I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve: Second Amendment to Community Based Agency Contract with the City of Greenacres (City) (R2017-1509), for the period October 1, 2018, through September 30, 2019, to reflect programming offered during the school year and including an increase in the number of clients served each month, at no additional cost to the County.

Summary: In October 2017, the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approved a Community Based Agency Contract with the City to provide Youth Programs – Cool Zone/Hot Spot, which included two (2) one-year options for renewal at the County's sole discretion. In September 2018, the Board approved a First Amendment (R2018-1451), extending the program through September 30, 2019, and providing for continued funding in the amount of \$77,000. The City desires to change the months the program is offered from 12 to approximately 10 to reflect services rendered during the school year, while increasing the number of clients served from 40 to 49. The City provides different programming during the summer months in the form of summer camps. Program outcomes are aligned with Palm Beach County's Youth Master Plan action area, Social and Emotional Learning. <u>District 2</u> (HH)

Background and Justification: On October 3, 2017, the Board approved a Community Based Agency Contract with the City to provide the Youth Programs — Cool Zone/Hot Spot, for the period October 1, 2017, through September 30, 2018, in the amount of \$77,000. On September 18, 2018, the Board approved a First Amendment that extended the program to September 30, 2019, and provided continued funding, in the amount of \$77,000. The Cool Zone/Hot Spot programs are out-of-school time programs that provide a nurturing and stimulating environment for middle and high school youth. Services include: emotional, motivational and strategic support to help youth acquire a sense of structure and safety, belonging and membership, as well as self-confidence.

SECOND AMENDMENT TO COMMUNITY BASED AGENCY CONTRACT

THIS SECOND AMENDMENT is made as of the _____ day of ____ 2019, by and between Palm Beach County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, by and through its Board of County Commissioners, hereinafter referred to as the COUNTY and the City of Greenacres, a municipality located in Palm Beach County, Florida, hereinafter referred to as the CITY, each one constituting a public agency as defined in Part I of Chapter 163, Florida Statutes.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the parties entered into a Community Based Agency Contract (Contract) dated October 3, 2017 (R2017-1509), in the amount of \$77,000, to fund Youth Programs, from October 1, 2017, through September 30, 2018, with two (2) one-year renewal options;

WHEREAS, the parties entered into a First Amendment dated September 18, 2018 (R2018-1451), that extended the term one (1) year, October 1, 2018, through September 30, 2019, and increased the Contract by \$77,000 to fund an additional year of service, for a new total not to exceed amount of \$154,000; and

WHEREAS, the parties acknowledge this is a school year program and desire to modify the number of months accordingly, and increase the number of projected clients served.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties mutually agree that the Contract is amended as follows:

- 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference.
- 2. Exhibit A-1 is hereby replaced in its entirety with Exhibit A-2.
- 3. Exhibit B-1 is hereby replaced in its entirety with Exhibit B-2.
- 4. All other provisions of the Contract and prior amendments thereto not modified by this Second Amendment remain unchanged and in full force and effect.

Overview:

The Leisure Services Department Youth Programs Division operates a nationally accredited year round school and camp program that is licensed through the Palm Beach County Health Department (License #50-51-00526). With a current licensed capacity of 150, this inclusive year-round program provides services to all elementary, middle, and high school youth in Palm Beach County. The City maintains two (2) provider agreements with The Early Learning Coalition (ELC) of Palm Beach County. The agreements provide subsidized funding for eligible low-income families. The City has a permanent agreement with the Florida Department of Health, Child Care Food Program, for the daily snacks provided. We also have a long-term partnership with The Arc of Palm Beach County for specialized inclusive accommodation services for our children diagnosed with developmental disabilities.

Observed Need/Risk Factor(s) that will be addressed:

Teens have limited access to quality Out of School Time (OST) programming.

Services:

Youth Programs offer children a fun and safe environment with enrichment activities that assist in childhood development. Participants grow, develop and transition from one program to the next, into the Cool Zone (middle school) and then into the Hot Spot (high school) program, where students gain valuable leadership skills and earn community service hours for graduation.

These inclusive programs offer children fun, peer interaction, along with structured opportunities to develop a sense of belonging and membership, self-confidence, cultural competence and social skills. The goal of the program is provide a quality, safe and culturally diverse program that encourages positive civic, social and educational experiences for children of all ages. To accomplish these goals the programs provide participants the opportunity to engage in worthwhile recreation activities, generate a sense of fair play, develop sportsmanship and cooperation, learn recreational and social skills and provide opportunities for lifelong physical health and developed at their own individual pace. The goals are accomplished through the implementation of programming provided by both Greenacres personnel, community collaboration and outside providers. Youth Programs also has a youth advisory council named "Youth Delegates in Action' (YDIA), this council is made up of children from elementary, middle, and high

school, and serving as a collective voice in the program. YDIA assists in planning fundraisers, parent nights, snack calendars, community service projects, intergenerational activities and field trips.

Services will include:

- Provide high quality programming for thirty-four (34) middle and fifteen (15) high school students at no cost;
- Ensure that program participants remain in the program throughout the school year;
- Collaborate with The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO) District 16, to provide the unique opportunity for Deputies to mentor youth informally twice a week at the program site;
- Increase after-hour opportunities for middle and high school students to spend more time with the Deputies in order to develop positive relationships with law enforcement;
- Hire additional staff to work specifically with the teens to solicit their input to plan college tours, guest speakers, community service projects, and activities that promote positive youth development that leads to a productive adulthood.

Outcomes:

The following outcomes will be tracked:

- # and % of program participants served who demonstrate improvement in student conduct;
- # and % of program participants served who complete a minimum of 25 community service hours for graduation.

The CITY shall provide monthly, quarterly and annual data for all program participants funded in this Contract. The reports shall be presented in a format acceptable to COUNTY.

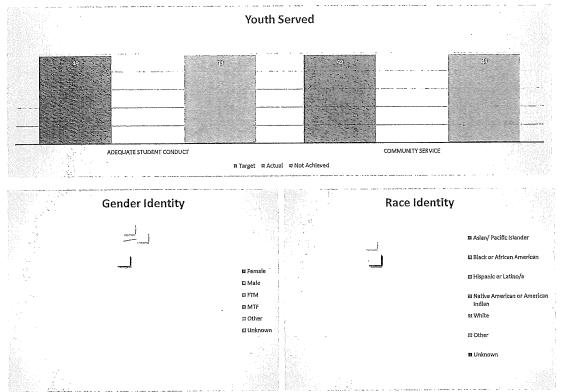

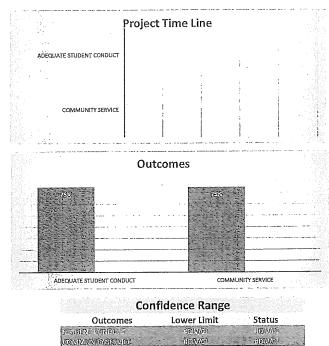
