


I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to adopt: an ordinance of the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County, Florida; amending Section 12-57 of the Palm Beach County Code, Table 1.3.8 Schedule of Fire Inspections of the Palm Beach County Local Amendments to the Florida Fire Prevention Code; revising the inspection schedule for certain apartments; providing for legislative findings; providing for applicability; providing for repeal of laws in conflict; providing for severability; providing for enforcement; providing for inclusion in the Code; and providing for an effective date.

Summary: Pursuant to Chapter 633, Florida Statutes, the State Fire Marshal has adopted Rule Chapter 69A-60, Florida Administrative Code, an updated statewide minimum firesafety code known as the Florida Fire Prevention Code, which incorporates Florida editions of NFPA 1 Fire Code and NFPA 101 Life Safety Code. On December 19, 2017, the Board of County Commissioners (Board) adopted the Palm Beach County Local Amendments to the Florida Fire Prevention Code (Local Amendments), which are set forth in Chapter 12, Article IV, Sections 12-56 and 12-57 of the Palm Beach County Code (codifying Ordinance 2017-043). Palm Beach County Fire Rescue desires to revise the Local Amendments to modify the inspection schedule for certain apartments to provide annual inspections which will enhance public safety, improve our ISO PPC rating, and improve homeowners' insurance rates in the future for residents within Palm Beach County Fire Rescue's jurisdiction. Countywide (SB)

Background and Policy Issues: This revision to the Local Amendments will maintain or improve Palm Beach County Fire Rescue's ISO (Insurance Services Office), Public Protection Classification (PPC) rating. Historically, fire inspections were conducted on a three and five year cycle for specific multi-family residential properties. ISO's recommendation is to inspect all properties on an annual cycle. This revision to the Local Amendments will modify the inspection schedule for certain apartments to provide annual inspections and strengthen the minimum firesafety code to serve the public interest and general welfare of residents served by Palm Beach County Fire Rescue.

ORDINANCE NO. 2019-

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA; AMENDING SECTION 12-57 OF THE PALM BEACH COUNTY CODE, TABLE 1.3.8 SCHEDULE OF FIRE INSPECTIONS OF THE PALM BEACH COUNTY LOCAL AMENDMENTS TO THE FLORIDA FIRE PREVENTION CODE; REVISING THE INSPECTION SCHEDULE FOR CERTAIN APARTMENTS; PROVIDING FOR LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS; PROVIDING FOR APPLICABILITY; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF LAWS IN CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR ENFORCEMENT; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 633, Florida Statutes, every three years the State Fire Marshal adopts in Rule Chapter 69A-60, Florida Administrative Code, an updated statewide minimum firesafety code known as the Florida Fire Prevention Code, which incorporates Florida editions of NFPA 1 Fire Code and NFPA 101 Life Safety Code; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 633, Florida Statutes, the updated Florida Fire Prevention Code shall be deemed adopted by, and shall be enforced by, local governments with firesafety responsibilities as the minimum firesafety code; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 633, Florida Statutes, authorizes local governments to adopt more stringent local amendments to the Florida Fire Prevention Code which strengthen the requirements of the minimum firesafety code; and

WHEREAS, on December 19, 2017, the Board of County Commissioners ("Board") adopted the Palm Beach County Local Amendments to the Florida Fire Prevention Code ("Local Amendments"), which are set forth Chapter 12, Article IV, Sections 12-56 and 12-57, of the Palm Beach County Code (codifying Ordinance 2017-043); and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to revise the Local Amendments to modify the inspection schedule for certain apartments to provide for annual inspections; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners hereby determines that said revised Local Amendment is more stringent than and strengthens the minimum firesafety code, and that adopting said revised Local Amendment will serve the public interest and general welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

SECTION 1. The whereas clauses above are hereby affirmed and incorporated herein.

SECTION 2. Table 1.3.8 Schedule of Fire Inspections of the Local Amendments set forth in Section 12-57 of the Palm Beach County Code is hereby amended as set forth in **Exhibit A** attached hereto and incorporated herein (additions shown by underline and deletions shown by strikethrough).

SECTION 3. Legislative Findings: The Board of County Commissioners hereby determines that said revised Local Amendment is more stringent than the minimum firesafety code and strengthens the minimum firesafety code in accordance with Sections 633.202 and 633.208, Florida Statutes.

SECTION 4. Applicability: The provisions of this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect in Palm Beach County within the boundaries of any fire-rescue municipal service taxing unit (MSTU) established by ordinance, including within the boundaries of any municipality that is lawfully included within any such MSTU; and within any municipality that has entered into an interlocal agreement for fire protection services from Palm Beach County Fire-Rescue and enacted an ordinance to adopt the Palm Beach County Local Amendments within the municipality, unless otherwise provided by the interlocal agreement.

SECTION 5. Repeal of Laws in Conflict: Any laws or ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance which Palm Beach County is authorized to repeal are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 6. Severability: If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Ordinance is for any reason determined to be unconstitutional, inoperative, void or otherwise invalid, such determination shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance.

SECTION 7. Enforcement: This Ordinance is enforceable by all means provided by law. Additionally, the County may choose to enforce this Ordinance by seeking injunctive relief in the Circuit Court of Palm Beach County.

SECTION 8. Inclusion in the Code of Laws and Ordinances: The provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Laws and Ordinances of Palm Beach County, Florida. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such, and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or any other appropriate word.

SECTION 9. Effective Date: The provisions of this Ordinance shall become effective upon the date this Ordinance is filed with the Department of State.
