Background and Justification: The Countywide LEX Program Director provides overall coordination for the LEX project. The LEX project allows law enforcement agencies throughout the County to communicate and query ongoing criminal investigative information that results in improved public safety. In accordance with County PPM CW-O-051, all delegated grant adjustments and signatures must be submitted by the initiating department as a receive and file agenda item.

Problem Identification

Palm Beach County has over 25 law enforcement jurisdictions which leads to difficulties in data sharing, information sharing, and presents investigative coordination problems. Numerous times data, information and investigations involve similar suspects and crimes unknown to all the participating law enforcement agencies. To address these issues, Palm Beach County initiated the LEX project in 2004. This initial data sharing project has developed into a mature data sharing initiative that is part of the state FLEX program.

Once the data sharing hurdle was passed, the LEX project expanded. This expansion has led to a comprehensive program adopted by all of the Chiefs of Police and the Sheriff's Office in Palm Beach County. This comprehensive program includes:

- -Data sharing
- -An information sharing process through a Bulletin system
- -Five (5) Regional intelligence sharing meetings per month
- -Case de-confliction
- -Crime trends and pattern identification
- -Moving crime information into law enforcement action

To better address the financial requirements of the LEX expansion, the Chiefs of Police and Sheriff's Office in Palm Beach County created a non-profit organization called Palm Beach County Law Enforcement eXchange, Inc. (LEX). The LEX organization was created to establish an efficient and effective technology-enabled law enforcement enterprise system for enhancing the safety, security and quality of life for law enforcement personnel and citizens, under Florida Statute 163.63. The LEX Board of Directors (Chiefs of Police and Sheriff's Office of Palm Beach County) need an executive level position to coordinate the activities of the enhanced LEX program. Prior to the Director position there was no coordination on a countywide, multi-jurisdictional basis for regional intelligence sharing meetings, de-confliction, crime trends and pattern identification, and data sharing and information sharing issues.

Crime and technology to combat crime is rapidly advancing. System security must be continually evolving to stay ahead of these advancements. New data, functionality and security must be added to the LEX enterprise system in response to new crime trends, user requirements and the FBI's CJIS Security Policies. The LEX Countywide Program Director position is needed to facilitate this input and coordinate with the appropriate agency executives and technical staff to ensure the proper communication and timely implementation of the priorities established.

This application is a continuation of previous grant funding of the LEX project. As we meet and train officers countywide on LEX, additional data sources and new functionality is being identified for optimizing and enhancing the data sharing system.

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One critical data source identified is the Palm Beach County Intelligence Crime Bulletin data. This data is critical for officers to quickly view and identify suspects involved in criminal activity throughout Palm Beach County. New functionality such as a global search feature, have allowed officers to query data in agencies Records Management Systems, Bulletins and Regional Intelligence Meeting Reports simultaneously.

This capability is extremely valuable and is being piloted as a proof of concept before being integrated into the LEX system. Once implemented, the LEX Countywide Program Director will need to update the training program, syllabuses and documentation accordingly. New policies for dealing with mobile devices are forthcoming and will need to be incorporated into the LEX system, policies and training.

Additional relationships will need to be cultivated with border counties, other regions, and State agencies such as the Florida Highway Patrol, Florida Fish and Wildlife, Florida Department of Law Enforcement and the States Attorney's offices. We wish to now include sharing our data with our Federal partners including the Secret Service, FBI, U.S. Customs, DEA, ICE and Customs and Border Patrol. The LEX model will be introduced as the vehicle for a streamlined approach to law enforcement data and information sharing.

Project Summary (Scope of Work)

The countywide LEX consultant, or Project Director, was established by the non-profit LEX Board of Directors on June 2, 2014 with SIMON Subgrant # 2014-JAGC-PALM-1-E5-214 and the approval of the State of Florida Data Sharing Steering Committee. This function/project has been wholly funded through federal grant funds. Palm Beach County will use grant funds to will continue to provide overall Countywide coordination for the LEX Program. The position will continue to evaluate priorities with the organization and technical staff to stay abreast of security, technology and system user requirements. Additionally, the position will continue to oversee and present the training to three specific user groups, Road Patrol, Investigations, and Analysts. Continuous training methods will be implemented including outreach to the Police Academy offering for the LEX model to be taught to recruit officers.

