I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to receive and file: Consultant Service Authorization (CSA) No. 1 to the professional services contract (R2019-0984) with PGAL, Inc. (Consultant) for the completion of a comparative study and final recommendations on the disposition of the Animal Care & Control Renewal/Replacement/Renovation (ACC R/R/R) Project located at 7100 Belvedere Road, West Palm Beach in the amount of \$155,160.

Summary: On July 2, 2019, the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) authorized the county administrator, or designee to execute CSA No. 1 in an amount not to exceed \$200,000, via Agenda Item 5F-1. This authorization addressed a directive issued by BCC during the January 29, 2019 workshop instructing staff to prepare a more in-depth programming study (Comparative Study). The study would 1) validate/confirm the program/needs, and 2) specifically look at opportunities, challenges and costs, including continuity of operations during construction of an entirely new facility on the existing site versus accomplishing the project via the R/R/R approach currently contemplated. The comparative study will be developed in conjunction with public input via targeted public outreach sessions, which will be facilitated by the consultant team. The results of the comparative study will be evaluated by the County in order to determine the most appropriate solution (or some combination) to be used as the scope of the project to be designed. The attached CSA was fully executed on behalf of BCC by the Director of the Facilities Development and Operations Department. In accordance with the County Policy and Procedures Manual (PPM) CW-O-051, all delegated contracts, agreements and grants must be submitted by the initiating Department as a receive and file agenda item. The solicitation for design professionals was advertised pursuant to the requirements of the Equal Business Opportunity (EBO) ordinance. The project was presented to the Goal Setting Committee on March 6, 2019, and an Affirmative Procurement Initiative (API) of 20% Small Business Enterprise (SBE) participation was applied. The prime consultant is not a SBE, but will be utilizing four (4) sub-consultants that are Small/Women/Minority Business Enterprises (S/W/MBE). The consultant submitted 33.69% SBE participation and 10.8% M/WBE participation. Funding for this project is the ACC R/R/R IST Project Fund. (Capital Improvements Division) District 2 (LDC)

Background & Justification: The delegation of authority, which provided authority for the County Administrator or designee to execute this CSA, was requested to expedite the process of authorizing the consultant services for the Comparative Study prior to the first public input meeting in mid-July and to meet the project schedule.

PROJECT SCALE, SCOPE AND LOCATION

This Project involves working in collaboration with PGAL's Boca Raton office to determine the scope, scale, and site plan layout for renovations and additions to, or replacement of, the Palm Beach County Animal Shelter. Size of the Project is to be determined but will initially be based on previous cost estimates and square footage allocations provided by Palm Beach County.

SCOPE OF WORK

Provide animal shelter design consultation services as described below:

Tasks 1: Project Initiation

a. Kick-off meeting

Establish vision and goals Confirm target budgets and schedule Prepare animal data requests for County County to assemble data

During this initial phase of the project, Animal Arts will assist PGAL with initial telephone meetings with Palm Beach County and will assemble a data request, which will focus on animal intake and outcome data and other animal and program related data.

Tasks 2: Due Diligence

- a. Review all previous studies and base information from County Site visit (Design Team)
- b. Attend targeted Public Outreach Session
- c. Site investigation and development of constraints

- d. Existing buildings evaluation

During Tasks 2, Animal Arts will use the data gathered in Tasks 1, along with other demographic data to develop trends projections for the animal capacity and programmatic needs for Palm Beach County Animal Services.

Animal Arts will tour the Project site, and will evaluate the buildings, primarily from the perspective of best practices for animal shelter design and operations. This evaluation will be combined with other physical building and site evaluations developed by PGAL, to determine constraints and opportunities of the existing building/s and site.

While on site, Animal Arts will assist PGAL in representing the perspective of animal care at the Public Outreach Session to be held in Palm Beach County on July 24, 2019.

Animal Arts has included the participation of 20/20 Engineering, an engineering firm specializing in the design of animal care facility mechanical systems, to assist the engineer of record in developing basis of design requirements for systems for Palm Beach County. The engineer of record will be responsible for all resulting evaluations and documentation of existing and new systems, and 20/20's role is merely to provide expertise and guidance to ensure the best result for the County.

1. Combined Industry Charrette #2 with ACC Staff and Design Team

The information gathered in Tasks 2 will allow Animal Arts to assist in verifying the program of required spaces for the Project. We will review this program of spaces with the County, along with site constraints diagrams developed by PGAL, in preparation for the Combined Industry Charette.

