I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve on preliminary reading and permission to advertise for public hearing on Tuesday, December 17, 2019 at 9:30 a.m.: **AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 19, ARTICLE IX (ORDINANCE NO. 2008-43) AS AMENDED, RELATING TO VEHICLES FOR HIRE; AMENDING SECTION 19-213 (DEFINITIONS); AMENDING SECTION 19-217 (RECIPROCITY); AMENDING 19-227 DRIVER REQUIREMENTS, FAILURE TO COMPLY; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF LAWS IN CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR A SAVINGS CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE OF LAWS AND ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR CAPTIONS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

Summary: The proposed Ordinance amendment expands the regulatory framework of the vehicle for hire industry by creating a special event reciprocity provision. This amendment is necessary to ensure adequate processes are in place to accommodate anticipated regulatory demands in the tri-county region during special events including but not limited to the Super Bowl LIV. The special event reciprocity provision establishes the requirements for currently licensed vehicle for hire companies to increase their fleet and driver capability to meet transportation needs and allows for Miami-Dade, Broward and Palm Beach Counties to work cooperatively to meet regulatory demand and oversight responsibilities in a streamlined fashion. Despite variations, each county will apply the requirements of their respective ordinances when evaluating special permit applications. For the special event period only, reciprocity in Palm Beach County applies to Broward and Miami-Dade vehicle decals only if Palm Beach County vehicle decals are recognized by these respective jurisdictions by way of ordinance language in the same manner. Highlights of proposed amendments include the following: 1) adding a definition of special event, special event vehicle decal and special event period, 2) establishing criteria for special event vehicle decals, 3) outlining the background screening requirements of temporary drivers, 4) creating reciprocity language with Miami-Dade and Broward Counties, and 5) assigning a disqualifying timeframe for habitual traffic offenders. The proposed revisions were presented to vehicle for hire industry representatives on October 2, 2019 and League of Cities on October 25, 2019 and were approved. Countywide (LDC)

Background and Policy Issues: In an effort to ensure adequate “for hire” transportation services exist throughout the Southeast Florida region and to create streamlined permitted process while preserving public safety provisions during special events, Miami-Dade, Broward, and Palm Beach County have worked cooperatively to address the anticipated regulatory demands. The ordinance amendment allows for reciprocity within the Southeast Florida area (Miami-Dade, Broward, and Palm Beach Counties) during special event periods for vehicle for hire companies operating sedans, limousines, vans, and sport utility vehicles and have either a special event decal or annual operating permit with airport privileges issued by one of these counties, excluding ports.

The National Football League Super Bowl LIV takes place in Miami Gardens on February 2, 2020. Transportation planners estimate that an additional 2,000 for hire vehicles will be needed to effectively meet the trip demands associated with the event. Estimates indicate that 10,000 people flying into Southeast Florida, with 20% landing at Palm Beach International Airport (PBI). Through discussions with the National Football League (NFL) and Broward and Miami-Dade Counties, it was recognized there will be a significant influx of out of town visitors relying on vehicle for hire services during the Super Bowl period.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 19, ARTICLE IX (ORDINANCE NO. 2008-43) AS AMENDED, RELATING TO VEHICLES FOR HIRE; AMENDING SECTION 19-213 (DEFINITIONS); AMENDING SECTION 19-217 (RECIPROCITY); AMENDING SECTION 19-227 DRIVER REQUIREMENTS, FAILURE TO COMPLY; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF LAWS IN CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR A SAVINGS CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE OF LAWS AND ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR CAPTIONS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Chapter 125 (County Government) of the Florida Statutes establishes the right and power of counties to provide for the health, welfare and safety of the existing and future residents by enacting such business regulations necessary for the protection of the public; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County finds and declares that the public welfare and safety of the existing and future residents requires the regulation and control of motor vehicles engaged in the transportation of persons, within the streets of Palm Beach County, with the intent to receive compensation; and

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County licenses and regulates vehicles for hire (defined hereinafter) that operate in Palm Beach County, Florida; and

WHEREAS, South Florida is a host to national sporting events, political conventions and other special events of national or international significance; and

WHEREAS, those events are expected to generate an influx of out of town visitors relying on vehicle for hire services creating a short term extraordinary need for additional vehicle for hire services; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary to amend Chapter 19, Article IX of the Palm Beach County Code to enhance the regulatory framework for the vehicle for hire industry to ensure transportation needs can be met when special events are held in the tri-county region including Palm Beach, Broward and Miami-Dade County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

39 Chapter 19, Article IX of the Palm Beach County Code is hereby amended to
40 read as follows:

42 **Section 1. Section. 19-213. - Definitions.**

43 Section 19-213 is hereby amended to add the following definitions:

44 **Special event.** A special event is an event held in Palm Beach, Broward or Miami-Dade
45 County expected to generate substantial increased temporary demand for the services of
46 sedans, vans, sport utility vehicles, and limousines such that the existing supply is not
47 adequate to meet the needs of the event.

