I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to authorize: the County Administrator, or her designee, to authorize the donation of a surplus vehicle in an amount not to exceed \$7,500 each fiscal year to the Sheriff's Office in support of the County's Countywide Community Revitalization Program (CCRT) Program.

Summary: On August 20, 2002, and in response to a request from the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO), the Board approved the annual donation of a surplus vehicle in the amount not to exceed \$6,000 in support of the CCRT. This item increases the value of the annual donation from \$6,000 to \$7,500. From 2002-2015, 15 vehicles have been donated to PBSO enabling them to assist in a variety of activities including; 1) carrying equipment for painting of, and debris removal from, residences of the elderly and needy, 2) removing graffiti from County owned property, 3) cleaning of properties which have found to house illegal activities in residential neighborhoods, and 4) hauling equipment to clear overgrown fields and houses in foreclosure as a crime deterrent. In 2016, PBSO was unable to identify a surplus vehicle meeting their needs for the CCRT, with a value of less than \$6,000 and as such CCRT has requested that the limit of the annual donation be increased. FDO/Fleet Management suggested the new \$7,500 limit after researching PBSO's donation history and the current values of those type vehicles. The purpose of the \$7,500 limit will provide a cap to the loss revenues to Fleet Management and allow the donations to be processed in a more timely manner. All donations are subject to PBSO assuming maintenance responsibility. (Fleet Management) Countywide (LDC)

Background and Justification: PBSO Community Policing Units have built a strong relationship with the numerous communities located in CCRT areas throughout the County. The Units routinely conduct community projects. PBSO needs these vehicles to continue to undertake these projects. PBSO has the resources to ensure and equip the vehicles and has committed to maintain same through its motor pool department. Donations will be subject to the same conditions as this donation ad no vehicles which require a special license or training to operate will be donated. All donations will be processed through Fixed Assets Division of OFMB pursuant to its PPMs governing the donation of equipment assets. Staff shall provide the Board with email notification of future donations.

L EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends-motion to:

A) Approve a donation of two surplus vehicles (1993 Dbdge Passenger Van J4665 and 1994 GMC 4x4 SUV K6422) to the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office on behalf of the CCRT

B) Authorize the County Administrator, or his designed, to authorize the donation according to the adopted Fixed Assets PPM, up to \$6,000 in surplus property each subsequent fiscal year to the Sheriff's Office in support of the CCRT Program.

Summary: The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO) has requested that these vehicles be donated in order to support PBSO's effort in the CCRT. These vehicles have been declared surplus by Fleet Management and together have a value of \$10,000. These two vehicles are to be used for neighborhood clean-ups, patrolling of wooded areas and transporting various materials used in CCRT efforts. The 15 passenger van will be used to to West County. All costs associated with maintenance and the operation of the donated vehicles will be borne by PBSO. In August 2001, the County denated a vehicle and it is tracters, etc.) to support CCRT activities, As such, Staff is requesting permission to donate, without further BCC approval, up to \$6,000 in surplus vehicles and equipment (mowers, sole purpose. This will provide a cap to the loss revenues to Fleet Management and allow the assuming maintenance responsibility. (FDO Admin) Countwide (AP)

Background and Justification: The Sheriff's Office Community Policing Units have built a strong relationship with the numerous communities located in CCRT areas throughout the County. The units conduct several community projects on a monthly basis, including the removal of trash from abandoned properties, the removal of vagrant camps, the cleaning of properties which have been found to house illegal activities in residential neighborhoods, and the adoption of state highways. The Sheriff's Office needs these vehicles to continue to undertake these projects. The Sheriff's Office has the resources to insure and equip the vehicles and has committed to maintain same through its motor pool department.

Future denations will be subject to the same conditions as this donation and no vehicles which require a special license or training to operate will be donated. Staff shall provide the Board with notification of future donations and their use.
