Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to: A) receive and file two (2) Grant Adjustment Notices (GANs) from the Federal Fiscal Year 2016 (County FY17) Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program grant 2017-JAGC-PALM-1-F9-015 for GAN 1 to extend the grant period from September 30, 2017 to December 31, 2017, revise the budget and the scope of work and GAN 2 to change the project director; and **B)** receive and file one (1) GAN from the Federal Fiscal Year 2016 (County FY17) FDLE JAG Program 2017-JAGC-PALM-4-F9-226 to change the project director.

Summary: The JAG Program allows local governments to support a range of activities to prevent and control crime based on local needs and conditions. Palm Beach County was allocated \$333,395 in Federal FY2016 as part of the FDLE JAG Program. The grants were approved to support the Department of Public Safety's Adult Reentry Program and the Criminal Justice Commission's (CJC) Law Enforcement Exchange (LEX) project, and the new Frequent Users Systems Engagement (FUSE) Project. Grant 2017-JAGC-PALM-1-F9-F14 was awarded in the amount of \$44,000 to the Law Enforcement Exchange (LEX) Program and has been expended and closed out. Grant 2017-JAGC-PALM-1-F9-015 was awarded in the amount of \$233,395 to the Adult Reentry Program. GAN 1 for this grant provides for an extension from September 30, 2017 to December 31, 2017 to fully expend the funds, a modification of the budget and scope of work to provide transitional housing for homeless ex-offenders. GAN 2 of this grant changes the project director due to a resignation and reassignment of CJC staff. Grant 2017-JAGC-PALM-4-F9-226 was awarded in the amount of \$56,000 to the FUSE Project. GAN 1 of this grant also changes the project director due to a resignation and reassignment to another CJC staff person. These three (3) GANs have been fully executed on behalf of the Board of County Commissioners by the Executive Director of the Criminal Justice Commission, Kristina Henson, in accordance with R2016-1029 and R2017-1741. No County matching funds are required for this grant. Countywide (DC)

Background and Justification: The County's Reentry Program, created by the CJC and now operating under the County's Public Safety Department, provides for effective and coordinated services to those returning from incarceration. The CJC's new FUSE Project is part of the MacArthur Safety and Justice Challenge and is intended to break the cycle of incarceration and homelessness for frequent low-level defendants with behavioral health challenges. FUSE brings together cross-system agencies in criminal justice, behavioral health, homeless services, and medical care to develop solutions that serve this population with the goal of stabilizing individuals in permanent supportive housing with wraparound services. In accordance with County PPM CW-0-051, all delegated grant adjustments must be submitted by the initiating department as a receive and file agenda item.

The Palm Beach County Reentry Program is modifying the program budget to provide transitional housing for homeless ex-offenders for up to one year where they will receive wrap-around social services to assist in their reintegration back into society. Palm Beach County will sub-award with a provider to provide transitional housing for ex-offenders. Eligible ex-offenders will receive up to one year of transition housing assistance where they will receive wrap-around social service to assist in their integration back into society.

Research shows that helping people released from prisons or jails find safe places to live is critical to reducing homelessness and recidivism and to ensuring stable housing situations for children, families, and communities. Research indicates that people who fail to find stable housing in the community are more likely to recidivate than those who do. According to a qualitative study by the Vera Institute of Justice, people released from prison and jail to parole who entered homeless shelters in New York City were seven times more likely to abscond during the first month after release than those who had some form of housing.

In addition, Palm Beach County is requesting to sub-ward grant funds to local providers (City of Riviera Beach, Gulfstream Goodwill, and The Lord's Place) for case management and supervisor services for at risk reentry clients upon release from a state correctional facility. The City of Riviera Beach is a local government and The Lord's Place and Gulfstream Goodwill are non-profit agencies.

In addition, Palm Beach County is requesting to extend the grant end date to 12/31/17.

