I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to adopt: a resolution authorizing the conveyance and transfer of title of a reserve fleet utility vehicle (Asset 10142561) to Fraternal Order of Police, Florida State Lodge, District Four, Inc., pursuant to Section 125.38, Florida Statutes, contingent upon receipt of \$10.00 consideration and a duly executed Acceptance of Fire Rescue Vehicle(s) and/or Equipment form; providing for an effective date.

Summary: The Fraternal Order of Police, Florida State Lodge, District Four, Inc. (FOP) has a Disaster Relief Component to aid first responders after catastrophic or emergency events, such as bringing food and water to first responders during disaster recovery. The FOP has requested the County convey and transfer a vehicle to the FOP for use in aiding first responders for such disaster relief. The County has available a reserve fleet utility vehicle that is not needed for County purposes and has de minimis or no useful value to the Fire-Rescue Municipal Service Taxing Unit. The FOP would refurbish the truck to meet its needs to respond to catastrophic or emergency events. The FOP will assist Palm Beach County in recovery efforts at no cost to the County. Countywide (SB)

Background and Justification: The FOP was founded in 1915, and is the nation's largest police organization. The Florida State Lodge provides specific services for the state, its members and their communities. District Four encompasses Palm Beach, Martin, St. Lucie, Indian River and Okeechobee counties. The FOP has a Disaster Relief Component to aid first responders after catastrophic emergency events.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE CONVEYANCE AND TRANSFER OF TITLE OF A CERTAIN VEHICLE TO FRATERNAL ORDER OF POLICE, FLORIDA STATE LODGE, DISTRICT FOUR, INC., PURSUANT TO SECTION 125.38, FLORIDA STATUTES; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Fraternal Order of Police, Florida State Lodge, District Four, Inc. (hereinafter "FOP"), is a Florida not-for-profit corporation that has a Disaster Relief Component, which aids first responders after catastrophic or emergency events, such as providing food and water during recovery efforts; and

WHEREAS, FOP desires and requests that the County convey to it a certain 2003 utility vehicle owned by County (Asset 10142561) (VIN 1FDWF37P73EB99385) (hereinafter the "Vehicle") for the purpose of providing aid to on-duty first responders after catastrophic or emergency events; and

WHEREAS, the FOP will provide such assistance to the County in recovery efforts at no cost to the County; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County (hereinafter the "Board") is satisfied that the Vehicle is required for said use and is not needed for County purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Board is further satisfied that the Vehicle has de minimis or no useful value to the Fire-Rescue Municipal Service Taxing Unit (hereinafter the "Fire-Rescue MSTU"); and that FOP's intended use of the Vehicle will benefit the public interest within the Fire-Rescue MSTU.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

<u>Section 1.</u> The foregoing recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference. <u>Section 2.</u> The Board hereby conveys the Vehicle to FOP, and authorizes the transfer of title thereof, pursuant to Section 125.38, Florida Statutes, upon the receipt of \$10.00 consideration from FOP and the attached Acceptance of Fire-Rescue Vehicle form duly executed by FOP.

Section 3. The provisions of this Resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption hereof.

THE VEHICLE(S) AND/OR EQUIPMENT TRANSFERRED TO THE FOP BY THE COUNTY, AND ACCEPTED BY THE FOP HEREUNDER, ARE TRANSFERRED, CONVEYED AND ACCEPTED "AS IS". NO WARRANTIES, WHETHER EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, ARE GIVEN. ALL IMPLIED WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY AND/OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE ARE EXPRESSLY EXCLUDED.

FOP acknowledges and agrees that it has fully inspected the vehicles and/or equipment identified above and is accepting said vehicle(s) and/or equipment in complete reliance upon FOP's inspection of said vehicles and/or equipment and upon FOP's own knowledge and expertise in evaluating the condition of the said vehicles and/or equipment and FOP's intended use of said vehicles and/or equipment. FOP acknowledges and agrees that in accepting said vehicles and/or equipment, FOP has not, and shall not, rely upon any statement, advice, information or representation made by the County or any of its employees, officers or agents. No oral or written statement, advice, information or representation from County or any of its employees, officers or agents, whether given before or after delivery of the vehicle(s) and/or equipment, shall create a warranty, and FOP acknowledges and agrees that it has not, and shall not, rely on any such advice, information or representation.

FOP understands and agrees that the County is not a seller engaged in the business of selling vehicles and/or equipment such as those identified above. FOP shall be solely responsible for inspecting the vehicle(s) and/or equipment identified above for any defects, either latent or patent, and for refurbishing and repairing said vehicle(s) and/or equipment as necessary prior to their use and operation, and that the County shall have no obligation or liability for such. FOP acknowledges that the County has warned FOP, and FOP specifically understands, that the vehicle(s) and/or equipment identified above may not be suitable or safe for FOP's intended use and operation until inspected, repaired and refurbished by FOP, and FOP agrees to do so prior to allowing the use and/or operation of said vehicle(s) and/or equipment. FOP shall be solely responsible for continuing maintenance of the transferred vehicle(s) and/or equipment, and the County shall have no obligation or liability for such.

Hold Harmless and Indemnification. To the extent permitted by law, FOP shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the County, including its employees, officers, and agents, against any actions, claims or damages arising out of FOP's use, possession, operation, maintenance or ownership of any vehicle(s) and/or equipment transferred to, and accepted by, FOP. The foregoing shall not constitute a waiver of sovereign immunity beyond the limits set forth in Section 768.28, Florida Statutes.

Chief Collins Palm Beach County Fire Rescue

Chief Collins, please let me introduce myself. I am David Bernhardt 2nd Vice-President of the Florida State Lodge of Fraternal Order of Police which represents 25, 000 members and Vice Chairman of District 4. The district encompasses Palm Beach, Martin, St Luice, Indian River and Okeechobee counties. The FOP has several missions from representing its members, and partnerships with Easter Seals and Special Olympics. The FOP also has a Disaster Relief Component to aid first responders after catastrophic or emergency events. As first responders are working around the clock before and after major events, the FOP directs its efforts in two ways. Resources to feed on duty responders and check on the homes of first responders, as they cannot leave their assignments. This action alleviates much of the stress endured by first responders. District 4 does not have the resources to purchase a heavy vehicle, which could assist greatly in achieving our disaster relief goals. With this in mind, the FOP would benefit from a donation of an out of service EMS/Rescue vehicle.

The FOP would refurbish the truck to meets its needs to respond to catastrophic or emergency events. The FOP would work with Palm Beach County in recovery efforts at no cost to the county. If first responder's essentials were being met, the FOP would assist with any other recovery efforts. As an example Solid Waste, and Palm Beach County Utilities might need to feed its employees, and the FOP could assist in this effort. If it is a local event, with the district having disaster resources it would easier to draw assistance from other districts or state lodges for assistance, i.e. the FOP responded to the Keys and Naples after Hurricane Irma with food and water for first responders. For that one event the National, State and District FOP cost were over \$30,000, which they incurred.

In conclusion The FOP would be another arm of disaster recovery the county could utilize to aid its first responders, hence a benefit to the citizens of Palm Beach County. Partnerships are a key to good government and in times of despair the more boots on the ground the better. The initial cost of donation will be miniscule compared to the return the county would receive over the next several years.
