### I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

# Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to:

**A) approve** Subaward Amendment. 1, No. 9920160083 with the RANDCorporation, for the period May 13, 2016, through August 31, 2017, in an amount not to exceed \$117,461, to continue improving health outcomes for persons living with HIV Spectrum Disease; and

**B)** approve Budget Amendment of \$117,461, in the Ryan White Care Program fund to establish FY 2017 budget for grant award.

**Summary**: On March 1, 2016, the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) ratified the Ryan White Part A, Data Integration Grant Application (R2016-0239) with the RAND Corporation for the maximum cumulative amount of \$317,365. On August 16, 2016, the BCC ratified the first of three (3) Subaward Agreements. This is the second of the agreements which represents an accumulative amount of \$200,411. The Addressing HIV Care Project is a collaboration between Palm Beach County Community Services Department and the City of West Palm Beach's Department of Housing and Community Development. The funding integrates data management systems between the Ryan White Part A and Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) programs. The funds improve the delivery of medical and housing services, improve health outcomes, coordinate service delivery and quality management through improved data infrastructure for homeless HIV-positive clients. **No County funds are required.** (Ryan White Program) <u>Countywide</u> (HH)

**Background and Justification**: The Department of Community Services' Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program Part A HIV Emergency Relief Grant Program will improve the coordination of services for the HIV-positive homeless population by coordinating data systems and service planning with the HOPWA program.

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#### Attachment 2.1 Additional Terms & Condition from Prime Award

- 1. A conference is defined as a meeting, retreat, seminar, symposium, workshop or event whose primary purpose is the dissemination of technical information beyond the nonfederal entity and is necessary and reasonable for successful performance under the Federal award. Allowable conference costs paid by the recipient as a sponsor or host of the conference may include rental of facilities, speakers' fees, costs of meals and refreshments, local transportation, and other items incidental to such conferences unless further restricted by the terms and conditions of the Federal award. As needed, the costs of identifying, but not providing, locally available dependent care resources are allowable. Conference hosts/sponsors must exercise discretion and judgment in ensuring that conference costs are appropriate, necessary and managed in a manner that minimizes costs to the Federal award.
- 2. Recipients must meet the requirements of the HHS regulations to protect human subjects from research risks as specified in the Code of Federal Regulations, Title 45 Public Welfare, Part 46 Protection of Human Subjects (45 CFR 46), available online at <u>http://www.hhs.gov/ohrp/humansubjects/guidance/45cfr46.html</u>. Recipients must submit and obtain documentation of Institution Review Board (IRB) approval, if applicable, on all multisite evaluation protocols and data collection instruments. Prior to their expiration, the recipient must submit documentation from that IRB, which indicate the project has undergone an annual review and complies with all IRB requirements.
- 3. The recipient is required to establish and maintain a process for protecting client confidentiality throughout the project period. Client confidentiality requirements apply to all phases of the project.
- 4. RWHAP funds may not be used to make cash payments to intended recipients of services. This prohibition includes cash incentives and cash intended as payment for RWHAP services. Where direct provision of the service is not possible or effective, store gift cards, vouchers, coupons, or tickets that can be exchanged for a specific service or commodity (e.g., food or transportation) must be used. Store gift cards that can be redeemed at one merchant or an affiliated group of merchants for specific goods or services that further the goals and objectives of the RWHAP are also allowable as incentives for eligible program participants. Recipients are advised to administer voucher and store gift cards programs in a manner which assures that they cannot be exchanged for cash or used for anything other than the allowable goods or services, and that systems are in place to account for disbursed vouchers and store gift cards. Note: General use prepaid cards are considered "cash equivalent" and are therefore unallowable. Such cards generally bear the logo of a payment network, such as Visa, MasterCard, or American Express, and are accepted by any merchant that accepts those credit or debit cards as payment. Gift cards that are cobranded with the logo of a payment network and the logo of a merchant or affiliated group of merchants are general use prepaid cards, not store gift cards, and therefore are also unallowable.
- 5. Recipients must follow the guidance in all applicable HIV/AIDS Bureau Policy Notices and Program Letters to ensure compliance with programmatic requirements. See <u>http://hab.hrsa.gov/manageyourgrant/policiesletters.ht.nl</u>.
- 6. No funds will be used to fund AIDS programs, or to develop materials, designed to promote or encourage, directly, intravenous drug use or sexual activity, whether homosexual or heterosexual.