48 **Special event vehicle decal.** A special event vehicle decal is a vehicle decal issued for
49 a special event to be held in Palm Beach, Broward or Miami-Dade County, and is valid for
50 a two week period during the special event period in order to add temporary sedans, vans,
51 sport utility vehicles, and limousine vehicles for hire to an existing permitted vehicle for
52 hire fleet.

53 **Special event period.** The special event period is defined as a two week period beginning
54 one week prior to the special event and continuing for one week after the special event.

55 **Section 2. Section. 19-217. - Reciprocity.**

56 **Section 19-217 is hereby amended to add the following:**

57 (a) **Out-of-county origin exception.** Nothing in this article shall be construed to prohibit
58 discharge within Palm Beach County of any passenger lawfully picked up in another
59 county and lawfully transported into Palm Beach County. Notwithstanding any
60 provision to the contrary, any passenger lawfully picked up in another county,
61 transported to, and discharged at any location within Palm Beach County, may be
62 picked up at the discharge location and returned to the county of origin as long as the
63 transportation is part of a pre-arranged trip; provided, however, vehicles for hire shall
64 be required to comply with the Airport Rules and Regulations if the discharge and/or
65 pick up location is the Palm Beach International Airport. Proof of the pre-arranged
66 transportation services shall be made available to enforcement personnel upon
67 request.

68 (b) **Business Permit Reciprocity.** In lieu of submitting an application for a vehicle for
69 hire business permit as set forth in section 19-218, a vehicle for hire company that
70 holds a current business permit to operate in a reciprocal county, may apply for
71 business permit reciprocity by submitting a copy of the business permit issued by the
72 reciprocal county, with the information required by sections 19-218(a)(1)-(3),
73 mechanical safety inspections required by section 19-223(a) and proof of insurance as
74 required in section 19-226. A vehicle for hire company applying for business permit
75 reciprocity shall not be required to pay the initial new business application fee but shall
76 be required to pay all other fees as set forth by resolution of the Board. Approved

77 applications will result in issuance of a reciprocal permit business license. Business
78 permit reciprocity must be renewed on an annual basis. All vehicle for hire companies
79 operating at the Palm Beach County International Airport and/or the Port of Palm Beach
80 pursuant to a reciprocal permit business license are subject to: 1) Palm Beach County
81 Airport Rules and Regulations (R-98-220, as amended), as codified in Appendix B of
82 the Palm Beach County Code including, but not limited to, renewal of the airport decal
83 and payment of all fees established by resolution of the Board; and 2) the Rules and
84 Regulations of the Port of Palm Beach including, but not limited to, the payment of all
85 fees pertaining thereto.

86 1. Vehicle Inspection Requirements. Vehicle inspection forms from a mechanic
87 certified by the National Institute for Automotive Service Excellence ("ASE") or
88 American Advanced Technicians Institute ("AATI") obtained in a Reciprocal County
89 may be submitted as proof of inspection required by section 19-223(a).

90 2. Eligibility and Compliance Requirements. A vehicle for hire company must be
91 eligible to apply for a business permit in order to apply for business permit reciprocity.
92 Except as otherwise expressly provided herein, a vehicle for hire company granted
93 business permit reciprocity shall comply with all provisions of this article, and shall be
94 subject to all enforcement and compliance provisions of this article, including
95 suspension and revocation of the authority to operate as a vehicle for hire company
96 in Palm Beach County.

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98 (c) Special event reciprocity. The Division may issue special event vehicle decals when
99 a special event takes place in Palm Beach, Broward or Miami-Dade County and the
100 Division obtains approval of the County Administrator or designee, to implement special
101 event reciprocity. A vehicle for hire company that holds a current business permit may
102 obtain a special event decal for temporary use vehicles in order to increase the
103 company's fleet size during the special event period. The special event vehicle decals
104 authorize the decal holder to operate pursuant to this article in Palm Beach County,
105 including the Palm Beach International Airport but not including the Port of Palm Beach
106 during the special event period only. Special event vehicle decals may be issued in the
107 categories of sedans, luxury sedans, vans, limousines, sport utility vehicles, which
108 includes wheelchair accessible vehicles in these categories. Applicants for a special
109 event vehicle decal shall meet each of the following criteria:

- 110 1. A fully completed application form;
- 111 2. Insurance certificate evidencing coverage for each vehicle as required under
112 section 19-226;
- 113 3. A current vehicle registration and/or such other documentation demonstrating
114 the right of the applicant to use such vehicle in the event that the vehicle is
115 leased or managed by the applicant;

- 116 4. Fees as determined by resolution of the Board of County Commissioners; and
117 5. Any additional information as may be required by the Division which relates to
118 the applicant's business activities deemed necessary by the Division to
119 investigate the application and enforce the provisions of this article.

