



Background and Justification: These contracts were last bid in 2014 and the original list of sixteen (16) contractors that were prequalified to provide general construction services associated with repairs, improvements and renovations to County properties has been reduced to eight (8). During 2017, the pre-qualification process was re-opened and eleven (11) Contractors, who met the established criteria, were added to the list of the remaining eight (8) contractors already prequalified for this contract. Since then, three contractors have decided not to continue. Work is awarded as work orders on a lump-sum, competitively quoted basis among the pool of pre-qualified Minor Construction contractors. The original terms were for one (1) year and allowed for four (4) additional one (1) year renewals. This will be the third renewal. It is the consensus of Facilities Development and Operations that these sixteen contractors have successfully provided the services required by the County in a timely manner. They are in good standing and wish to continue to provide services.
