

The term for Seat No. 8 has expired and the term for Seat No. 9 has expired. Mr. Ash and Mr. Ecclestone meet the membership requirements and are willing to serve another term. No other nominations were received. The diversity of the current AAAB is as follows: Caucasian – 9. The gender ratio (female:male) is 0-9. Both nominees are Caucasian male. **Countywide (AH)**

Background and Justification: The AAAB, created December 18, 1984, is charged with the duty of giving recommendations and advice to the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) concerning the planning, development, construction, reconstruction, operation and financial viability of the airports and aviation activities coming within the purview of the BCC. 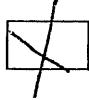



E. Llwyd Ecclestone

E. Llwyd Ecclestone has been a driving force in Palm Beach County's development and philanthropic community for almost 55 years. He is a visionary whose contributions to South Florida's growth and prosperity are well known.

A graduate of the Taft School with a business degree from Wayne State University, Mr. Ecclestone began his construction career in Michigan. In 1962, he developed and built the first condominium project in Michigan, which was also the first integrated apartment project in that state and one of the first in the United States. Ecclestone then ventured into building custom homes and other specialized commercial projects.

In 1965, Mr. Ecclestone relocated to Florida to complete the development of Lost Tree Village. In partnership with his father, he was instrumental in the growth and development of the 450-acre private golfing community on the ocean in northern Palm Beach County. During this time, he also developed and built Old Port Cove and various other office and commercial building projects in addition to many custom homes. In 1976, Mr. Ecclestone embarked on one of his most notable achievements -- building and developing PGA National in Palm Beach Gardens Florida including the Administrative and Golfing Headquarters for PGA of America. This spectacular community has 5,300 homes, five PGA golf courses, the 339-room PGA National Resort and Spa and a 140,000 s.f. shopping center on PGA Boulevard. The entire project was built out and sold in January 2007. Subsequently, Mr. Ecclestone acquired Hilton/Doubletree branded hotels, located in Houston, TX, Anaheim, CA and Overland Park, KS. In 2014, he purchased the Sheraton Music City hotel in Nashville, TN. In 2016, he expanded his portfolio with the purchase of the Doubletree and Sheraton hotels at the Intercontinental airport in Houston and, in 2017, he purchased the Embassy Suites hotel in Anaheim. Mr. Ecclestone is active in all operational aspects of the hotels.

Ecclestone and his companies also developed, built and own Tower 1555, a 15-story office building in West Palm Beach and PGA National Office Center, a 2-story office building in Palm Beach Gardens.

In 2003, Mr. Ecclestone began developing and building college student housing projects. The first was a 924-bed facility in Morgantown, WV. In 2010, a second project with 933-beds and a 750- car garage opened in Norfolk, VA, adjacent to Old Dominion University. Between 2012 and 2014, he further developed a 764-bed complex in Tucson, AZ; a 900-bed facility in Tempe, AZ and a 659-bed complex in Ft. Collins, CO.

Mr. Ecclestone's influence is not limited to the world of real estate. He has participated on the boards of numerous organizations. Mr. Ecclestone is currently chairman of the Town of Palm Beach Shore Protection Board and serves on the Palm Beach County Aviation and Airports Advisory Board, the Palm Beach Civic Association and is a Trustee of the Preservation Foundation of Palm Beach. He is a member of The Florida Council of 100, World Presidents Organization, Urban Land Institute and Chief Executives Organization. He has dedicated much of his talent to community projects and initiatives. Among those was his service as Chairman of

Airport 88 and Chairman of the Construction Committee – a 2-year expansion of the Palm Beach International Airport that included construction of the main terminal as it exists today. Mr. Ecclestone's oversight brought the project in on-time and under budget. He is a founding board member and life trustee of the Raymond F. Kravis Center for the Performing Arts, founder, past Director and past Chairman of Sterling Bank, founder and past President and past Director of The Benjamin School and The Benjamin School Foundation, founder and past Director of Black Business Investment Corporation – an organization that expands participation of black business enterprises in Palm Beach County, founder and past Chairman of Home Safe of Palm Beach County – an organization that provides programs to prevent victims of child abuse and domestic violence; and past Director, past Chair and current member of the Economic Council of Palm Beach County. As chairman of the Economic Council, Mr. Ecclestone conceived of and led the drive for 7-single Districts, which changed Palm Beach County elections law from 5-members elected county-wide to 7-members elected by District. This measure provided more equal voting rights for all residents, even in the lowest populated areas. Moreover, Mr. Ecclestone has lent his expertise to many organizations as a Board Member including the Florida Housing Finance Authority, St. Mary's Medical Center, the State of Florida Commission on Ethics and the Board of Governors of Florida Atlantic University. For his many contributions and leadership roles he has been recognized with numerous awards and honors. Among these was his receiving the NECO sponsored Ellis Island Medal of Honor in May 2014. This distinguished award is presented to American citizens annually who exemplify, promote and contribute to the values of the American way of life. Of the 100 recipients, Mr. Ecclestone along with his wife, who is also a recipient, were among 10 honorees invited to speak at the ceremony.

