I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to: A) approve the conceptual master plan for North County District Park; and **B) authorize** staff to negotiate a long-term Interlocal Agreement with the City of Palm Beach Gardens (City) for the funding, construction, operation and maintenance of an active park on approximately 50 acres identified as Phase One on the master plan.

Summary: Parks and Recreation Department staff worked closely with representatives of Palm Beach Gardens and adjacent municipalities to develop a conceptual master plan for the County owned 80.6 acre North County District Park property. The master plan was developed as a two phase project and takes into consideration the recreational amenities requested by the City as well as expected future recreational needs for residents within the north county area. The plan was approved by the City on May 4, 2017. The Parks and Recreation Department has requested and the City desires to enter into an Interlocal Agreement for the development, operation, and maintenance of the 50 acres designated as Phase One. Staff is seeking authorization to negotiate a long term Interlocal Agreement with the City which will delineate the project scope and elements associated with the construction, management and operation of Phase One. The County has received support for this project from the Town of Jupiter, Village of North Palm Beach, Town of Lake Park, City of West Palm Beach, Village of Tequesta, Town of Juno Beach, Town of Palm Beach Shores, Town of Jupiter Inlet Colony, Palm Beach North Chamber of Commerce and Chamber of Commerce of the Palm Beaches. <u>District 1 (AH)</u>

Background and Policy Issues: The City desires to enter into a long term Interlocal Agreement for 50 acres of County owned property to develop a district park. The City will utilize up to \$11.2 million in funding for this project. In February, 2017, the City Council passed a \$30 million bond which will be repaid over the next ten years using proceeds from the Local Government One-Cent Infrastructure Surtax Capital Improvement Fund. A resolution was approved by the City on May 4, 2017, accepting the overall conceptual master plan and authorizing the City Manager to negotiate and execute an Interlocal Agreement with the County. 
Background and Policy Issues: (Continued on Page 3)

The Parks and Recreation Department is supportive of an Interlocal Agreement for this property provided that no preference is given for programs based on residency, the fields are made available for Sports Commission events and a Park Advisory Committee comprised of representatives from all areas of northern Palm Beach County is established.

The conceptual master plan develops the property in two phases, with Phase One featuring regulation multi-purpose fields, short sided soccer fields, a playground, parking, a restroom, retention pond, maintenance compound and hiking trails located within the 12.7-acre conservation easement. Phase Two, which will not be included in the Interlocal Agreement, includes an indoor sports facility, additional multi-purpose fields, picnic facilities, a playground, restroom, group pavilions, retention pond, and associated parking.

The Palm Beach Gardens Parks and Recreation Department provides recreational programming for almost 10,000 participants annually, with 35% of those participants residing outside of the city limits. In addition, they host Palm Beach Gardens Youth Athletic Association (PBGYAA) events, and approximately 41% of the participants of this organization reside outside of the city limits.

The City would like to begin construction later this year after the Interlocal Agreement is fully executed and hopes to open the park to the public in the fall of 2018. The County's involvement with Palm Beach Gardens on this project dates back to 2000. A Brief History of Palm Beach Gardens District Park is attached.

WHEREAS, the City Council deems approval of this Resolution to be in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the residents and citizens of the City of Palm Beach Gardens and the public at large.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PALM BEACH GARDENS, FLORIDA, that:

SECTION 1. The foregoing recitals are hereby affirmed and ratified.

SECTION 2. The City Council of the City of Palm Beach Gardens hereby approves Palm Beach County's North District Park Conceptual Master Plan – 2017, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A"; authorizes the City Manager to enter into negotiations for an interlocal agreement with Palm Beach County to lease the park property in order to construct, operate, and maintain the North County District Park; and pursuant to Section 2-293. Appropriations. of the City Code of Ordinances, authorizes the City Manager to expend any necessary funds from the One-Cent Sales Surtax Capital Improvement Fund, up to the amount of \$11,200,000.00, to fund all cost associated with construction of the County-owned parkland, in substantial conformity with the conceptual master plan attached as Exhibit "A". The City Council further authorizes the City Manager to take all actions and execute all documents necessary to construct the identified area, which includes, but is not limited to, funding, staffing, procuring professional services, and/or any other related activities.

Palm Beach Gardens District Park Property Brief History

- The 82 acre district park property was acquired at the request of the City from the MacArthur Foundation in 2000 for \$3,129,003 to be used for active and passive recreation.
- Land Purchase was funded from the 1999, \$25 Million Recreational and Cultural General Obligation Bond for recreational projects in Commission District 1.
- The Property was acquired to help meet minimum Level of Service for District Parks in North County and future needs for active recreation, i.e., multipurpose and baseball fields.
- The Property was leased to the City of Palm Beach Gardens on April 18, 2000 (R2000-560) to "design, construct, operate and maintain a public park", according to the Conceptual Master Plan attached to the lease.
- In 2003 a City General Obligation Bond referendum that included development funds for the park was defeated by Palm Beach Gardens' residents, leaving the City unable to fulfill its obligations to develop a district park. An attempt by the city to use the property for only passive park purposes was unacceptable to the County since it ignored the larger active recreational needs in the area for which the property was purchased.
- On July 11, 2006, in Regular Agenda Item 7F-1, BCC reviewed request by the City to terminate lease agreement and directed staff to schedule a workshop to review park levels of service and the impact that developing this property would have on the Department's Capital Program that included Palm Beach Gardens District Park development in its later years.
- On January 23, 2007, Workshop Item (2007-2016) BCC directed staff to proceed with termination of lease agreement with City and reviewed the Department's 10 Year Capital Improvement Program.
- The Lease Agreement was terminated by BCC on August 21, 2007 (R2007-1367).
- In 2008 the City of Palm Beach Gardens expressed an interest in purchasing the 82 acres to use exclusively for passive recreational uses.
- On December 21, 2010, a Conservation Easement was placed on 12.7 acres of the property as an upland preserve area for the Scripps Florida Phase I / Briger Tract DRI/PCP (R2010-2141) Add-On Agenda Item 5.A.2.
