I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to receive and file:

A) an Amendment No. 2 to the Behavioral Health Cooperative Agreement (R2017-1608) (Amendment No. 2) with the School Board of Palm Beach County, Florida to provide school based therapeutic services to students enrolled in public schools in Palm Beach County, and their families, for the period July 1, 2019, through June 30, 2020, with no additional cost to the County; and

B) an Amendment No. 1 to Addendum Concerning Student Information (R2017-1608) with the School Board modifying Youth Services' access to the student identifiable information for the period July 1, 2019, through June 30, 2020, with no additional cost to the County.

Summary: In October 2017, the Board of County Commissioners (Board) received and filed the Behavioral Health Cooperative Agreement and Contract/Agreement Addendum Concerning Student Information (Agreement) with the School Board of Palm Beach County, Florida. In August 2018, the Board received and filed Amendment No. 1 to the Agreement, which extended the term for an additional year to June 30, 2019. Amendment No. 2 to the Behavioral Health Cooperative Agreement extends the term one (1) additional year to June 30, 2020. Amendment No. 1 to Addendum Concerning Student Information extends County's access to the student identifiable information to June 30, 2020. On June 5, 2001, R2001-0892 authorized the County Administrator (or designee), to execute future standard Cooperative Agreements with the School Board on behalf of the Board of County Commissioners, after approval of legal sufficiency by the County Attorney's Office, and within budgeted allocations. Countywide (HH)

Background and Justification: On October 17, 2017, the Board received and filed the Behavioral Health Cooperative Agreement and Contract/Agreement Addendum Concerning Student Information. On August 14, 2018, the Board received and filed Amendment No. 1 to the Behavioral Health Cooperative Agreement (R2018-1238). The County has offered school-based therapeutic services to eligible students enrolled in public schools, and their families, in the County for more than twenty (20) years. Targeted schools identified by the School District and the County benefit from an assigned clinical staff member with the specific goal of reducing suspensions and expulsions. Other schools may make referrals for psycho-educational group services and family therapy. The Agreement, as amended, allows the Youth Services Department's Residential Treatment and Family Counseling Division to continue providing on-campus individual, family and/or psycho-educational group therapy services to students and their families based on referrals received from School District personnel at 16 schools identified by the School District and the County.

ONE YEAR EXTENSION OF AGREEMENT

This is Amendment No. 2, effective the first of July 2019, to the Behavioral Health Cooperative Agreement (R2017-1608) entered into on August 17, 2017, by and between THE SCHOOL BOARD OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA and PALM BEACH COUNTY, a Political Subdivision of the State of Florida, by and through its Board of Commissioners, located at 50 South Military Trail, Suite 203, West Palm Beach, Florida 33415, to provide: individual therapy, group therapy, family therapy, and intake assessments as determined by the client/student's needs *in support of Tier 1, 2, or 3 interventions of the School Based Team/Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) processes.*

Whereas, the School Board wishes to exercise its option to renew the Behavioral Health Cooperative Agreement for the School Year 2020.

Now, therefore, the parties hereby agree that:

- 1. The Behavioral Health Cooperative Agreement is extended for one year ending on June 30, 2020.
- 2. All services, protocols and reporting procedures contained within the Behavioral Health Cooperative Agreement dated August 17, 2017, as amended, shall remain in force as stipulated.