Mr. Ecclestone and his wife of 20 years, Diana, support many charities and non-profit organizations. For relaxation, they enjoy traveling, sailing and skiing. Mr. Ecclestone is also an accomplished and avid sportsman who enjoys racing sailboats competitively.



The entire project was built out and sold in January 2007. Subsequently, Mr. Ecclestone acquired Hilton/Doubletree branded hotels, located in Houston, TX, Anaheim, CA and Overland Park, KS. In 2014, he purchased the Sheraton Music City hotel in Nashville, TN. In 2016, he expanded his portfolio with the purchase of the Doubletree and Sheraton hotels at the Intercontinental airport in Houston and, in 2017, he purchased the Embassy Suites hotel in Anaheim. Mr. Ecclestone is active in all operational aspects of the hotels.

Ecclestone and his companies also developed, built and own Tower 1555, a 15-story office building in West Palm Beach and PGA National Office Center, a 2-story office building in Palm Beach Gardens.

In 2003, Mr. Ecclestone began developing and building college student housing projects. The first was a 924-bed facility in Morgantown, WV. In 2010, a second project with 933-beds and a 750- car garage opened in Norfolk, VA, adjacent to Old Dominion University. Between 2012 and 2014, he further developed a 764-bed complex in Tucson, AZ; a 900-bed facility in Tempe, AZ and a 659-bed complex in Ft. Collins, CO.

Mr. Ecclestone's influence is not limited to the world of real estate. He has participated on the boards of numerous organizations. Mr. Ecclestone is currently chairman of the Town of Palm Beach Shore Protection Board and serves on the Palm Beach County Aviation and Airports Advisory Board, the Palm Beach Civic Association and is a Trustee of the Preservation Foundation of Palm Beach. He is a member of The Florida Council of 100, World Presidents Organization, Urban Land Institute and Chief Executives Organization. He has dedicated much of his talent to community projects and initiatives. Among those was his service as Chairman of

Airport 88 and Chairman of the Construction Committee – a 2-year expansion of the Palm Beach International Airport that included construction of the main terminal as it exists today. Mr. Ecclestone's oversight brought the project in on-time and under budget. He is a founding board member and life trustee of the Raymond F. Kravis Center for the Performing Arts, founder, past Director and past Chairman of Sterling Bank, founder and past President and past Director of The Benjamin School and The Benjamin School Foundation, founder and past Director of Black Business Investment Corporation – an organization that expands participation of black business enterprises in Palm Beach County, founder and past Chairman of Home Safe of Palm Beach County – an organization that provides programs to prevent victims of child abuse and domestic violence; and past Director, past Chair and current member of the Economic Council of Palm Beach County. As chairman of the Economic Council, Mr. Ecclestone conceived of and led the drive for 7-single Districts, which changed Palm Beach County elections law from 5-members elected county-wide to 7-members elected by District. This measure provided more equal voting rights for all residents, even in the lowest populated areas. Moreover, Mr. Ecclestone has lent his expertise to many organizations as a Board Member including the Florida Housing Finance Authority, St. Mary's Medical Center, the State of Florida Commission on Ethics and the Board of Governors of Florida Atlantic University. For his many contributions and leadership roles he has been recognized with numerous awards and honors. Among these was his receiving the NECO sponsored Ellis Island Medal of Honor in May 2014. This distinguished award is presented to American citizens annually who exemplify, promote and contribute to the values of the American way of life. Of the 100 recipients, Mr. Ecclestone along with his wife, who is also a recipient, were among 10 honorees invited to speak at the ceremony.

Mr. Ecclestone and his wife of 20 years, Diana, support many charities and non-profit organizations. For relaxation, they enjoy traveling, sailing and skiing. Mr. Ecclestone is also an accomplished and avid sportsman who enjoys racing sailboats competitively.



I. AUTHORITY :

Resolution R84-1960, adopted December 17, 1984; amended by Resolution R90-1992, amended by Resolution R92-1808, adopted on December 1, 1992; amended and superseded by Resolution R93-615, adopted on May 18, 1993; amended and superseded by Resolution R96-205, adopted on February 20, 1996; Repealed and replaced by Resolution R 2013-1303, adopted October 1, 2013.

