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I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to: (A) Approve the filing of the FY2017 Section 5307 (CFDA 20.507) electronic Grant Application with the Federal Transit Administration for capital funds allocated to Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners (BCC) in the amount of \$16,158,582. This is a cost reimbursable agreement and has an anticipated start date of October 1, 2017 and an anticipated end date of April 10, 2022;

- (B) Approve the filing of Standard Form LLL Disclosure of Lobbying Activities;
- **(C) Authorize** the County Administrator or designee to electronically submit and execute on behalf of the BCC, and to transmit electronically the BCC's approval of the Grant Application, award, and the resulting grant agreement;
- **(D) Approve an upward** Budget Amendment of \$519,364 in Palm Tran's Grants Fund 1341 to reconcile the adopted budget to the grant award.

Summary: The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) distributes Section 5307 funds to provide public transportation capital, operating assistance and for public transportation-related planning. The FY2017 Grant will fund items necessary for the continued operations of the Palm Tran system including: \$4,000,000 to replace buses that have reached their useful life; \$161,586 for the one-percent project security requirement; \$187,200 for the Transit Asset Management Plan; \$216,342 for project management; \$2,771,555 for facility rehabilitation and South County Expansion; \$1,182,681 for Farebox Technology; and \$7,639,218 for preventive maintenance. This application has a match requirement of \$4,039,646 or 20% of the total project cost. The source of the matching funds are Toll Revenue Credits provided by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT). Execution of the FTA award represents the County's legal affirmation to abide by FTA and other federal requirements as described in The Master Agreement FTA MA (24) dated October 1, 2017, approved by the Board on April 10, 2018 under item 3-AA1. The grant also requires execution of the Disclosure of Lobbying Activities, Form LLL. **No County funds are required.** Countywide (DR)

Background and Justification: The Master Agreement is incorporated by reference and made part of each FTA grant award, and amendment thereto. The Standard Form LLL is an FTA requirement when lobbying services are procured with non-federal funds. Palm Tran's 2018 budget included this grant in the amount of \$15,639,218, the budget amendment of \$519,364 reconciles the approved budget to the actual grant award.



Project Description

Palm Tran is expanding the South County (SC) facility located at 100 N Congress Ave, Delray Beach, FL 33445; to accommodate Palm Tran's growth. Both North and South County facilities are operating beyond capacity. On November 5, 2013, Palm Beach County acquired land adjacent to the SC facility; on March 1, 2016 the contract for architectural and engineering services for the SC expansion was awarded to Colome and Associates Inc., a DBE Company.

The southeast bay of the maintenance garage is currently used to service

supervisor/relief vehicles and houses a car lift for this purpose. A new car-only bay will be constructed to free up the existing bay for bus service.

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PROJECT ADMINISTRATOR

NATURE OF WORK

This is professional, administrative and technical work in a wide variety of building projects.

An employee in a position allocated to this class is responsible for planning, managing and coordinating a large number of projects from inception to completion. Work involves extensive coordination of project activities with building users, consultants, regulatory agencies and contractors. Employee will act as the owner's representative for all activities related to the facility program, including municipal relations, permitting assistance and traditional project management activities (i.e., budget and schedule monitoring, user coordination, program and plan review, contract monitoring, contract change negotiations, field review, occupancy transition and project close-out). Work requires independent judgment and decision making which directly affects all aspects of construction projects and related funding. Work is reviewed through conferences, reports and evaluation or results obtained.

EXAMPLES OF WORK

Manages project design professionals, construction managers and general contractors. Coordinates with user agencies the design, development, programming and construction phases associated with projects.

Administers the architectural project development activities of the Capital Improvements Division.

Acts as contract administrator; approves final bid packages.

Directs professional and clerical staff involved in the preparation of construction documents for new buildings, renovations or building additions.

Conducts periodic "on site" review of construction projects to ensure quality conforms to specifications and construction schedules are maintained.

Performs constructability and value analysis reviews. May supervise other county employees. Performs related work as required.

PROJECT ADMINISTRATOR

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES

Extensive knowledge of the principles and practices associated with building design and construction projects.

Extensive knowledge of the principles of project management.

Thorough knowledge of modern developments and trends in the field of building construction.

Thorough knowledge of scheduling programs and theories and ability to estimate and review schedule impact.

Knowledge of computer software applications including word processing, spreadsheet and project management/scheduling. Ability to utilize advanced computer software packages for project management.

Ability to read, interpret and evaluate structural, electrical, plumbing and mechanical details of building construction plans to assure compliance with code requirements and to recognize deviations from such plans.

Ability to assure compliance with federal requirements as it relates to procurement and construction.

Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with consultants, developers, contractors, regulatory agencies, users and the public.

Ability to interpret, research and apply regulatory material such as building code requirements.

Contract administration principles including those related to scope, schedule, and payments. State and federal contracting requirements including Federal Transit Administration.

Principles and procedures of record keeping as they apply to federally funded projects.

Experience in the planning, funding, implementation and management of capital projects, with a focus in Department of Transportation (DOT) or Federal Transit Administration (FTA) funded projects
