<u>I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF</u>

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to:

A) Adopt a resolution of the Board of County Commissioners (BCC), of Palm Beach County, Florida, accepting the grant award for FY16 Section 5310 from the State of Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), in the amount of \$436,425 for capital assistance under grants for the enhanced mobility of seniors and individuals with disabilities CFDA 20.513, as administered by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT);

B) Authorize the County Administrator or Designee to sign the Notice of Grant Award FFY2016;

C) Approve the purchase of six (6) paratransit vehicles from Florida Transportation Systems, Inc. from FDOT Contract TRIPS-17-CA-FTS-C utilizing \$436,425 in FDOT funds, \$48,492 in required match and \$8,043 in overmatch for a cumulative purchase price of \$492,960 pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Notice of Grant Award FFY2016 Section 5310;

D) Authorize the County Administrator or her Designee to submit the Order Form for FDOT Contract TRIPS-17-CA-FTS-C to request purchase of the vehicles/equipment and/or expend grant funds pursuant to a grant award;

E) Approve a downward Budget Amendment of \$56,535, in Palm Tran's Operating Fund 1340, to reallocate funds to Palm Tran's Capital Fund 1341 to meet match requirements;

F) Approve an upward Budget Amendment of \$56,535, in Palm Tran's Capital Fund 1341, to establish match funds; and

G) Approve a Budget Transfer of \$56,535, in the General Fund 0001, reducing the transfer to Palm Tran Operating Funds 1340 and increasing the transfer to Palm Tran Capital Fund 1341 to establish revenue budget for non-grant funded expenditures.

Summary: Palm Tran will utilize this grant to purchase six (6) replacement paratransit vehicles at a total cost of \$492,960. The vehicles being replaced were purchased in 2015 with the Public Improvement Revenue Bond funds and have reached their end of life. This Notice of Grant Award, in the amount of \$436,425, for FY16 Section 5310 funds requires a 10% match of \$48,492. An overmatch of \$8,043 is required to fully equip the vehicles to place them into service. The Notice of Grant Award became effective upon FDOT Execution and vehicles must be ordered by May 15, 2019. The required match is included in Palm Tran's FY2019 budget. Countywide (DR)

Background and Justification: Section 5310 funds must be used to transport seniors and/or individuals with disabilities. FDOT pays the vendor directly for 90% of the cost of the maximum award amount. Palm Beach County pays the remaining 10% directly to the vendor, in addition to any cost for additional equipment. Palm Tran submitted an application to FDOT, for the acquisition of replacement paratransit vehicles. The BCC approved the submittal of this application on March 12, 2019. Section 5310 Program provides funds to assist with meeting transportation needs of the elderly and individuals with disabilities.

- a. In addition to reviews of audits conducted in accordance with 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F Audit Requirements, monitoring procedures may include but not be limited to on-site visits by Department staff and/or other procedures including, reviewing any required performance and financial reports, following up, ensuring corrective action, and issuing management decisions on weaknesses found through audits when those findings pertain to Federal awards provided through the Department by this Agreement. By entering into this Agreement, the Palm Beach County BOCC. agrees to comply and cooperate fully with any monitoring procedures/processes deemed appropriate by the Department. The Palm Beach County BOCC. further agrees to comply and cooperate with any inspections, reviews, investigations or audits deemed necessary by the Department, State of Florida Chief Financial Officer (CFO) or State of Florida Auditor General.
- b. The Palm Beach County BOCC. a non-Federal entity as defined by 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F Audit Requirements, as a subrecipient of a Federal award awarded by the Department through this Agreement is subject to the following requirements:
 - In the event the Palm Beach County BOCC. expends a total amount of Federal awards i. equal to or in excess of the threshold established by 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F – Audit Requirements, the Palm Beach County BOCC. must have a Federal single or programspecific audit for such fiscal year conducted in accordance with the provisions of 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F – Audit Requirements. Exhibit 1 to this Agreement provides the required Federal award identification information needed by the Palm Beach County BOCC. to further comply with the requirements of 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F – Audit Requirements.  - iii. In the event the Palm Beach County BOCC. expends less than the threshold established by 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F – Audit Requirements, in Federal awards, the Palm Beach