II. APPOINTING BODY :

Board of County Commissioners

III. COMPOSITION, QUALIFICATIONS, TERMS & REMOVAL :

The Committee shall be composed of nine members: seven of whom shall be termed "District" members, and two of whom shall be termed "at-large" members. District members shall reside within the County and shall have qualifications for office as are hereinafter enumerated. At-large members shall be appointed by the BCC, as a whole, from nominations provided by individual Commissioners, and the aviation community. Members shall serve three year terms. Terms shall begin on October 1st and end of September 30th. Beginning on or after March 1, 2013, no member shall be appointed or reappointed for more than three consecutive three year terms.

EXTENDED COMPOSITION :

IV. MEETINGS :

The Advisory Board may meet in regular session monthly, or as required, at times and places set by the Advisory Board or as determined by the Chairman.

V. FUNCTIONS :

RESOLUTION NO. 2013- 1303

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, REPEALING RESOLUTION 96-205; PROVIDING FOR CREATION OF THE PALM BEACH COUNTY AVIATION AND AIRPORTS ADVISORY BOARD; PROVIDING FOR ADVISORY BOARD MEMBERSHIP; PROVIDING FOR TERM OF OFFICE; PROVIDING FOR OFFICERS; PROVIDING FOR QUALIFICATIONS OF MEMBERS; PROVIDING FOR STAFF COOPERATION AND SUPPORT; PROVIDING FOR MEETINGS; PROVIDING FOR QUORUM AND ATTENDANCE; PROVIDING FOR DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES; PROVIDING FOR RULES OF PROCEDURES OF VACANCIES; PROVIDING FOR COMPENSATION, EXPENSES AND FUNDING; PROVIDING FOR APPOINTMENT OF ADVISORS; PROVIDING FOR COMPLIANCE WITH UNIFORM POLICY FOR ADVISORY BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS; PROVIDING FOR COMPLIANCE WITH PALM BEACH COUNTY CODE OF ETHICS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County, by and through its Department of Airports, owns and operates the Palm Beach International Airport (“PBIA”), Palm Beach County Park Airport, Palm Beach County Glades Airport, and the North Palm Beach County General Aviation Airport (the “Airports”); and

WHEREAS, Resolution 96-205 created the Palm Beach County Aviation and Airports Advisory Board; and

WHEREAS, on February 5, 2013, the Board of County Commissioners (“Board”) adopted Resolution 2013-0193, establishing uniform policies and procedures for Palm Beach County advisory boards, committees and commissions; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to repeal and replace Resolution 96-205, so the Advisory Board conforms to the uniform policies and procedures for Palm Beach County advisory boards, committees and commissions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, as follows:

Section 1. Recitals. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and are expressly incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof.

Section 2. Repeal of Resolution 96-205. Resolution 96-205 shall be repealed effective upon adoption of this Resolution.

Section 3. Creation of Advisory Board. There is hereby created the Palm Beach County Aviation and Airports Advisory Board (“Advisory Board”) which shall be charged with the duty of giving recommendations and advice to the Board concerning the planning, development, construction, reconstruction, operation and financial viability of the Airports and aviation activities coming within the purview of the Board.

Section 4. Advisory Board Membership. The Advisory Board shall be composed of nine (9) members, seven (7) of whom shall be termed “District” members, two (2) of whom shall be termed “At-Large” members. District members shall reside within the County and shall have such qualifications for office as are hereinafter enumerated. At-Large members shall be appointed by the Board, as a whole, from nominations provided by individual County Commissioners, and the aviation community including, but not limited to, air carriers, fixed base operators, aviation clubs and designated aviation interests, or other community organizations. At-Large members shall

also possess qualifications for office as hereinafter enumerated. All District members shall serve at the pleasure of the District Commissioner appointing them and may be removed without cause. Similarly, all At-Large members shall serve at the pleasure of the Board and may be removed without cause.

Section 5. Term of Office. Members of the Advisory Board shall serve a three (3) year term. Terms shall begin on October 1st and end on September 30th. Existing member's terms shall end on September 30th of the year in which their term expires. Beginning on or after March 1, 2013, no member shall be appointed or reappointed to the Advisory Board for more than three (3) consecutive three (3) year terms. Vacancies occurring during a term shall be filled for the expired term, and shall not count toward the member's term limits.

Section 6. Officers. Officers of the Advisory Board shall consist of a Chair and a Vice Chair who shall be elected by a majority vote of the membership and shall serve for terms of one (1) year. No officer shall serve for more than two (2) consecutive terms and any officer may be removed before the expiration of his term by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Advisory Board. The Chair shall preside over the meetings and the Vice Chair shall preside in the absence of the Chair.