The Combined Industry Charette is a full-day interactive workshop with the key Project stakeholder groups. During this workshop, Animal Arts will lead the presentation of trends in animal sheltering and will assist in presenting the results of operational evaluations of the existing facility. Results of the animal capacity study will also be presented and discussed.

During this charette, Animal Arts will work with PGAL to present and discuss the program of spaces for the Project as well as the first potential R/R/R options. PGAL will illustrate how these options may work on the project site. R/R/R options will be reviewed in the context of a "continuity of operations" plan.

Based on the results of the Charette, Animal Arts will work with PGAL to revise the programs and options and will summarize the work to date in a brief report, which will be bundled into final reports during Tasks 4.

During this phase of the Work, the engineer of record will review options with the County for temporary HVAC for the dog kennels, as well as requirements for new HVAC for the other buildings. This work will incorporate the feedback of Animal Arts' specialty engineering firm.

The culmination of Tasks 3 is a collaborative effort between PGAL, Animal Arts, and other consultants to work with the County's Construction Management firm as they put together a cost estimate for the Project. Animal Arts will provide special assistance on the systems that are unique to animal care and will discuss these items in phone calls with the CM.

Three person days on site by representatives of Animal Arts have been included in Tasks 3.

Final block diagrams and massing

During this final step of the Work, Animal Arts will work with PGAL to develop and review revised R/R/R options and block diagrams with the county in a second Industry Charette with each of the key stakeholder groups.

Animal Arts will work together with PGAL to assist the CM in refining cost estimates, as the R/R/R options become more defined. Animal Arts will provide a narrative specification of animal specialty items to be incorporated in pricing.

Animal Arts will visit the site for a workshop with PGAL, the CM, and the County to review refined options and to select the Best Option for the Project.

Finally, Animal Arts will revise and refine all animal-related portions of the report and will provide to PGAL, who will bundle the final Comparative Study Reports. Animal Arts will assist in presenting the study to the Board of County Commissioners.

Four person days on site by representatives of Animal Arts have been included in Tasks 4.

Based on the scope provided to our office, the fee for RGD Consulting Engineers to provide a mechanical, electrical and plumbing engineering study is \$32,841.00 (Thirty-two thousand, eight hundred, forty-one dollars and zero cents).

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The project includes a study of existing MEP systems at Palm Beach County's Animal Care and Control Facility, located at 7100 Belvedere Road in West Palm Beach, Florida. The outcome of this study is to provide a set of recommendations on the MEP systems. RGD will work in coordination with Animal Arts on the mechanical system recommendations. A written scope of work will be provided to the architect.

Disclaimer: The Engineer does not claim, in any way, that all code violations or safety hazards will be discovered. The Engineer's investigation will not involve uncovering any concealed components which include but are not limited to sanitary, domestic water piping, HVAC duct work, electrical conduits, opening electrical panels or junction boxes.

The survey and report shall be completed thirty (30) days after receipt of the notice to proceed. The Client will receive an electronic copy of the report. At the request of the Client hard copies will be provided. Hard copies will be considered an additional expense.

ADDITIONAL SERVICES

Services that go beyond the scope as described above shall be considered additional services. The Engineer shall perform such additional services as agreed upon by both parties at a fixed rate or per our hourly rates.

Hourly rates are attached in Exhibit B2.

SERVICES PROVIDED BY CLIENT

The Client shall assist the Engineer by furnishing at no cost to the Engineer, all available pertinent information including previous reports, as built drawings, legal descriptions of the property, floor plans and elevations, building sections, recent survey and any other data relative to performance of the above services which may be relied upon to verify existing conditions and/or new design. It is stipulated that the available drawings provided shall be substantially like the existing conditions. In the event that the existing conditions are not in concurrence with the documentation, the Engineer's fee may be adjusted accordingly as agreed upon by both parties.

If needed and agreed upon by both parties, the Client shall provide at no cost to the Engineer an electrical contractor to assist in tracing out electrical circuits which may not be readily apparent by observation. A recommended budget for this service is \$1,000.00.

If needed and agreed upon by both parties, the Client shall provide at no cost to the Engineer a representative from the HVAC service company currently maintaining the HVAC system to assist with inspection of evaporator coils and other HVAC equipment.

The Client shall provide a maintenance person with step ladders and rung ladders as may be required to assist in accessing the HVAC equipment for inspection.

The Client shall designate a person, in writing, to act as the Client's representative with respect to the services to be provided under this agreement.