Problem Identification

Echoing many of the problems found nationally with reentry, Palm Beach County's released prisoners face numerous challenges that ultimately aid in their return to criminal activity, re arrest and re-incarceration. These challenges include unemployment, lack of housing, substance abuse, mental health problems and strained family relationships. To further compound these challenges, institutional programs aimed at assisting inmates in dealing with these issues have been sharply reduced in recent years due to budget reductions. Research shows that unemployment has a profound impact on recidivism rates. Statistics show that even before incarceration, adult inmates demonstrate weak or non-existent ties to the workforce (33% of inmates are unemployed in the month leading up to their arrests, compared to 10% unemployment in the general population). The lack of appropriate housing and the inability to access substance abuse treatment and mental health care significantly reduce positive outcomes. The "what works" literature shows that programs that provide intensive substance abuse and mental health treatment during incarceration, combined with aftercare, have proven effective in reducing recidivism; however, accessing these services continues to prove challenging for the target population. In recent years, reentry in Palm Beach County has received increased attention as public policy leaders are searching for innovative ways of decreasing cost of incarceration while maintaining public safety. As a result, the Criminal Justice Commission's Reentry Task Force has developed a five-year plan and implemented various projects that work with adult and juvenile ex-offenders. This is a continuation grant from last year (2016-JAGC-PALM-1-H3-211).

Project Summary (Scope of Work)

Palm Beach County is requesting to sub-ward grant funds to local providers (City of Riviera Beach, Gulfstream Goodwill, and The Lord's Place) for case management and supervisor services for at risk reentry clients upon release from a state correctional facility. The City of Riviera Beach is a local government and The Lord's Place and Gulfstream Goodwill are non-profit agencies.


Additionally, Palm Beach County will sub-award with a provider to provide transitional housing for ex-offenders. Eligible ex-offenders will receive up to one year of transition housing assistance where they will receive wrap-around social service to assist in their integration back into society. The minimum performance measures that prompt a payment for a bed day include an invoice from the provider backed up by a client log indicating that the client was housed in the facility.

By sub-warding federal funds, this agreement generates a tiered sub-recipient relationship between Palm Beach County and each provider, resulting in Palm Beach County being designated as a non-federal pass-through entity defined by 2 CFR 200.74. As a result, Palm Beach County must comply with all provisions of 2 CFR Part 200 and the OJP Financial Guide regarding pass-through entities. Palm Beach County

must provide supporting documentation for their compliance with these federal requirements during monitoring.

Palm Beach County must assure each provider meets federal eligibility requirements as a subrecipient for federal grant funding, including registration in the System for Award Management (sam.gov) and compliance with all Omnibus and Safe Streets Act statutory provisions, including registration and compliance with the DOJ Office of Civil Rights requirements.

Palm Beach County will provide a copy of each sub-award agreement with providers. The agreements must comply with Florida Statute 215.97 for contract and grant, including quantifiable deliverables, minimum performance, and financial consequences to ensure the provider complies with all applicable regulations of Part 200 of the Uniform Requirements, including but not limited to: financial management system requirements, internal controls, cost principles, allowable costs, indirect costs, and audit requirements. Palm Beach County will ensure providers are compliant through a documented sub-recipient monitoring process.

Palm Beach County will report financial and programmatic information from each provider on a quarterly basis to FDLE. Documentation on Palm Beach County's responsibilities as a pass-through entity will be provided at the time of monitoring, including but not limited to copies of completed risk, assessments, monitoring reports, and financial supporting documentation for each sub-recipient.

Each sub-recipient (City of Riviera Beach, Gulfstream Goodwill, and The Lord's Place) will be responsible for the following activities:

1. Reentry Case Management is delivered to ex-offenders to support their ability to develop and complete a transition plan. Case Management aids in the provision of services to assist the ex-offender in developing skills to better manage the reentry process as well as cope with other life stressors or needs in order to reduce recidivism. Case Management can relate to Assessment Services, Motivational Interviewing, Cognitive Behavioral Services, Substance Abuse Treatment, Mental Health Treatment, Family Reunification Services, Pro-Social Activities, Employment Services, Education Services, Mentoring Services, Housing Services, Identification Services, Financial Education or Health Services.

2. Provide ex-offenders with assistance obtaining health care and public assistance benefits as well as driver's licenses and identification assistance.

3. Conduct risk assessments on clients to determine their level of eligibility and their minimum required hours of case management services from the program.

low risk: not eligible

- moderate risk: 100 hours of services

- moderate-high risk: 150 hours of services


- high risk: 200+ hours of service

Each subrecipient will be responsible for tracking the hours of services per client, and documenting the service hours and/or clients served under the federal award. Providers not fulfilling obligations to the clients will not be reimbursed.

