Summary: The Board is composed of five (5) members. Membership must consist of one (1) lawyer recommended by the Palm Beach County Bar Association, one (1) medical doctor recommended by the Palm Beach County Medical Society, one (1) engineer recommended by the Palm Beach County Chapter of the Florida Engineering Society, and two (2) citizens-at-large not holding elective office. On November 14, 2019, an email was sent to the Board of County Commissioners regarding the above reappointments. No additional nominations were received.

The applicant for re-appointment to Seat # 3, Trevor Rosecrans, is a citizen of Palm Beach County and recommended by the above listed County Commissioners. The applicant for re-appointment, Douglas MacLaughlin currently serves as the Attorney - Seat #1, recommended by the PBC Bar Association (Association), however, the Association is currently seeking to recommend a new member. Mr. MacLaughlin is requesting to remain on the Board and is recommended by the above listed County Commissioners, to fill Seat #4, citizen-at-large, when the current member's term expires on January 31, 2020. Carla Erskine, currently appointed to seat #4, has resigned effective January 31, 2020. With this approval, the Board will consist of four members: four (4) Caucasian (80%) and one vacant seat (20%). The gender ratio (female: male) is 0:4. Countywide (HH).

Background and Justification: Chapter 77-616, as amended, provides for the organization of the Environmental Control Hearing Board. This Special Act states that the composition of this Board shall consist of an attorney, a doctor, an engineer, and two citizens. The Hearing Board hears and conducts hearings into the merits of alleged violations to sections promulgated under Chapter 77-616 (Environmental Control Act). Palm Beach County Resolution 92-123 establishes the terms for the members of the Environmental Control Hearing Board.

I. AUTHORITY:

PBC Environmental Control Act, Chapter 77-616, Section 9, Laws of Florida, Ordinance No. 78-5; as amended by Ordinance No. 79-15; amended by Ordinance No. 85-25; as amended by Ordinance No. 87-22. Unified Land Development Code, Section 4.12, amended by Resolution No. R92-123.

II. APPOINTING BODY:

Board of County Commissioners

III. COMPOSITION, QUALIFICATIONS, TERMS & REMOVAL:

The Board shall be composed of five (5) members. Membership shall consist of one (1) lawyer, recommended by the PBC Bar Association; one (1) medical doctor, recommended by the PBC Medical Society; one (1) engineer, recommended by the PBC chapter of the Florida Engineering Society; and two (2) citizens at-large. The term of appointments shall be for three (3) years. Appointments to fill any vacancy on the Hearing Board shall be for the remainder of the unexpired term of office. Members shall receive no compensation for their services. Travel reimbursements are limited to expenses incurred only for travel outside PBC necessary to fulfill the responsibilities of membership of the Board.

V. FUNCTIONS:

To hear and conduct hearings into the merits of alleged violations to sections promulgated under Chapter 77-616, Special Act, Laws of Florida, and PBC Ordinance No. 78-5, as amended, and to issue injunctive and affirmative relief for violations; and after due public hearing upholding a violation, to reach a decision setting forth such findings of fact and conclusions of law as are required in view of the issues presented. The decision shall contain an order which may be framed in the manner of a writ of injunction requiring the violator to conform with either or all of the following requirements: (a) to refrain from committing, creating, maintaining, or permitting the violations; (b) to take such affirmative action as the ECHB deems necessary and reasonable under the circumstances to correct such violation; (c) to issue orders imposing civil penalties of up to \$500 for each day of violation; (d) to issue subpoenas to command the appearance of any person before a hearing at a specified time and place to be examined as a witness. Such subpoenas may require such person to produce all books, papers and documents in that person's possession or under that person's control, material to such hearings; and (e) to administer oaths to any or all persons who are to testify before the ECHB.

3. Board Membership

Qualifications

The EAB shall be composed of five members appointed by the Environmental Control Board (ECB). The membership of the EAB shall consist of one professional engineer registered by the State of Florida and nominated by the Palm Beach branch of the American Society of Civil Engineers, one water resource professional employed by SFWMD, one drinking water engineer employed by the FDEP, one member of the Gold Coast Builders Association, and one attorney nominated by the PBC Bar Association. [Ord. 2011-016]

Terms of Office

All EAB members shall serve a term of three years. Beginning on or after March 2, 2013, no person shall be appointed or reappointed to this Board for more than three consecutive terms. [Ord. 2014-0011

Officers

Secretary

PBC Environmental Control Officer shall provide a staff person to the EAB and that staff member shall be designated as Secretary of the EAB.

