## I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

**Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve:** Supplement No. 1 (Supplement) with AE Engineering, Inc. (AEE) to Project Contract in the amount of \$1,587,922.22, for construction engineering and inspection (CEI) services for the bridge rehabilitation of Camino Real Road/Boca Club Bridge over the Intracoastal Waterway (Project).

SUMMARY: On September 7, 2016, AEE was selected through the consultant selection process to provide CEI services for the Camino Real Bridge over the Intracoastal Waterway project. It was then decided that it would be advantageous to divide the CEI services contract into two phases due to the complexities of the project. Phase 1, the original contract, was for a constructability/bidability review of the plans to identify any potential problems prior to bidding the project for construction. Under the County's Purchasing Code and Countywide PPM CWF-050, the County Engineer had the authority to execute the original contract, due to the value. The contract was later received and filed by the Board in R-2017-0222. The amount expended for Phase 1 was \$23,732.18. No problems with the design plans were identified. Under PPM CWF-050, the Board needs to approve this supplement, since it exceeds the authority of the County Engineer and the Contract Review Committee. Approval of this supplement for Phase 2 will allow AEE to provide the remaining CEI services needed for the project. These services include contractor oversight and project administration throughout the duration of the construction phase. The Small Business Enterprise (SBE) goal for all contracts is 15%. AEE has committed to 3% SBE participation and has proposed 3.09% SBE participation for this supplement. No firms committed to Palm Beach County's (County) SBE goal. The SBE participation for Phase 1 was 0%. AEE is a Palm Beach County based company. District 4 (LBH)

**Background and Justification:** On September 7, 2016, the Consultant's Competitive Negotiations Act Selection Committee selected AEE and, in accordance with PPM No. CW-O-048, the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) was notified of the selection on September 8, 2016. The County now desires AEE to provide Phase 2 of the CEI services necessary for the project. The fee, as detailed in Exhibit "A" of the attached contract, has been negotiated as just and reasonable compensation as follows:



## CONSTRUCTION ENGINEERING AND INSPECTION SERVICES

### 1. PURPOSE:

The scope of services describes and defines the Construction Engineering and Inspection (CEI) Services which are required for contract administration, inspection and materials sampling for the construction project listed below.

### 2. <u>SCOPE:</u>

The Consultant shall be responsible for providing services as defined herein, applicable Palm Beach County Manuals, procedure and referenced Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) Documents.

The Project for which the services are required are:

Bridge Rehabilitation of Camino Real/Boca Club Bridge over Intercostal Waterway; Bridge No: 934408; County Project No: 2003501

The Consultant will provide CEI Services that include contractor oversight and project administration throughout the duration of the construction phase. Specifically, these services are comprised of, but not limited to, the following activities:

- Provide contract administration and advocacy on behalf of the county.
- Act as liaison between the County, Contractor, and Engineer of Record.
- Provide certified inspection and documentation of the contractor's work.
- Process monthly pay estimates/perform quantities verification.
- Expeditiously handle requests for information and change orders.
- Remove/minimize restrictions, where practical, to the contractor's operations.
- Review/accept the contractor's schedules and updates.
- Suggest methods to reduce construction duration.
- Provide public information coordination services throughout construction.
- Provide field inspectors to monitor quality assurance/quality control plan procedures and adherence.
- Monitor construction sequencing, methods and phased implementation.
- Monitor and provide recommendation to minimize critical path activities (i.e. utility relocation, maintenance of traffic/temporary pavement, coordinate lane closures and detours with the contractor, demolition, site work/mitigation).

### 3. LENGTH OF SERVICES:

The Consultant Services for this Construction Contract shall begin upon written notification to proceed by the County.

The Consultant's Senior Project Engineer will track the execution of the Construction Contract such that the Consultant is given timely authorization to begin work. While no personnel shall be assigned until written notification by the County has been issued, the Consultant shall be ready to assign personnel within two weeks of notification. For the duration of the project, coordinate closely with the County and Contractor to minimize rescheduling of Consultant activities due to construction delays or changes in scheduling of Contractor activities.

## 4. ITEMS TO BE FURNISHED BY THE COUNTY TO THE CONSULTANT:

The County will furnish the following Construction Contract documents for the project after the NTP is issued. These documents may be provided in either paper or electronic format.