120 A Vehicle for hire company with a Palm Beach County business permit shall use
121 drivers with a valid ID badge or may use temporary drivers during the special event
122 period. All temporary drivers must have successfully passed a background check from
123 a company specializing in background checks. The background check must conform
124 to sections 19-227 (1), (2), (3a), (4), (5), (7), (8), (9), (10) and all temporary drivers
125 must comply with all requirements in sections 19-227 (g), (h), (i), and (j). A vehicle for
126 hire company using temporary drivers must certify that the background check meets
127 the requirements of this section and provide a roster of the drivers to the Division that
128 includes the drivers' first and last name, drivers' license number, issuance and
129 expiration dates. It is the responsibility of the vehicle for hire company to provide
130 identification for the drivers, which must be displayed by the driver, in digital or hard
131 copy form, while engaging in vehicle for hire services.

132 For the special event period only, when by ordinance Broward and/or Miami-Dade
133 County permits vehicle for hire companies operating sedans, vans, sport utility
134 vehicles and limousines, including wheelchair accessible vehicles in these categories,
135 with a current Palm Beach County annual vehicle decal with airport privileges, or a
136 Palm Beach County current special event vehicle decal, to operate within their
137 respective counties during the special event period, then Palm Beach County will
138 reciprocate by allowing the corresponding Broward and/or Miami-Dade County vehicle
139 for hire companies operating sedans, vans, sport utility vehicles and limousines, that
140 display a valid Broward and/or Miami-Dade County special event vehicle decal, or a
141 current annual Broward and/or Miami-Dade County vehicle decal with airport
142 privileges, to operate within Palm Beach County during the special event period. All
143 vehicle for hire companies and drivers operating in Palm Beach County during the
144 special event period shall comply with any special event rules and regulations that
145 may be promulgated by the Division to address procedures for application processing
146 and approvals, safety, or operational concerns during a special event period.

147 **Section 3. Section 19-227. - Driver requirements; failure to comply.**

148 **Section 19-227 is hereby amended as follows:**

- 149 (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any vehicle for hire within and upon
150 the streets of the County without a County vehicle for hire driver's ID badge issued
151 by the DCA, or other approved means of Alternative Identification that allows
152 passengers, law enforcement and the DCA to ensure that drivers have qualified to
153 deliver service. Driver ID badges will only be issued by DCA to drivers who have

154 proven compliance with 19-227(a) (1-19). All applicants shall conform to the
155 following unless they are authorized under subsection (m) of this section:

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157 (3) State Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles Traffic/Driving Record
158 Report

159 a. Provide the original form of his/her lifetime State Department of Highway
160 Safety and Motor Vehicles traffic/driving record report to the Division which
161 was secured no more than thirty (30) days before the application/renewal
162 was submitted. Upon initial application, if a driver has resided in Florida less
163 than five (5) consecutive years, a traffic/driving record/history from each
164 state where he/she previously resided must be provided for at least a five-
165 year period; or

166 b. Provide a State of Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles
167 traffic/driving history report which was secured no more than thirty (30) days
168 before the application/renewal was submitted. Electronic records of such
169 driving history reports shall be maintained by the vehicle for hire company.

170 (4) Not have more than three (3) moving violations in the three-year period prior to such
171 check; a major violation in the three-year period prior to such check (including, but
172 not limited to, attempting to evade the police, reckless driving, or driving on a
173 suspended or revoked license);

174 (5) Not have been classified as a habitual traffic offender (as defined by Florida state
175 statutes) within the five year period prior to the application date;

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177 **Section 4. Repeal of laws in conflict.**

178 All local laws and ordinances applying to the unincorporated area of the county in conflict
179 with any provision of this article are hereby repealed to the extent of any conflict.

180 **Section 5. Savings clause.**

181 Notwithstanding the section of this ordinance regarding repeal of laws in conflict, all
182 administrative and court orders, fines, and pending enforcement issued pursuant to this
183 authority and procedures established by Chapter 19, Article IX of the Palm Beach County
184 Code shall remain in full force and effect.

185 **Section 6. Severability.**

186 If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Ordinance is for any
187 reason held by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional, inoperative, or
188 void, such holding shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance.

