### I. <u>EXECUTIVE BRIEF</u>

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to: A) Accept on behalf of the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office a Purchase Order and Scope of Services between the Florida Department of Juvenile Justice and the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office for funding in the amount of \$17,477 for the period October 1, 2017 through Juste 30, 2018; and (B) Approve a budget amendment of \$17,477 in the Sheriff's Grants Fund.

**Summary:** The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO) received a purchase order from the Florida Department of Juvenile Justice, to provide electronic monitoring, tracking, and alert response services for Prolific Juvenile Offenders (PJO). This revenue source will support expenses associated with the supervision of this DJJ juvenile population, including contractual monitoring services, supplies and overtime. There is **no match requirement** associated with this award. <u>Countywide</u> (LDC)

**Background and Justification:** The Florida Department of Juvenile Justice received funding from the State of Florida for the electronic monitoring, tracking, and alert response services for Prolific Juvenile Offenders (PJO). The Department will be providing reimbursement for these services to local law enforcement offices throughout Florida. The Palm Beach County Sheriff's agreed to provide these services for this juvenile offender population in Palm Beach County.

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### PURCHASE ORDER Scope of Services Alert Response Services for Prolific Juvenile Offenders (PJO's)

#### I. General Description

Α.

General Description of Services

The Provider shall be available twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week, three-hundred and sixty-five (365) days a year to respond to electronic monitoring sytem alerts on Prolific Juvenile Offenders (PJO)'s. Services shall be provided daily and the Provider shall be reimbursed on the daily rate identified on the Purchase Order.

B. <u>Services to be Provided:</u>

Alert Response Services to be provided to Prolific Juvenile Offenders and shall include prompt response to system alerts on PJOs as specified herein.

Authority for Specific Contracted Program Services

Section 985.01(1)(b) Florida Statutes, authorizes the Department of Juvenile Justice to provide for the health and well-being of youth in the state's care and to provide for the care, safety, and protection of children in an environment that fosters healthy social, emotional, intellectual, and physical development; to ensure secure and safe custody; and to promote the health and well-being of all children under the state's care.

C. Major Goal(s) of the Service

The intended goal of the Department is to ensure any Prolific Juvenile Offender who causes an electronic monitoring alert to occur will be responded to in accordance with the Laws of Florida, Chapter 2017-164 (HB 7059)

II. Youth to be Served

A. <u>General Description of Youth to be Served</u>:

The Provider shall respond to alerts on Prolific Juvenile Offenders (PJOs) placed on active electronic monitoring, within the jurisdiction of the Provider's law enforcement agency or other agencies within the county area..

B. Youth Eligibility

The PJO's are determined by Court Order.

C. Youth Referral/Determination

The Department will identify for the Provider all Prolific Juvenile Offenders, unless identified by the Provider and place on the Provider's own Electronic Monitoring system.

III. Services to be Provided

A.

Provider Responsibilities:

- 1. Upon Request, the Provider's staff shall be provided access to the Department's Contracted EM System (operated by BI, Inc.) which is the primary supervision tool to manage and monitor PJO activities and and ensure compliance with the rules and conditions of release on home detention.
- It is the option of the Provider to utilize their County's contracted Electronic Monitoring equipment for identified PJO's.
- 3. The Provider shall respond to PJO alerts identified through the Department's Contracted EM system from BI, Inc.
- OR
  The Provider shall respond to alerts called in to the Provider's identify contact. This is method of alert notification is for Providers who do not have access to the Department Contracted EM system from BI, Inc.
- Alerts shall be responded to as soon as possible (deemed by the Provider) but not later than the next calendar day.
- 6. Example of alert types include: tracker low battery, no position fix available, tamper proximity tracker alert, and inclusion zone leave alert.

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#### B. <u>Department Responsibilities:</u>

- The Department shall be responsible for installation and removal of EM equipment on PJOs or other Department youth placed on the Department's EM equipment through BI., Inc.
- 2. The Department will have no responsibility of installing or programming EM equipment provided through the Provider's own Law Enforcement Agency.
  - The Department will provide training of the Provider's staff in the Department's Contracted EM (BI, Inc.) system for the purposes identifying and responding to alerts and other necessary functionality of the identified system. This shall be coordinated by Sonny Peacock. <u>Ruel.Peacock@dij.state.fl.us</u>.
- C. <u>Staffing/</u>

<u>Staffing/Personnel</u> The Provider and all personnel provided under this Contract, whether performance is as a Provider, subcontractor, or any employee, agent or representative of the Provider or subcontractor, shall continually maintain all licenses, protocols, and certifications that are necessary and appropriate or required by the Department or another local, state or federal agency for the services to be performed or for the position held. All such personnel shall renew licenses or certifications pursuant to applicable law or rule.

Staffing Levels:

- a. The Provider shall provide a sufficient level of Certified Law Enforcement staff to ensure that alert responses to PJO's are carried out in accordance with the Provider's Responsibilities..
- 2. <u>Staffing Qualifications:</u>

All staff shall possess adequate education and training to perform the duties for which they are assigned and meet all applicable licensing or certification requirements for their respective disciplines.

- Provider Staff Training:
  - a. Law Enforcement Officers and other staff engaged in conducting actual monitoring and tracking as specified herein are not considered to be direct care staff under this Contract, and are not required for any specific direct care staff training.
  - b. The Department of Juvenile Justice's is committed to identify human trafficking victims within the care of the Department, refer them to appropriate community or Department service providers and report any disclosure of human trafficking incidents to the Florida Abuse Hotline. The Provider shall ensure staff are instructed to report any disclosure of human trafficking incidents to the Florida Abuse Hotline.

#### IV. DELIVERABLES

The deliverable under this Purchase Order is a Day of Alert Response Services. Services shall be available 24/7/365.

#### V. <u>INVOICING:</u>

A. The Provider shall submit an invoice (email acceptable) on either monthly or quarterly based on the number of days in the invoice period.

- B. The Provider shall not receive payment for services rendered prior to the execution date or after the termination date of this Contract.
- C. Invoices for amounts due under this Contract shall be submitted in detail sufficient for a proper pre-audit and post-audit thereof.