- 1. Construction Plans
- 2. Specification Package
- 3. Copy of the Executed Construction Contract, and
- 4. Utility Agency's Approved Material List (if applicable).
- 5. Design Computation Book (s)
- 6. Standard forms and letters required by the County for construction contract management and contract administration that are not accessible through the County's website.

## 5. ITEMS FURNISHED BY THE CONSULTANT:

### 5.1 <u>Documents</u>

All documents, directives, procedures and standard forms are available through Palm Beach County Internet Website, Florida Department of Transportation Internet website, or the Florida Department of Transportation Maps and Publication Office shall be obtained by the Consultant from the applicable website.

### 5.2 Office Automation:

Consultant shall provide all software and hardware necessary to efficiently and effectively carry out the responsibilities under this scope of services. Provide each management and inspection staff with a laptop computer (or tablet) using the compatible software for word processing and spreadsheets, also connection using a mobile broadband connection at the jobsite.

All informational, contractual and other business required for this project will be through a system of paperless electronic means. When the specifications require a written submission of documentation, such documents must be submitted electronically.

All documents requiring a signature must be executed electronically by both parties in accordance with Chapter 668, Florida Statutes, and have the same force and effect as a written signature. The County will provide a web-based collaboration site to facilitate the electronic document exchange. All persons requiring access to the

collaboration site shall be identified during the preconstruction conference. All persons that normally sign paper documents, and will be using the site, must acquire digital signature certificates.

Ownership and possession of computer equipment and related software, which is provided by the Consultant, shall remain at all times with the Consultant.

The Consultant shall retain responsibility for risk of loss or damage to said equipment during performance of this scope of services.

### 5.3 Field Office:

The County Construction Project Manager's/Consultant/ CEI's Field Offices/Trailers will be included in the Construction Contract as per day pay items. The Contractor shall obtain all necessary permits and certificates of occupancy for setting up the field office and making utility connections to city, county, or local facilities, and the cost of such permits shall be included in the pay items for construction field offices. The field office will provide sufficient room and furnishings to effectively carry out their responsibilities of the Construction Contract. The Field office shall be approved by the County.

Field Office expenses will be compensated in accordance with the construction contract. Routine expenses, other than that are the responsibility of the contractor, for operation of the office, such as stamps, postage cost, telephone services will be responsibility of consultant and included as reimbursable.

### 5.4 <u>Vehicles:</u>

Vehicles will be equipped with appropriate safety equipment and must be able to effectively carry out requirements of this Agreement. Vehicles shall have the name and phone number of the consulting firm visibly displayed on both sides of the vehicle.

### 5.5 Field Equipment:

The Consultant will supply inspection, and testing equipment essential to perform services under this scope of services; such equipment includes non-consumable and non-expendable items, which are needed for CEI projects.

Hard hats shall have the name of the consulting firm visibly displayed.

Equipment described herein and expendable materials under this scope of services will remain the property of the Consultant and shall be removed at completion of the work.

Consultants handling of nuclear density gauges shall be in compliance with their license.

Retain responsibility for risk of loss or damage to said equipment during performance of this scope of services. Field office equipment shall be maintained and in operational condition at all times.

### 5.6 Licensing for Equipment Operations:

The Consultant will be responsible for obtaining the proper licenses for equipment and personnel operating equipment when licenses are required. The consultant shall make the license and supporting documents available for verification by the County, upon request.

Radioactive Materials License for use of Surface Moisture Density Gauges shall be obtained through the State of Florida Department of Health.

Administrative duties relating to invoice approval requests, personnel approval requests, time extension request, and supplemental amendments requests shall be reviewed and approved by the County Construction Project Manager.

### 6. LIAISON RESPONSIBILITY OF THE CONSULTANT:

The Consultant shall keep the County Construction Project Manager informed of all significant activities, decisions, correspondence, reports, and other communications related to its responsibilities under this scope of service. The Consultant shall seek input from the County Construction Project Manager in order for the County Construction Project Manager to oversee the Consultant's performance.

Administrative items relating to Invoice Approval, Personnel Approval, Time Extensions, and Supplemental Amendments to the County Construction Project Manager for review and approval.

