## I. <u>EXECUTIVE BRIEF</u>

**Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to: (A) Accept** on behalf of the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office, a Sub-Contract Agreement between the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office and the Florida Department of Transportation, for the State of Florida Drug Recognition Expert (DRE) Call-Out Project in the amount of \$2,500, for the period of March 26, 2019 through September 1, 2019; and (B) Approve a budget amendment of \$2,500 in the Sheriff's Grant Fund.

**Summary:** On March 7, 2019, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) awarded a Drug Recognition Expert (DRE) grant to the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office in the amount of \$2,500, to support FDOT's efforts to reduce Driving under the Influence (DUI) traffic offenses. These funds will be used to pay for overtime costs to conduct a DRE evaluation. There is **no match requirement** associated with this award. <u>Countywide</u> (LDC)

**Background and Justification:** The Florida Department of Transportation receives federal funding from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration to support statewide Highway Safety projects. The Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) number is 20.616, the project number is M5X 19-06-02, and the DOT Contract number is  $\#G1096_{A}$

This is an agreement to provide reimbursement for qualified overtime expenses incurred by a certified Drug Recognition Expert (DRE) as a result of conducting a drug influence evaluation for a violation of 316.193 Driving Under the Influence (DUI).

The parties to this contract shall be bound by all applicable sections of Part V: Acceptance and Agreement of Project no. M5X 19-06-02, FDOT contract # G1096. (See Attachment A)

A final invoice must be received by September 15, 2019 or payment will be forfeited.

The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office will be reimbursed \$101.01 per hour not to exceed the maximum eligible reimbursement amount of \$2500.00 for the duration of the subgrant agreement ending September 1, 2019 for overtime expenses incurred as a result of a certified DRE employed by Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office conducting a qualified drug influence evaluation as part of an investigation of 316.193 (DUI). This agreed upon maximum eligible reimbursement amount of \$2500.00 is the maximum reimbursable amount over the duration of the subgrant agreement ending September 1, 2019, not the maximum reimbursable amount per invoice. A "qualified drug influence evaluation" shall be one that is 1) reported by the DRE to the Florida DRE Coordinator by submitting a DRE Call-out notification (provided) and a copy of the initial evaluation report (facesheet), and 2) entering the evaluation into the NHTSA DRE Database (dredata.nhtsa.gov). The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office will submit an approved, signed Overtime Reimbursement Invoice (provided) for each DRE investigation resulting in overtime that meets this criteria within 14 calendar days from the date of the overtime. Failure to meet these criteria can result in non-payment of the claim. The parties to this subcontract shall be bound by all applicable sections of Part V: Acceptance and Agreement of Project # M5X-19-06-02 , FDOT Contract #G1096 . A final involce must be received by September 20, 2019 or payment will be forfeited.

Buy American Act. The Buy America Act prohibits the use of Federal highway safety grant funds to purchase any manufactured product or software/information technology systems whose unit purchase price is \$5,000 or more, including motor vehicles, that is not produced in the United States. NHTSA may waive those requirements if (1) their application would be inconsistent with the public interest; (2) such materials and products are not produced in the United States in sufficient and reasonably available quantities and of a satisfactory quality; or (3) the inclusion of domestic material will increase the cost of the overall project contract by more than 26 percent.

Certification Regarding Federal Lobbying. The subcontractor certifies, to the best of his or her knowledge and belief, that:

- 1. No Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the undersigned, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any Federal contract, the making of any Federal grant, the making of any Federal loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement.
- 2. If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with this Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement, the undersigned shall complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions.
- Iv. Cooperation with the Inspector General. It is the duty of every subcontractor to cooperate with the Inspector general in any Investigation, audit, Inspection, review, or hearing pursuant to this subgrant agreement. Chapter 20.055(5), F.S.
- v. DBE Assurance. The subcontractor shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the performance of this contract. The consultant or contractor shall carry out applicable requirements of 49 CFR, Part 26 in the award and administration of USDOT-assisted contracts. Failure by the consultant or contractor to carry out these requirements is a material breach of this contract, which may result in the termination of this contract or such other remedy, as the Subrecipient or the Department deems appropriate.
- vi. E-Verify. Any subcontractors performing work or providing services pursuant to the subgrant agreement are required to utilize the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system to verify the employment eligibility of all new employees hired by the subcontractor during the contract term.
