I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to: (A) Accept on behalf of the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office, a Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) State Criminal Alien Assistance Program FY 2017 Grant in the amount of \$62,398 for the period of December 20, 2018, through the date all funds have been spent; and (B) Approve a Budget Amendment of \$62,398 increasing the Sheriff's Grants Fund.

Summary: The Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) has made funds available to be used for correctional purposes. These funds will be used in accordance with the Department of Justice Reauthorization Act of 2005. There **is no match requirement** associated with this award. <u>Countywide</u> (LDC)

Background and Justification: The Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA), Office of Justice Programs, U.S. Department of Justice, in conjunction with the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) provides federal funding to states and localities that incurred correctional officer salary costs for incarcerating undocumented criminal aliens who have at least one felony or two misdemeanor convictions for violations of state or local law, and who are incarcerated for at least 4 consecutive days during the reporting period. This program has assisted states and localities which have requested assistance in defraying the cost incurred for the imprisonment of undocumented criminal aliens, resulting in more than \$4 billion in funds being distributed to over 660 unique jurisdictions in the last 10 years. The Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) number is 16.606 and the contract number is 2019-AP-BX-0415.