Staff

The PBCHD shall be the professional staff of the EAB.

Meetings

a. General or Special Meetings

General meetings of the EAB shall be held no less frequently than once every 60 days. Special meetings may be called by the Chair of the EAB, or in writing by a majority of the members of the Board. Staff shall provide 24-hour written notice to each EAB member for a special meeting.

E. Environmental Control Hearing Board

Establishment

There is hereby established an Environmental Control Hearing Board (ECHB).

Powers and Duties

The ECHB has the following powers and duties:

- to conduct hearings into the merits of alleged violations to Sections promulgated under Chapter 77-616, Special Act, Laws of Florida, and PBC Ord. 78-5, as amended; and
- after due public hearing, to reach a decision setting forth such findings of fact and conclusions of law as are required in view of the issues presented. The decision shall contain an order which may be framed in the manner of a writ of injunction requiring the violator to conform to either or both of the following requirements:
 - to refrain from committing, creating, maintaining, or permitting the violations;
 - 2) to take such affirmative action as the ECHB deems necessary and reasonable under the circumstances to correct such violation;
 - to issue orders imposing civil penalties of up to \$500 dollars for each day of violation;
 - to issue subpoenas to command the appearance of any person before a hearing at a specified time and place to be examined as a witness. Such subpoenas may require such person to produce all books, papers and documents in that person's possession or under that person's control, material to such hearings; and,
 - 5) to administer oaths to any or all persons who are to testify before the ECHB.

Qualifications

The ECHB shall be composed of five members. The membership of the ECHB shall consist of one attorney recommended by the PBC Bar Association; one medical doctor recommended by the PBC Medical Society; one engineer recommended by the PBC chapter of the Florida Engineering Society; and two citizens at large.

Officers

Secretary a.

The Environmental Control Officer shall serve as Secretary of the ECHB.

Staff

The PBCHD shall be the professional staff of the ECHB.

General or Special Meetings

General meetings of the ECHB shall be held no less frequently than every 45 days. The ECHB may set the date of future meetings during any meeting. Special meetings may be called by the Chair of the ECHB, or in writing by a majority of the members of the Board. Staff shall provide 24-hour written notice to each ECHB member for a special meeting.

6. Term Limits

Beginning on or after March 2, 2013, no person shall be appointed or reappointed to this Board for more than three consecutive terms. [Ord. 2014-001]

Groundwater and Natural Resources Protection Board

1. Establishment

There is hereby established a Groundwater and Natural Resource Protection Board (GNRPB).

Powers and Duties

The GNRPB shall have the following powers and duties:

- a. to hold hearings as necessary to enforce Art. 14, Environmental Standards. ERM may refer alleged violations of Art. 14 Environmental Standards, and applicable Art. 4.B.10, Excavation Uses, Ord. No. 2003-020, Petroleum Storage Systems, Ord. No. 2003-021, Petroleum Contamination Cleanup criteria, Ord. No. 2004-050, Stormwater Pollution and Prevention, Natural Areas, Ord. No. 1994-014, and Ord. No. 1993-003, Water and Irrigation Conservation as amended to the GNRPB, if there has been a failure to correct a violation within the time specified by the Code Inspector, if the violation has been repeated, or is of such a nature that it cannot be corrected; [Ord. 2006-004] [Ord. 2010-022] [Ord. 2017-007]
- to adopt rules of procedure for the conduct of hearings;
- to issue subpoenas compelling the presence of persons at Board hearings. Subpoenas may be served by the PBC Sheriff's Department, or other authorized persons consistent with Florida Law;
- to issue subpoenas compelling the provision of evidence at GNRPB hearings;
- to take testimony under oath:
- to issue orders having the force of law commanding whatever steps are necessary to achieve compliance with the violation of Art. 14, Environmental Standards;
- to lien property; and,
- to assess administrative fines and costs pursuant to Art. 14, Environmental Standards.

Board Membership

Qualifications

The GNRPB shall be composed of seven members appointed by the BCC upon a recommendation by the organization listed in Table 2.G.3.F, GNRPB Membership. The membership of the Board shall consist of a professional engineer registered by the State of Florida, an attorney licensed to practice in Florida, a hydrologist or a hydrogeologist, a citizen possessing expertise and experience in managing a business, a biologist or a chemist, a member of an environmental organization, and a concerned citizen. [Ord. 2011-001]
