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Background and Justification: In 2018, LEED expanded to provide a rating system for local governments via LEED for Cities and Communities after merging with an existing Sustainability Tools for Assessing and Rating (STAR) Communities rating system. LEED for Cities and LEED for Communities provide local governments with a globally consistent way to measure and communicate performance. It also provides a framework for measuring resiliency and sustainability and planning for further improvements.

Over 90 cities, counties, and communities have certified or are in the process of certifying through LEED, including Broward County, Lee County, Monroe County, Pinellas County, Miami, West Palm Beach, and Saint Petersburg.