Each provider will be responsible for submitting invoices and records substantiating

the services provided to Palm Beach County, and will be made available for review during grant monitoring or upon request. Providers will also provide additional documentation, such as reporting or sharing of client-based program data, including but not limited to: number of clients served, number of clients completing service plans, etc. All providers will maintain and produce documentation related to facility licensing and monitoring through the Department of Children and Familles to provide treatment and behavioral health services.

Palm beach County, and each provider using funds for compensation of personnel services, must ensure records and documentation comply with 2 CFR 200.430, including but not limited to: pay policies, internal controls, cost allocation of program activities, time and effort reporting, etc. Each subaward was procured via a competitive solicitation for services. Documentation relating to these procurements are available upon request.

Palm Beach County will request reimbursement of allowable costs identified in Section 4, pages 1 -3 on a quarterly basis.



The Palm Beach County, Criminal Justice Commission (CJC), will use grant funds to reimburse local providers (City of Riviera Beach, Gulfstream Goodwill, and The Lord's Place) for case management services of eligible ex-offenders within Palm Beach County. Contractual Services Subrecipient Relationships

1. City of Riviera Beach: Grant funds will be used to support two (2) case managers to perform the following activities:

1A) Case Manager 2 (approx. \$19/hour) Salary: \$36,497 FICA/Medicare: 7.65% Benefits: \$843/month Total: \$49,400 Grant funding: \$49,400 (100% of the position's salary)

1B) Case Manager 3 (approx. \$16.85/hour) Salary: \$30,667 FICA/Medicare: 7.65% Benefits: \$639/month Total: \$40,680 Grant funding: \$26,245 (64.52% of the position's salary)

The City of Riviera Beach will be responsible for covering any cost above the grant funded amount of \$75,645.

This position manages a variety of direct client services relative to the intervention and education of ex-offenders returning to the community as part of the Justice Service Center, a part of the Youth Violence Prevention Project.

2. Gulfstream Goodwill: Grant funds will be used to support one (1) Project Director, one (1) Program Coordinator, and one (1) case manager to perform the following activities

2A) Project Director (approx. \$29.5/hour) Salary: \$61,360 FICA/Medicare: 7.65% Benefits: \$248/month Total: \$69,028 Grant funding: \$14,805 (21.45% of the position's salary)

The Project Director will focus on building programs and services to offer to returning citizens and youth at risk. This would also include implementing and monitoring justice programs within communities and Youth Empowerment Centers, building relationships with persons from local Government officials and Justice Service's arena to include, but not limited to the Criminal Justice Commission, Public Defender's and State Attorney's offices, local Sheriff's Office, Department of Correction and Probation as well as City and County Commissioners and Mayor's offices. The Program Director must also work closely with the Department of Juvenile Justice local and state

and the Directors of local Youth Empowerment Centers; perform functions to design, develop, implement, and administer the policies and procedures for Re-Entry programs and contribute to the mission of Goodwill by maximizing the opportunities for participants with criminal histories and other barriers to become more independent, making decisions based on conclusions for which there is little precedent.

2B) Program Coordinator (approx. \$17.83/hour) Salary: \$37,079 FICA/Medicare: 7.65% Benefits: \$430/month Total: \$45,072 Grant funding: \$8,186 (18.16% of the position's salary)

The Program Coordinator will manage the adult reentry program plan and implement the program's policies and procedures to ensure the program's integrity; and contribute to the mission of Goodwill by advocating for the participants and maximizing participant independence and community integration, guided by precedent and working within the limits of established policies

2C) Case Manager 2 (approx. \$21.53/hour) Salary: \$44,782 FICA/Medicare: 7.65% Benefits: \$305/month Total: \$51,857 Grant funding: \$34,299 (66.14% of the position's salary)

The Case Manager will develop and monitor the implementation of a Personal Development Plan (PDP) with participants in the Residential Program, provide guidance and support to participants to meet program objectives; and contribute to the mission of Goodwill by advocating for the participants and maximizing opportunities for persons with disabilities and other barriers to become more independent, guided by precedent and working within the limits of established policies.

Gulfstream Goodwill will be responsible for covering any cost above the grant funded amount of \$57,290.
