I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to adopt: a Resolution requesting that the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) review funding applications and support funding for Palm Beach County's shoreline restoration projects within FDEP's Fiscal Year 2018/2019 Beach Management Funding Assistance Program.

Summary: The County is requesting the FDEP appropriate \$22,100,502 for eight (8) shoreline restoration projects in Fiscal Year 2018/2019. If the State Legislature approves funding for all of the projects, the County's matching share would be \$19,732,284. \$825,000 is requested for the Coral Cove Park Dune Restoration Project, \$7,200,000 for Segment 1 of the North County Comprehensive Shore Protection Project (NCCSPP), \$83,293 for Segment 2 of the NCCSPP, \$7,337,500 for Segment 3 of the NCCSPP, \$647,109 for the Singer Island Shore Protection Project, \$5,625,000 for the Southern Palm Beach Island Comprehensive Shore Stabilization Project, \$180,000 for the South Lake Worth Management Plan, and \$202,600 for the Ocean Ridge Shore Protection Project. Background and Justification: The FDEP is accepting project funding applications for FY 2018/2019. If the projects are found to be eligible, the FDEP will include them as part of its submittal to the Governor and Cabinet as part of the FDEP's Fixed Capital Outlay Budget Request to the State Legislature. The County's matching share for each project is dependent on federal funding eligibility and municipal (interlocal) funding agreements and is funded by the Tourist Development Bed Tax and interest accrued.

| Recommended Sources of Funds/Summary of Fiscal Impact: There is no fiscal impact until state funding is appropriated and a project agreement is executed. Potential fiscal impact to the County is \$19,732,284 over approximately three years. The municipal, state and federal share of each project's cost would be allocated to the County on a reimbursement basis. If state funds were to be appropriated for the projects and County funding is found to be insufficient to match the State-funded project, other funding sources could be considered, such as short-term borrowing, securing bonds, or delaying the design and construction of projects already funded. Existing interlocal agreements with the City of Riviera Beach (R2014-1832) and Town of South Palm Beach (R2007-0796) will provide a 20% cost-share for the Singer Island Shore Protection Project and Southern Palm Beach Comprehensive Shoreline Stabilization Project, respectively. | | | | | | |

RESOLUTION OF THE **BOARD** OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, REQUESTING THE STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT **PROTECTION ENVIRONMENTAL** APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS WITHIN THE BEACH MANAGEMENT FUNDING ASSISTANCE PROGRAM FOR 2018/2019; **PROVIDING** FISCAL YEAR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County (the "Board") is committed to a program of coastal restoration and preservation; and

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County wishes to effectively address beach erosion through construction of shore protection projects and restoration of its dunes; and

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County has a need to perform engineering design, environmental studies and monitoring of shore protection projects; and

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County has developed and funded a Shore Protection Program to act as the local sponsor for coastal projects; and

WHEREAS, the projects listed below are consistent with the coastal element of the Palm Beach County's Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County has the ability and intention of providing the local cost share of eligible coastal projects using a combination of tourist development taxes, interest and reserve funds; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection's Beach Management Funding Assistance Program is preparing their Beach Erosion Control Long-Range Budget Plan to develop the Fiscal Year 2018/2019 prioritized list of beach erosion control projects; and

WHEREAS, the public work projects listed below are eligible within the State of Florida's Beach Erosion Control Assistance Program under the provisions of Section 161.101, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County is requesting the Florida Department of Environmental Projection support and appropriate funding for shoreline restoration projects within its Fiscal Year 2018/2019 Beach Management Funding Assistance Program for the following County projects: \$825,000 for the Coral Cove Park Dune Restoration Project, \$7,200,000 for Segment I of the North County Comprehensive Shore Protection Project (NCCSPP), \$83,293 for Segment II of the

NCCSPP, \$7,337,500 for Segment III of the NCCSPP, \$647,109 for the Singer Island Shore Protection Project, \$5,625,000 for the Southern Palm Beach Island Comprehensive Shore Stabilization Project, \$180,000 for the South Lake Worth Management Plan, and \$202,600 for the Ocean Ridge Shore Protection Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1: The foregoing recitals are hereby adopted and ratified and incorporated herein by reference.