The Program Director position will continue to assess and share the crime trends and patterns throughout Palm Beach County. The position will oversee and assist with the continued deconfliction of cases throughout Palm Beach County and the Palm Beach Regional Fusion Center. This position will reach out to other data sharing entities to demonstrate the LEX model and integrate the LEX system with other data sharing systems at the regional, State, and Federal level.

The LEX Program continues to be the catalyst of countywide criminal justice interaction and data sharing. LEX System security must be continually evolving to stay ahead of these advancements.

The Program Director has solidified the communications and participation in the Regional Intelligence meetings on a monthly basis. Part of the communication assurances is a new training program that simplified the new LEX 3.0 training that began Countywide in April of 2015.

Additional objectives and measures for the LEX Program Director position will be as follows:

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- -Continue to oversee and communicate with the agencies uploading data into LEX
- -Document the increased number of Officers Trained in LEX
- -Pre and post testing scores, identifying a clear countywide understanding of the system
- -Document the Number of new users to LEX
- -Document the Number of new users to FINDER
- -Document the Number of Queries run
- -Document the Number of bulletins and RIM reports entered
- -Documentation and recognition of accomplishments with the LEX Data Sharing system
- -Author and present the Advanced LEX /FINDER Training Outline and program
- -Direct and solicit input from users groups on programming changes to the system.
- -Identify and solicit additional funding sources for long term sustainability of the program
- -Oversee and identify a five-year plan for capital necessities
- -Monitor and maintain LEX Performance Timeline
- -Continue to work on getting all County agencies that are able to upload RMS data into the LEX system
- -Continue to update the agencies in new technology and upgrades in the LEX system.
- -Begin expanding LEX by developing relationships and MOU's with outside agencies and vendors with a direct interest in Palm Beach County

This position will also monitor efforts and tasks working with local agency representatives from Broward, Miami-Dade, Palm Beach and Monroe Counties, vendors, the Southeast Florida Fusion Center, the Broward Sheriff's Office and the Florida Department of Law Enforcement. The LEX Countywide Program Director will also coordinate with these representatives in maintaining and updating leadership on information sharing supported by the LEX project; and recommends policies, rules and guidelines for the efficient and effective use of resources. This position will also ensure that all LEX established project criteria and deliverables are met. As needed, the LEX Countywide Program Director will verify and report on implementation. The Director seeks to serve as a member of the statewide Data Sharing Consortium.

Documentation will consist of timesheets and paystubs to support costs. Deliverables and minimum performance will be accounted for through supervisor attestations certifying the specific deliverables and minimum performance for services were received.

The Project Director's activities and minimum performance will be overseen and managed by the Palm Beach County Criminal Justice Commission. All materials, reports, documents, etc. created as a result of this grant must adhere to state and federal requirements and be available for review during grant monitoring.

A copy of all material, curriculum, policies or guidance developed for distribution, dissemination communication or training purposes must be provided to FDLE for pre-approval in accordance with the standard conditions.

The deliverable for this agreement is the quarterly performance of the tasks and activities described in the scope of work in accordance with the local agency contractual agreement and/or position description. Palm Beach County will request reimbursement of allowable costs identified in Section 4, pages 1-3 on a quarterly basis.

AMENDMENT 001 TO AND REINSTATEMENT OF CONTRACT BETWEEN PALM BEACH COUNTY AND PALM BEACH COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT EXCHANGE, INCORPORATED FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

THIS AMENDMENT 001 TO AND REINSTATEMENT OF CONTRACT (the "First Amendment") is made and entered into by and between Palm Beach County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida ("County") and Palm Beach County Law Enforcement Exchange, Incorporated (LEX), a not-for-profit corporation authorized to do business in the State of Florida, (herein referred to as the "Service Provider") whose Federal ID No. is 32-0276271.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, County and Service Provider entered into a Contract dated March 1, 2016 (R2016-0273) wherein County agreed to provide \$100,000 of Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program funds to support the Criminal Justice Commission's existing Countywide LEX Program Director to provide overall coordination for the LEX project. The LEX project allows agencies throughout the county to communicate on all levels and to enhance public safety in Palm Beach County through interagency collaboration; and