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191 **Section 7. Inclusion in the Code of Laws and Ordinances.**

192 The provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Palm Beach
193 County Code. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or re-lettered to
194 accomplish such, and the word Ordinance may be changed to section, article, or other
195 appropriate word.

196 **Section 8. Captions.**

197 The captions, section headings, and section designations used in this Ordinance are for
198 convenience only and have no effect on the interpretation of the provisions of this
199 Ordinance.

200 **Section 9. Effective Date.**

201 The provisions of this Ordinance shall first be filed with the Department of State and
202 thereafter will become effective January 1, 2020.

128 includes the drivers' first and last name, drivers' license number, issuance and
129 expiration dates. It is the responsibility of the vehicle for hire company to provide
130 identification for the drivers, which must be displayed by the driver, in digital or hard
131 copy form, while engaging in vehicle for hire services.

132 For the special event period only, when by ordinance Broward and/or Miami-Dade
133 County permits vehicle for hire companies operating sedans, vans, sport utility
134 vehicles and limousines, including wheelchair accessible vehicles in these categories,
135 with a current Palm Beach County annual vehicle decal with airport privileges, or a
136 Palm Beach County current special event vehicle decal, to operate within their
137 respective counties during the special event period, then Palm Beach County will
138 reciprocate by allowing the corresponding Broward and/or Miami-Dade County vehicle
139 for hire companies operating sedans, vans, sport utility vehicles and limousines, that
140 display a valid Broward and/or Miami-Dade County special event vehicle decal, or a
141 current annual Broward and/or Miami-Dade County vehicle decal with airport
142 privileges, to operate within Palm Beach County during the special event period. All
143 vehicle for hire companies and drivers operating in Palm Beach County during the
144 special event period shall comply with any special event rules and regulations that
145 may be promulgated by the Division to address procedures for application processing
146 and approvals, safety, or operational concerns during a special event period.

147 **Section 3. Section 19-227. - Driver requirements; failure to comply.**

148 **Section 19-227 is hereby amended as follows:**

- 149 (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any vehicle for hire within and upon
150 the streets of the County without a County vehicle for hire driver's ID badge issued
151 by the DCA, or other approved means of Alternative Identification that allows
152 passengers, law enforcement and the DCA to ensure that drivers have qualified to
153 deliver service. Driver ID badges will only be issued by DCA to drivers who have

154 proven compliance with 19-227(a) (1-19). All applicants shall conform to the
155 following unless they are authorized under subsection (m) of this section:

156

157 (3) State Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles Traffic/Driving Record
158 Report

159 a. Provide the original form of his/her lifetime State Department of Highway
160 Safety and Motor Vehicles traffic/driving record report to the Division which
161 was secured no more than thirty (30) days before the application/renewal
162 was submitted. Upon initial application, if a driver has resided in Florida less
163 than five (5) consecutive years, a traffic/driving record/history from each
164 state where he/she previously resided must be provided for at least a five-
165 year period; or

166 b. Provide a State of Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles
167 traffic/driving history report which was secured no more than thirty (30) days
168 before the application/renewal was submitted. Electronic records of such
169 driving history reports shall be maintained by the vehicle for hire company.

170 (4) Not have more than three (3) moving violations in the three-year period prior to such
171 check; a major violation in the three-year period prior to such check (including, but
172 not limited to, attempting to evade the police, reckless driving, or driving on a
173 suspended or revoked license);

174 (5) Not have been classified as a habitual traffic offender (as defined by Florida state
175 statutes) within the five year period from application date;

176

177 **Section 4. Repeal of laws in conflict.**

178 All local laws and ordinances applying to the unincorporated area of the county in conflict
179 with any provision of this article are hereby repealed to the extent of any conflict.

180 **Section 5. Savings clause.**

181 Notwithstanding the section of this ordinance regarding repeal of laws in conflict, all
182 administrative and court orders, fines, and pending enforcement issued pursuant to this
183 authority and procedures established by Chapter 19, Article IX of the Palm Beach County
184 Code shall remain in full force and effect.

185 **Section 6. Severability.**

186 If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Ordinance is for any
187 reason held by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional, inoperative, or
188 void, such holding shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance.

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191 **Section 7. Inclusion in the Code of Laws and Ordinances.**

192 The provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Palm Beach
193 County Code. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or re-lettered to
194 accomplish such, and the word Ordinance may be changed to section, article, or other
195 appropriate word.

196 **Section 8. Captions.**

197 The captions, section headings, and section designations used in this Ordinance are for
198 convenience only and have no effect on the interpretation of the provisions of this
199 Ordinance.

200 **Section 9. Effective Date.**

201 The provisions of this Ordinance shall first be filed with the Department of State and
202 thereafter will become effective January 1, 2020.