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County BOCC. is exempt from Federal audit requirements for that fiscal year. However, the Palm Beach County BOCC. must provide a single audit exemption statement to the Department at <u>FDOTSingleAudit@dot.state.fl.us</u> no later than nine months after the end of the Palm Beach County BOCC. 's audit period for each applicable audit year. In the event the Palm Beach County BOCC. expends less than the threshold established by 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F – Audit Requirements, in Federal awards in a fiscal year and elects to have an audit conducted in accordance with the provisions of 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F – Audit Requirements, the cost of the audit must be paid from non-Federal resources (i.e., the cost of such an audit must be paid from the Palm Beach County BOCC. - iv. - v. Within six months of acceptance of the audit report by the FAC, the Department will review the Palm Beach County BOCC..'s audit reporting package, including corrective action plans and management letters, to the extent necessary to determine whether timely and appropriate action on all deficiencies has been taken pertaining to the Federal award provided through the Department by this Agreement. If the Palm Beach County BOCC. fails to have an audit conducted in accordance with 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F Audit Requirements, the Department may impose additional conditions to remedy noncompliance. If the Department determines that noncompliance cannot be remedied by imposing additional conditions, the Department may take appropriate actions to enforce compliance, which actions may include but not be limited to the following:
 - 1. Temporarily withhold cash payments pending correction of the deficiency by the Agency or more severe enforcement action by the Department;
 - 2. Disallow (deny both use of funds and any applicable matching credit for) all or part of the cost of the activity or action not in compliance;
 - 3. Wholly or partly suspend or terminate the Federal award;
 - Initiate suspension or debarment proceedings as authorized under 2 C.F.R. Part 180 and Federal awarding agency regulations (or in the case of the Department, recommend such a proceeding be initiated by the Federal awarding agency);
 - 5. Withhold further Federal awards for the Project or program;
 - 6. Take other remedies that may be legally available.

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- vi. As a condition of receiving this Federal award, the Palm Beach County BOCC. shall permit the Department, or its designee, the CFO or State of Florida Auditor General access to the Palm Beach County BOCC.'s records including financial statements, the independent auditor's working papers and project records as necessary. Records related to unresolved audit findings, appeals or litigation shall be retained until the action is complete or the dispute is resolved.

The Palm Beach County BOCC. shall ensure that the audit working papers are made available to the Department, or its designee, the CFO, or State of Florida Auditor General upon request for a period of five years from the date the audit report is issued unless extended in writing by the Department.

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Exhibit 3: Procurement Process Overview

This information is intended to provide guidance on the processes for procurements when using state and federal dollars. Procurements should be in accordance with Chapter 287, Florida Statutes (F.S.), Chapter 60A, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Best Practices Procurement Manual. Additionally, geographic preferences are prohibited when procurements involve federal funds [reference: 49 CFR 18.36 (c)(1)(2) and FTA C 4220.1F, Ch. VI, Section 2.a(4)(g)].

Third Party Contracts refer to a recipient's contract with a vendor or contractor, including procurement by purchase order or purchase by credit card, which is financed with Federal assistance awarded by FTA.

An agency should submit their procurement request to the District Representative for approval prior to completing the purchase. To complete the procurement request, the agency should follow these steps:

1. Determine the funding source (i.e. – federal, state, or local funds)

2. Determine type of procurement being requested (Examples are located in the Procurement Guidance for Transit Agencies Handbook)

- Professional Services/Architectural Engineering Services
- Operations/Management/Sub-recipients
- Rolling Stock
- Construction
- Materials and Supplies

6. Complete the appropriate third-party checklist from the Procurement Guidance for Transit Agencies Handbook. The checklist should notate where the applicable clause can be found in the supporting documentation.

For procurements that are categorized as a "Small Purchase", a sample Vendor Small Purchase letter is in the Procurement Guidance for Transit Agencies Handbook. Agencies may utilize this letter as a template when third party agreements/contracts are necessary.