### 7. REQUIREMENTS:

### 7.1 <u>General:</u>

It shall be the responsibility of the Consultant to administer, monitor, and inspect the Construction Contract such that the project is constructed in reasonable conformity with the plans, specifications, and special provisions for the Construction Contract.

The Consultant shall observe, monitor and inspect the Contractor's work to determine the progress and quality of work, identify discrepancies, report significant discrepancies to the County, and direct the Contractor to correct such observed discrepancies, in compliance with the contract.

If the Consultant identifies a condition that will require an amendment to the Construction Contract, the Consultant Senior Project Engineer will communicate the need to the County Construction Project Manager for an approval in concept. Once an approval in concept is received, the Consultant shall prepare and submit the amendment request, and all accompanying documentation to the County's Construction Project Manager for approval and further processing. The content and format of the amendment or change order request and accompanying documentation shall be in accordance with the instruction and

format to be approved by the County.

The Consultant shall advise the County of any significant omissions, substitutions, defects, and deficiencies noted in the work of the Contractor and the corrective action that has been directed to be performed by the Contractor. Work provided by the Consultant shall not relieve the contractor of responsibility for the satisfactory performance of the Construction Contract.

### 7.2 <u>Survey Control:</u>

Survey control shall be the responsibility of the Contractor, and is not part of the scope of services. The Consultant shall perform verification survey, as needed.

### 7.3 <u>On-site Inspection:</u>

The Consultant shall monitor the Contractor's on-site construction activities and inspect materials entering into the work in accordance with the plans, specifications, and special provisions for the Construction Contract to determine that the projects are constructed in reasonable conformity with such documents. The Consultant will make necessary arrangements to monitor all off-site activities and fabrication that require monitoring at the recommendation of the Consultant and the direction of the County. The Consultant shall keep detailed accurate records of the Contractor's daily operations and of significant events that affect the work.

### 7.4 Shop Inspection:

The Consultant shall perform shop inspection as required throughout the construction duration. The Consultant is responsible to establish a local Fabrication Inspection team to perform inspections as the fabrication site (location to be determined).

## 7.5 Engineering Services:

Services shall include maintaining the required level of surveillance of Contractor activities, interpreting plans, specifications, and special provisions for the Construction Contract. Maintain complete, accurate records of all activities and events relating to the project and properly document all project changes. The following services shall be performed:

(1) Verify that the Contractor is conducting inspections, preparing reports and monitoring all storm water pollution prevention measures associated with the project. For each project that requires the use of the NPDES General Permit, provide at least one inspector who has successfully completed the "Florida Stormwater, Erosion, and Sedimentation Control Training and Certification Program for Inspectors and Contractors". The Consultant's inspector will be familiar with the requirements set forth in the FEDERAL REGISTER, Vol. 57,No. 187, Friday, September 5, 1992, pages 4412 to 4435 "Final NPDES General Permits for Storm Water

Discharges from Construction Sites" and the Department's guidelines.

- (2) Analyze the Contractor's schedule(s) (i.e. baseline(s), revised baseline(s), updates, as-built, etc.) for compliance with the contract documents. Elements including, but not limited to, completeness, logic, durations, activity, flow, milestone dates, concurrency, resource allotment, and delays will be reviewed. Verify the schedule conforms with the construction phasing and MOT sequences, including all contract modifications. Provide a written review of the schedule identifying significant omissions, improbable or unreasonable activity durations, errors in logic, and any other concerns.
- (3) Review Contractor's Two Week Look Ahead schedule as submitted by the Contractor and confirm compliance with approved CPM Construction Progress Schedule.
- (4) Review and Analyze the Contractor's CPM Progress Schedule as submitted by the Contractor and conform compliance with approved CPM Construction Progress Schedule.
- (5) Analyze problems that arise on a project and proposals submitted by the Contractor; work to resolve such issues, and process the necessary paperwork.
- (6) Monitor, inspect and document utility relocation self-performed by the contractor for conformance with Utility Agency's Standards and the Utility Agency's Approved Materials List. Document utility construction progress to be performed by Utility Agencies. Facilitate coordination and communication between Utility Agency's representatives, County's staff and Contractors executing the work. Identify potential utility conflicts and assist in the resolution of utility issues including County and local government owned facilities.
- (7) Produce reports, verify quantity calculations and field measure for payment purposes as needed to prevent delays in Contractor operations and to facilitate prompt processing of such information in order for the County to make timely payment to the Contractor.
- (8) Prepare and submit to the County's Construction Project Manager monthly, a Construction Status Reporting System (CSRS) report, in a format to be provided by the County.
- (9) Consultant shall be responsible for evaluating and monitoring the Contractors' Quality Control (QC) Plan submitted by the Contractor for control, testing and acceptance of materials in accordance with the Specification. The Consultant shall review the initial QC Plan and make recommendations to the County to either accept the Contractors submitted QC Plan or provide written comments to the contractor that lists the deficiencies so the Contractor may make additional and/or corrections to the plan to facilitate the re-submittal of an acceptable QC Plan. The Contractor is responsible for providing a QC Plan acceptable

