Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve: a budget amendment of \$5,623,392 in the General Fund to recognize the federal allocation received by the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office under the Fiscal Year (FY) 2018 Presidential Residence Protection Assistance Grant (PRPA).

Summary: On February 25, 2019, the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO) received a federal grant award from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS)/Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) as reimbursement for the extraordinary law enforcement personnel costs incurred for protection activities directly associated with the designated residence of the President during the period October 1, 2017 through September 30, 2018. There is no match requirement associated with this award. No new positions are needed. <u>Countywide</u> (LDC)

Background and Policy Issues: The Presidential Residence Protection Assistance Grant (PRPA) provides federal funds to reimburse state and local law enforcement agencies (LEAs) for law enforcement overtime personnel and fringe costs incurred while protecting any non-governmental residence of the President that is designated or identified to be secured by the United States Secret Service during the period October 1, 2017 through September 30, 2018, in accordance with Section 534 of the Department of Homeland Security Appropriations Act, 2018 (Pub. L. No. 115-141). The Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance number is 97.134 and the Agreement number is EMW-2018-GR-00059-S01.

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Performance

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Article I - Summary of Award

Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office has received a total federal allocation in the amount of \$5,623,392.21 under the FY 2018 Presidential Residence Protection Assistance Grant Program (PRPA) to reimburse state and local law enforcement agencies (LEAs) for law enforcement overtime personnel and fringe costs incurred while protecting any non-governmental residence of the President that is designated or identified to be secured by the United States Secret Service (USSS) during the period from October 1, 2017, through September 30, 2018, in accordance with Section 534 of the Department of Homeland Security Appropriations Act, 2018.

Article II - Nondiscrimination in Matters Pertaining to Faith-Based Organizations

It is DHS policy to ensure the equal treatment of faith-based organizations in social service programs administered or supported by DHS or its component agencies, enabling those organizations to participate in providing important social services to beneficiaries. Recipients must comply with the equal treatment policies and requirements contained in <u>6 C.F.R. Part 19</u> and other applicable statues, regulations, and guidance governing the participations of faith-based organizations in individual DHS programs.

Article III - Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990

Recipients must comply with the requirements of Titles I, II, and III of the *Americans with Disabilities Act*, which prohibits recipients from discriminating on the basis of disability in the operation of public entities, public and private transportation systems, places of public accommodation, and certain testing entities.