Section 7. Qualifications of Members. Each person nominated for and appointed to the Advisory Board shall possess a favorable reputation within Palm Beach County for experience and expertise in at least one of the following professions or fields:

- (A) Architecture
- (B) Engineering
- (C) Banking
- (D) Insurance
- (E) Law
- (F) Accounting
- (G) Non-residential construction
- (H) Business
- (I) Consumer

In addition, the seven (7) "District" members shall possess substantial, prior, verifiable experience in aviation or airports.

Section 8. Staff Cooperation and Support. The staff of the Board, including but not limited to, the County Administrator or his designee, the County Attorney or his designee, and the Director of Airports, are hereby charged with the responsibility to furnish to the Advisory Board such records, documents, plans, reports and financial data on aviation and Airport matters which, in the opinion of the Advisory Board, may fulfill the duties required of it hereunder. Secretarial and recording support for the Advisory Board shall be made available by the Department of Airports.

Section 9. Meetings. The Advisory Board may meet in regular session monthly, or as required, at times and places set by the Advisory Board or as determined by the Chair. Regular meetings shall be set by the Advisory Board at least one (1) calendar month in advance of each meeting. Special meetings of the Advisory Board may be held at the call of the Chair or the Director of Airports, provided, however, that forty-eight (48) hours advance notice is given to both the members of the Advisory Board and the public in

accordance with Florida Statutes, so that reasonable public notice is provided for all meetings, with same being open to the public at all times.

Section 10. Quorum and Attendance. A quorum must be present for the conduct of all official business of the Advisory Board. A majority of the members appointed shall constitute a quorum. An Advisory Board member shall be automatically removed for lack of attendance. Lack of attendance is defined as: failure to attend three (3) consecutive meetings or failure to attend more than one half (1/2) of the meetings scheduled during a calendar year. Participation for less than three-fourths (3/4) of a meeting shall constitute lack of attendance. Members removed pursuant to this paragraph shall not continue to serve on the Advisory Board, and such removal shall create a vacancy.

Section 11. Duties and Responsibilities. It shall be the duty of the Advisory Board to review and make recommendations to the Board or the Director of the Department of Airports. Such review and recommendations shall be performed in a timely manner. Moreover, the Advisory Board may review and make recommendation to the Board on any and all aviation and Airport matters coming within the authority and purview of the Board, excepting, however, the subject of Airport and aviation noise generation heretofore assigned to the Citizens Committee on Airport Noise.

Section 12. Rules of Procedures and Vacancies. All meetings shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order. Vacancies in the membership of the Advisory Board shall be filled for the unexpired term by the County Commission in the same manner as the original appointment had been made. All Advisory Board members shall serve at the pleasure of the District Commissioner or Board as the case may be.

Section 13. Compensation, Expenses and Funding. Members of the Advisory Board shall serve without compensation but may be eligible for travel reimbursement for only those expenses which are incurred for travel outside Palm Beach County which is necessary to fulfill Advisory Board member responsibilities provided sufficient funds have been budgeted and are available as set forth in PPM CW-O-038. No other expenses are reimbursable except documented long distance phone calls to the liaison County department. Any approved travel reimbursement shall be subject to those actual expenses at the rate or rates established by State law and County travel policy. Approval authority for pre-authorized board member travel is designated to the County Administrator and Deputy County Administrator and shall be in accordance with Countywide Policy and Procedures memoranda (PPM) CW-F-009.

Section 14. Appointment of Advisors. The Advisory Board is authorized to seek and secure advice from those who might be of assistance to the Advisory Board; provided, however, that such advice must be obtained without compensation to the advisor.

Section 15. Compliance with Uniform Policy for Advisory Boards and Commissions. This Resolution and the Advisory Board are expressly subject to all uniform policies for advisory boards and commissions as established by the Board pursuant to Resolution 2013-0193, as may be amended. In the event of any conflict between this Resolution or any amendments hereto, and the aforesaid Resolution 2013-0193, as may be amended, the latter shall prevail over the former.

Section 16. Compliance with Palm Beach County Code of Ethics. Advisory Board members shall comply with the applicable provisions of the Palm Beach County Code of Ethics as codified in Section 2-254 through 2-260 of the Palm Beach County Code.

Section 17. Severability. If any section, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Resolution is held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Resolution.

Section 18. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.

The foregoing Resolution was offered by Commissioner Vana, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Berger, and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:

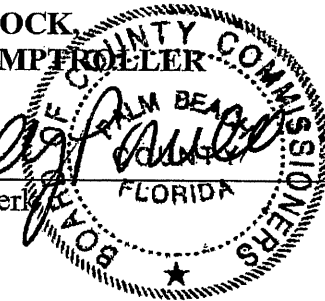