to the County and the Consultant. After the contractor has obtained acceptance of the QC Plan from the County and the Consultant, the Consultant shall monitor the Contractor's compliance with the QC Plan. If at any time the Consultant determines that the Contractor is not in compliance with the accepted QC Plan, the Consultant shall notify the Contractor is writing of the noted deficiencies. Should the Contractor fail to take immediate corrective action, the Consultant shall disapprove the Contractors' QC Plan. The Consultant shall then provide a written statement to the Contractor that describes what actions are necessary for reinstatement of the QC Plan.

- (10) Video tape the pre-construction conditions throughout the project limits. Provide a digital photo log or video of project activities, with heavy emphasis on potential claim items/issues and on areas of real/potential public controversy.
- (11) Provide a digital camera for photographic documentation of preconstruction state and of noteworthy incidents or events during construction.

These photographs will be filed and maintained on the Consultant's computer using a digital photo management system.

Photographs shall be taken the day prior to the start of construction and continue as needed throughout the project, and to be provided to Palm Beach County on a monthly basis. Photographs shall be taken the days of Conditional, Partial and Final Acceptance.

## 8. SERVICES OUTLINE PER TASK

### 8.1 <u>Pre-Construction</u>

### **Description:**

- A. Attend the preconstruction meeting record, create and distribute the meeting minutes
- B. Distribute Palm Beach County specific contract requirements and any EEO or data collections required to begin the construction Phase

#### Deliverable:

Monthly report and form package (Include copies of all reports and logs generated, documents received from the contractor forms that may be applicable or the work done during the preceding month, meeting minutes and comments and approvals of any reviewed documents.)

**Performance Measure**: Deliverables will be reviewed by the Project Manager to confirm they are complete, accurate, and timely.

## 8.2 <u>Construction</u>

Description:

This report will provide the Consultant Sr. Project Engineer accounting of the additional agreement calendar days allowed to date, an estimate of the additional calendar days anticipated to be added to the original schedule time, an estimate of the Agreement completion date, and an estimate of the Consultant funds expiration date per the Agreement schedule for the prime Consultant and for each subconsultant.
- (2) When the Consultant identifies a condition that will require a Supplement to the Agreement, the Consultant Sr. Project Engineer will communicate this need to the County's Construction Project Manager for an approved concept. Once received, the Consultant shall prepare and submit the Supplement and all accompanying documentation to the County's Construction Project Manager for approval and further processing.
- (3) The Consultant Sr. Project Engineer for the project is responsible for performing follow-up activities to determine the status of each Amendment Request submitted to the County.

The following items are not included as part of this Agreement, but may be required by the County to supplement the Consultant services under this Agreement.

- A. Assist in preparing for arbitration hearings or litigation that occurs during the Agreement time in connection with the construction project covered by this Agreement.
- B. Provide qualified engineering witnesses and exhibits for arbitration hearings or litigation in connection with the Agreement.
- C. Provide inspection services in addition to those provided for in this Agreement.
- D. Provide services determined necessary for the successful completion and closure of the Construction Contract.

## 14. POST CONSTRUCTION CLAIMS REVIEW:

In the event the Contractor submits a claim for additional compensation and/or time after the Consultant has completed this Agreement, analyze the claim, engage in negotiations leading to settlement of the claim, and prepare and process the required documentation to close out the claim. Compensation for such services will be negotiated and effected through a Supplemental Amendment to this Agreement or a new agreement, in accordance with the hourly rates defined herein.