WHEREAS, the original term of the Contract ended September 30, 2016, but Service Provider requested a one-month extension; and

WHEREAS, County and Service Provider desire to reinstate the Contract and extend the term for one month, requiring an amendment to the Budget referenced in Article 3 (Payments to the Service Provider), said Budget marked as Exhibit "B" in the Original Contract, authorizing adjustments in the line item budget of up to 10% of the total contract price; and

WHEREAS, the County and the Service Provider acknowledge and agree that during the period from September 30, 2016, until the Effective Date of this First Amendment, the parties were and are bound by the terms of the Contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference. Terms not defined herein shall have the same meaning as ascribed to them in the Contract.
- 2. Article 2 (Schedule) of the Original Contract is hereby modified to provide that the Term of the Contract shall expire October 31, 2016, unless further extended by written amendment to this Contract.
- 3. Article 1 (Services), referencing the Service Provider's responsibilities and the term of the Original Contract as referenced in Exhibit "A" to the Original Contract is revised, as reflected Exhibit "AA-01" attached hereto. Exhibit "A" to the Original Contract will be replaced in its entirety by Exhibit "AA-01" attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- 4. Exhibit "B" in the Original Contract will be replaced in its entirety by Exhibit "BB-01" attached hereto, and made a part hereof.

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Except as modified by this First Amendment, the Contract remains unmodified and in full force and effect in accordance with the terms thereof, and the County and the Service Provider hereby ratify, confirm, and adopt the Contract as amended hereby.

This First Amendment is expressly contingent upon the approval of the County and shall become effective only when signed by all parties and approved by, or on behalf of by a person with delegated authority, the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners (the "Effective Date of the First Amendment").

Scope of Work - Contract between Palm Beach County and Palm Beach County Law Enforcement eXchange, Inc. Effective Date: October 1, 2015 - October 31, 2016

Background

The Palm Beach County Law Enforcement eXchange, Inc. (LEX) is an organization created to establish an efficient and effective technology-enabled law enforcement enterprise system for enhancing the safety, security and quality of life for law enforcement personnel and citizens. The LEX organization is comprised of criminal justice agencies sharing information through a formalized network. There are over 25 law enforcement jurisdictions in Palm Beach County. Due to the vast size, the LEX project was initiated to allow agencies throughout the county to communicate at the street and case level. It is designed to create inter-agency collaboration in an effort to enhance public safety in Palm Beach County. This sharing of information enables different agencies to work together and have immediate access to case information.

The LEX Countywide Program Director position established by the non-profit LEX Board of Directors will continue to provide overall Countywide coordination for the LEX Program. The position will continue to evaluate priorities with the organization and technical staff to stay abreast of security, technology and system user requirements. Additionally, the position will continue to oversee and present the training to three specific user groups, Road Patrol, Investigations and Analysts. Continuous training methods will be implemented including outreach to the Police Academy offering for the LEX model to be taught to Police Academy recruit officers.

The Program Director position will continue to assess and share the crime trends and patterns throughout Palm Beach County. The position will oversee and assist with the continued de-confliction of cases throughout Palm Beach County and the Palm Beach Regional Fusion Center. This position will reach out to other data sharing entities to demonstrate the LEX model and integrate the LEX system with other data sharing systems at the regional, State and Federal level.

Service Provider shall:

- Continue to oversee and communicate with the agencies uploading data into LEX
- Document the increased number of Officers Trained in LEX
- Pre and post testing scores, identifying a clear countywide understanding of the system
- Document the Number of new users to LEX
- Document the Number of new users to FINDER
- Document the Number of Queries run
- Document the Number of bulletins and RIM reports entered
- Documentation and recognition of accomplishments with the LEX Data Sharing system
- Author and present the Advanced LEX /FINDER Training Outline and program
- Direct and solicit input from users groups on programming changes to the system.
- Identify and solicit additional funding for the program
- Oversee and identify a five-year plan for capital necessities
- Monitor and maintain LEX Performance Timeline
- Continue to work on getting all County agencies that are able to upload RMS data into the LEX system
- Continue to update the agencies in new technology and upgrades in the LEX system.
- Begin expanding LEX by developing relationships and MOU's with outside agencies and vendors with a direct interest in Palm Beach County


